PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

Personnel losses due to administrative reasons include 30 enlisted Marines and 3 Marine officers. In return, this organization received 60 enlisted Marines and 4 Marine officers. During the month of February, 2 Marine enlisted, and 4 Marine officer promotions were effected.

2. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATIONS

During the month of February, the in and out chop of various artillery units was necessitated by the addition of ground gaining elements of Marine and Army organizations/units. During the reporting period, in support of Operation HUE CITY, two 4.2" Mortars were chopped from Battery E back to the 1st Bn, 11th Marines on 11 February, and two of the four 155mm Howitzers possessed by Battery E were displaced to HUE PHU BAI on 19 February, and the following day to grid YD 836322 in support of that operation. To support operations in the vicinity of PHU LOC (ZC 085005), an Army artillery battery with five 105mm Howitzers (M102) was chopped OPCON this Battalion on 10 February, and the remaining two 155mm Howitzers of Battery E displaced to the vicinity of PHU LOC (ZC 076986) to support operations to the South and East of that location. With the arrival of the 3d Battalion, 5th Marines on 25 Feb, and the 2d Battalion, 3d Marines on 28 Feb resulted in the chop to this Battalion of Battery F and Battery B, 1st Bn, 12th Marines. concerning the chop of all units is contained in paragraph 2 of PART III of this enclosure. For the most part, bridge security elements located adjacent to Route #1 received the majority of the artillery support provided during the month of February. In addition to the support provided for Operation HUE CITY, support was provided for Operation HOUSTON which commenced 27 February. During the month of February, the Battalion was credited with 13 confirmed enemy KIL, and 16 probable enemy KIL. During the month of February, formal school training conducted at the Division level received maximum support from this Battalion, although difficulties were encountered because of the separation of units and the reduced amount of available transportation. During the major portion of the month, time was devoted primarily to the building/improvement of the individual position areas.

4. LOGISTICS, EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLY

During the month of February, the elements of this Battalion continued to move. Battery D moved from their position to GLA LE North of PHU BAI. This move made their logistic problems start solving themselves. The proximity of their supply source enabled them to minimize travel and repair the majority of deadlined equipment. Although body work has not yet been accomplished on the vehicles damaged during the last two months, tires have been replaced and a great deal of the 2d and 3d echelon work was completed by the end of the month. Tentage and other damaged items were also replaced or requisitioned. Assuming the PHU LOC position, Battery A, 2d Battalion, 320th Artillery was chopped OPCON of this Battalion. Having no organic vehicles to aid in resupply, the Army placed requests for Class I and Class V items to this Battalion. By relaying the request to the 1st Field Artillery Group in PHU BAI, the combined effort on materials and transportation enabled completion of the resupply. During the last week of February, Battery F and Battery B became OPCON to this Battalion. The road to their positions is not yet open, requiring all resupply to be made via helicopter. A critical shortage of cargo slings makes the support difficult in areas which require external lifts. Items of shortage found in supply included tires and tubes, sizes 900x20 and 600x16; folding cots; meat cans and all petroleum products.
