2. Commander's Narrative Summary of Significant Events

Significant events during the month of September included participation in regimental Operation NAPA which was later changed to a battalion sized operation with Battery E in direct support. 29-30 September, Battery E was deployed with the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines on Operation MONTEREY. Battery D (-) remained in position at Tien Phouc (BT 1114).

From 4 September through 7 September, the battalion, reinforced with elements of the 11th Marines, participated in Operation NAPA in direct support of the 5th Marines. On 7 September, Battalion elements minus Battery E, which was left in direct support of the 3d Battalion, 5th Marines and the 2d Platoon, Mortar Battery which was attached to the 3d Battalion, 5th Marines, returned to their TAOR positions. A total of 420 missions and 3255 rounds of all calibers and types were fired. See Appendix B TAB (b).

During the period 30 August through 12 September, 3d Platoon, Battery D with FDC and security personnel attached, helilifted to Hau Duc (BT 0706). From that location the platoon supported the 1st Recon Battalion, 1st Marine Division and the 2d ARVN Division units in that area. The platoon fired a total of 97 missions, expending 1027 rounds of HE, 221 rounds of WP and 3 rounds of ILL.

29-30 September, Battery E participated in Operation MONTEREY in direct support of the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. Battery E fired a total of 17 missions expending 236 rounds.

Battery D (-) fired a total of 352 missions expending 1683 rounds during the month of September at their location at Tien Phouc.

The firing units in the 2d Battalion position area supported the 5th Marines in an active program of sweeps, patrols and outposts within the TAOR. A summary of missions fired and total ammunition expended for September from the 2d Battalion position is as follows:

3. Detailed Description of Significant Events

a. Personnel. Battle casualties for the month of September includes 6 WIA and 4 WIAE. This command sustained 12 non-battle casualties. Personnel losses due to administrative reasons includes 16 Marine Officers, 19 Marine Enlisted and one Navy Officer transferred from this Battalion. In turn, this command received 12 Marine Officers, 19 Marine Enlisted and one Navy Officer as replacements. During the month of September, six officer and 32 enlisted promotions were effected. Members of this command were presented the following awards: one Silver Star, one Bronze Star, five Good Conduct Awards, 18 Purple Hearts and five Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry Awards.

b. Administration. Normal and routine administration was carried on during the month of September.

c. Intelligence. See Appendix B TAB (2).

d. Training. Not applicable.

e. Special Operations

(1) Operation NAPA, a coordinated ground reconnaissance, search and destroy operation was conducted by the 5th Marines and GVNAF forces in the Quang Tin Province during the period 4-15 September 1966. On 7 September, the operation was reduced to a battalion sized operation, at which time, Battery E was assigned the direct support mission in support of 3d Battalion, 5th Marines. Battery E displaced once by motor convoy and the Mortar Platoon which was attached to the 3d Battalion, 5th Marines, displaced on five occasions by helicopter. The remaining artillery units displaced to their TAOR positions. A summary of this battalion's involvement is contained in Appendix B TAB (6). TAB (5) to Appendix B is a sketch map (1:250,000) of position areas occupied.

(2) Operation MONTEREY, a coordinated ground reconnaissance, search and destroy operation was conducted by the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines in the Quang Tin Province during the period 29-30 September 1966. Battery E was assigned the direct support mission and displaced to the vicinity of Tam Ky to support the 1st Battalion. There were no significant events during the operation.

g. Close Combat

At 110125H September, 2d Battalion, 11th Marines received 11 rounds of 82mm Mortar in position at coordinates BT 438082. Resulting friendly casualties ten WIA's. Resulting damage to equipment - perforated radiators on three M-151 $\frac{3}{4}$ Ton vehicles and one broken windshield on a M-151.

At 110150, Headquarters, 5th Marines, located at BT 435079 requested countermortar fire on coordinates BT 419080. 18 rounds of HE were fired by Battery F. Surveillance - good effect on target. There was no exchange of small arms fire within the 2d Battalion position. Assessment of damage to enemy forces and equipment - none.

4th Battalion, 11th Marines requested illumination at coordinates BT 439094 at 110130. 15 rounds of illumination were fired by the 107mm Mortar Battery.

3d 155mm Gun Battery requested illumination at 110145 at coordinates BT 4260978. 34 rounds of illumination were fired by the 107mm Mortar Battery.

h. Fire Support. Not applicable

i. Logistics

(1) Logistic support for Battery D (-) at Tien Phouc, including arrangement for the airlifting of supplies, was accomplished by the battalion. 89,000 pounds of all classes of supplies were delivered by helicopter and fixed wing aircraft.

