

PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Personnel and Administration

There were three battle casualties for the month of March 1967. There were no non-battle casualties. Personnel losses due to administrative reasons included nine Marine Officers and 86 Marine Enlisted. Four Navy Enlisted were also transferred. In return this command received six Marine Officers, 52 Marine Enlisted, and one Navy Officer. During the month of March, two Marine Officer and ten Marine Enlisted promotions were effected. One meritorious promotion was also effected. Members of this command were presented one Army Commendation Medal, one Navy Commendation Medal, four Purple Heart Medals, one CG Certificate of Commendation, one Good Conduct Medal and seven Meritorious Masts.

2. Organization and Operations

Battery E, 2nd Battalion remains deployed and CPCON to the 11th Marines. 2nd Platoon, 107mm Mortar Battery (Towed) remains deployed and OPCON to Battery Group E. The deployed platoon remains equipped with the 4.2 inch mortar, M-30. The 107mm Mortar Battery rotated personnel twice during the month of March, on the 4th and 16th.

Battery F(-) remains at Tien Phouc, and the other units of the battalion remained in position at the base camp, except for a platoon from the 107mm Mortar Battery which deployed to Nui Dang for a two day operation. Battery D returned to the base camp position on 3 March from Operation Desoto/Deck House VI.

During the month Battery F provided a platoon of guns on 24 and 27 March participating in the roving gun program. Battery D provided a platoon on 30 March for the above mentioned program.

During March this unit provided two Naval Gun Fire Teams and two Marine Officers to the 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines for Operation Boone, four Forward Observer Teams for three Marine convoys, one ARVN convoy and two Liaison Teams to ARVN artillery units to cover convoys entering and leaving the northern end of the TAOR.

The firing units in the 2nd Battalion position area supported the 5th

Marines in an program of sweeps, patrols and outposts within the TAOR and supported elements of the 1st Recon Battalion within the RAOR. A summary of missions fired and ammunition expended during March from the 2nd Battalion position is as follows:

3. Training

The cross-training of field artillery batterymen in different caliber weapons was cancelled for the month of March due to the large turnover of personnel within the Battalion.

4. Logistics, Equipment and Supply

Resupply of outlying units of this Battalion by helicopter consisted of approximately 160,000 pounds of cargo, resupply was broken down as follows: 5,000 pounds of A and B rations, 3,500 pounds Field Fortifications Material, 400 pounds mail, and the balance of the 160,000 pounds consisting primarily of class V, with the following exceptions; two (2) M422Al vehicles transported internally by CH 46 helicopter to Hill 300 and two (2) extracted for maintenance.

During this report period three (3) 105mm howitzers were extracted one at a time from Tien Phouc for six months maintenance. By utilizing a float

howitzer the unit at Tien Phouc was able to maintain its operational readiness. These howitzers were lifted externally by CH 46 helicopters.

During the period on two separate occasions the M-30 mortars on Hill 300 have been evacuated and replaced for maintenance, two (2) on 17 March 1967 and one (1) on 25 March 1967.

5. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

- a. On 5 and 16 March 1967, several truck loads of wood were distributed to the people in the Khoung Binh Hamlet for building repairs and general area improvement. This wood was scrap gathered from the Battalion area. On these trips candy was passed out among the children of the hamlet. Personnel from this Battalion also assisted the 5th Marines in moving the people of Khoung Nhon to their new hamlet.
- b. This Battalion's MEDCAP program was actively pursued during the month of March. On 14 March 1967, a one hour MEDCAP was held at the Khoung Binh School. At this time camned goods, which were donated by members of this command, were distributed among the villagers. A second MEDCAP was held at the Khoung Binh Hamlet on the 22nd of March. At this time 820 people from the Khoung Binh Hamlet received plague innoculations by hospitalmen from this battalion.

PART III SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Personnel and Administration

The only significant occurance during the period was an awards ceremony on 18 March 1967. At this ceremony the following were awarded: one Army Commendation Medal, one Navy Commendation Medal, one Purple Heart Medal, one Meritorious Promotion and seven Meritorious Masts.

2. Organization and Operations

On 3 March Battery D returned to the base camp from Operation Desoto/Deck House VI. Two liaison teams went to ARVN artillery units on 20 March to cover convoys entering and leaving the northern end of the TAOR. On 25 March General Rossen, C/S MAC V,, and on 27 March General LaHue, CG TFX-Ray, visited the Battalion C.P. for tactical briefings. Also, on 25 March a platoon from the 107mm Mortar Battery left for a two day operation at Nui Dang. This platoon returned to the base camp on the 27th of March. Two Naval Gun Fire Teams and two Marine Officers were sent to 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines for Operation Boone on 31 March.

3. Logistics, Equipment and Supply

Logistic support for Battery F(-) at Tien Phouc, 2nd Platoon, 107mm Mortar Battery (W/M-30 mortars) at Hill 300 (AT 814384) and Echo Battery at An Hoa was accomplished by this Battalion, approximately 160,000 pounds

of all classes of supplies were delivered by helicopter.

All resupply efforts were conducted from this units landing zone.

EOD Team arrived on 24 March 1967 to dislodge round of illumination, lodged in tube of 107mm Howtar, negative results. Tube evacuated and returned on 26 March 1967.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

#### 1. Heading:

- a. Unit or Section:
  - (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
  - (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.
- b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.
- c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.
- d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

#### 2. Body:

- a. Time In:
- (1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.
  - (2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.
  - b. Time Out:
- (1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.
- (2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.
  - 4. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.
  - d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.
  - e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:
    - (1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.
- (2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.
- (3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.
- (4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.
  - (5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.
- f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

#### 3. Ending:

- a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."
  - b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