(2) Logistic support for Operation NAPA was from the 2d Battalion base camp by motor convoy except for class V, which was drawn from the ASP, FLSG B.

1. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

During September 1966, the Battalion MEDCAP program was centered in the areas of Khuong Nhon and Ly Tin. 205 Vietnamese were seen in the village of Khuong Nhon and 51 were seen in the village of Ly Tin. The majority of those appearing for sick call were children with upper respiratory infections and diseases of the skin. During the latter part of the month, efforts were made to visit the village of Khuong Nhon on a daily basis.

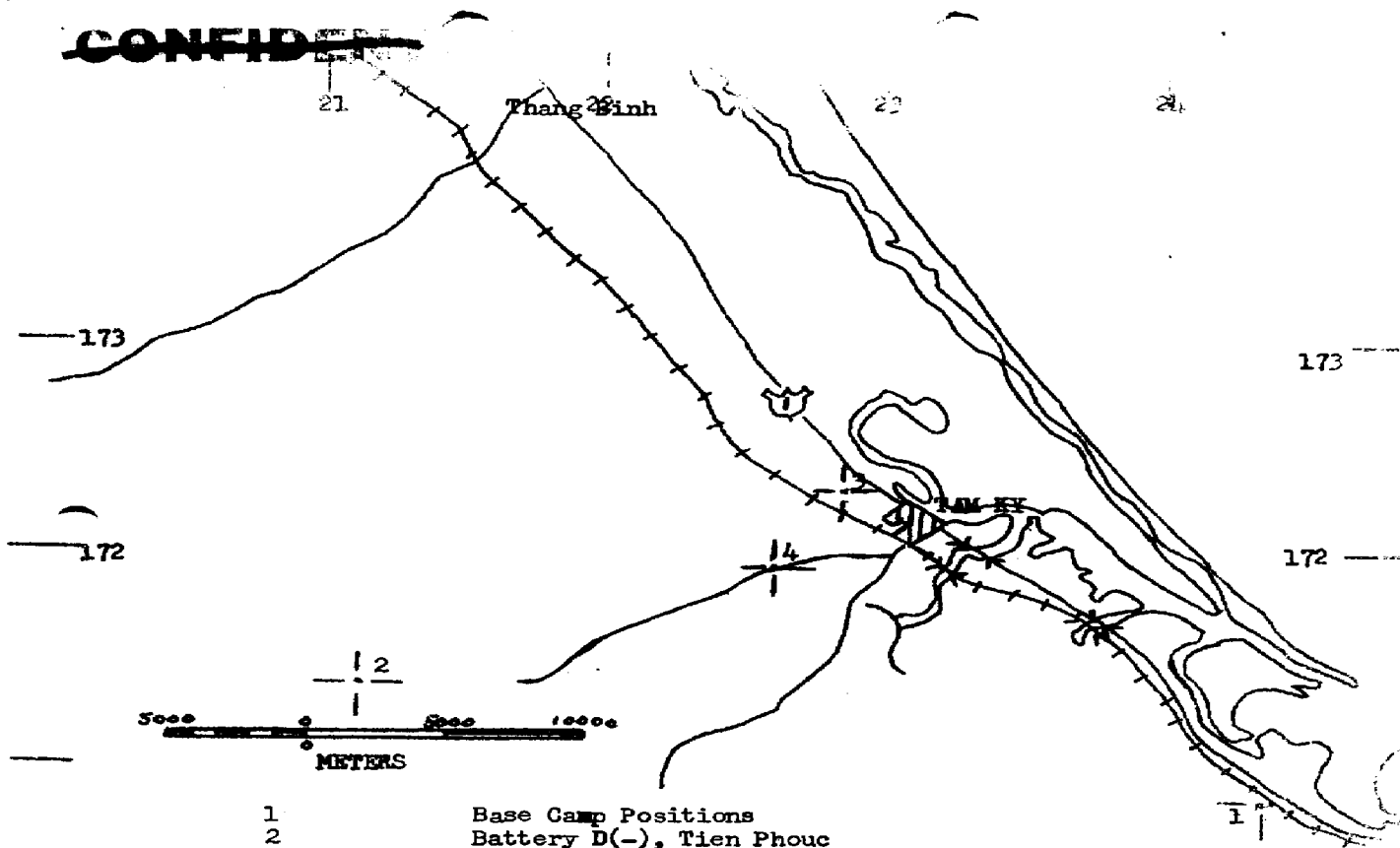

10. Concept of Operation. The Commanding Officer, 11th Marines directed 2d Battalion, 11th Marines (-) (Rein) to provide artillery support for Operation NAPA.
11. Execution. At 041130 Sept 1966, the 2d Battalion (-) (Rein), 11th Marines commenced displacement by motor convoy to positions in the vicinity of Tam Ky, coordinates BT 2923. This movement was made in convoy consisting of 1st serial, Command/Control Group; 2d serial, Battery E; 3d serial, Battery F and 2d Platoon, Mortar Battery and 4th serial, Battery K with a ten minute interval between serials. All units were in position and prepared to fire by 041115.

13. Administrative Matters

a. Supply. Class V was drawn from the ASP, FLSG B as required. Support for other classes of supplies was provided by the 2d Battalion, 11th Marines base camp.

b. Maintenance. One truck from Battery F developed brake trouble and was returned to 2d Battalion, 11th Marines Base Camp for repair. No other major type repairs were required.

c. Transportation. Organic transportation was used for both displacements and resupply.

d. Treatment of Casualties. Evacuation was administered by 5th Marines with hospitalization provided by B Med's primary facility at Chu Lai.

e. Civil Affairs. None.

f. Communications. Generally, communications were very good. The hot line to the 11th Marines was out only once for a period of about 2 hours but generally weak. Teletype was not utilized during this operation.

14. Special Equipment and Techniques. Radio Relay was employed by the 5th Marines with two channels being utilized by the 2d Battalion, 11th Marines (one hot line to the 11th Marines and one hot line to 1st Marine Division COC). Radio Relay communications were periodically weak but satisfactory.

15. Commander's Analysis. Operation NAPA provided experience and developed confidence in officers and men and proved again that they can perform their mission under flexible conditions.

The nature of the operation was such that major displacements were not necessary. Battery E made one displacement and the Mortar Platoon, while attached to 3d Battalion, 5th Marines, made five displacements by helicopter.

During the first phase of the operation, a technical FDC was established at the Command/Control Group level for Batteries E and F and the Mortar Platoon, with Battery K maintaining their own FDC. On 7 Sept 1966 technical fire direction control was passed to Battery E and the Mortar Platoon.

Primary communications for units in the immediate area was by wire. Radio communications to FO and liaison personnel were very good.

On 15 Sept 1966, while Battery E and the Mortar Platoon were displacing to their TAOR positions they received incoming small arms fire which was quickly returned by both the infantry security company and the artillery units. No casualties were received by the artillery units.

During the movement to and from Tam Ky, Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines was prepared to fire supporting fires if required.

Battery D (-) located at Tien Phuc (BT 115140) fired three missions and expended 114 rounds in support of Operation NAPA for USMC and ARVN units.

At 051152 Sept 1966, 2d Battalion, (-) fired preparatory fires in support of a landing by 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. 100 rounds were expended.

At 060600 Sept 1966, Battery K and Battery D (-) fired preparatory fires in support of a landing by a Recon element. 129 rounds were expended.

At 070930 Sept 1966, Battery K displaced to TAOR position. At 071145, Battery F and Command/Control Group displaced to TAOR positions. Battery E, commanded by Capt GORE, remained in position at Tam Ky in support of 3d Battalion, 5th Marines. The two remaining guns from Battery E were called forward and joined Battery E at Tam Ky. 2d Platoon, Mortar Battery was attached to 3d Battalion, 5th Marines and initially remained at Tam Ky. While attached to 3d Battalion, 5th Marines, the Mortar Platoon displaced five times by helicopter, firing a total of 38 missions and expending 250 rounds.

On 14 Sept 1966, Battery E displaced to positions at BT 262191. On 14 Sept 1966 and again on displacement to TAOR positions on 15 Sept, Battery E and the Mortar Platoon were hit by an undetermined number of VC which Company G, security for the artillery positions, took under fire and maneuver and routed. Artillery fires claimed a total of three confirmed KIAs, two WIAs and one possible WIA during Operation NAPA.

A liaison team and two FO teams were provided by the 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines for coordination of USMC artillery fire within the ARVN sector. The only artillery support requested by ARVN units during Operation NAPA was in the form of H&I fires.

12. Naval Gunfire. One ship, the USS Mullinix (DD-944) was on station from 061800 to 070200 Sept 1966 but did not fire any missions in support of Operation NAPA.
