During the month of October 1970, 2nd Battalion (Rein), 11th Marines was credited with 44 confirmed KIA's, 22 probable KIA's, 13 structures destroyed or damaged and 25 secondary explosions.

5 Nov 1970PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines, from various positions, continued to provide timely, accurate artillery support to the 5th Marines and their Op Con units, while aggressively answering calls for fire from many other units within the firing capabilities of the battalion. In order to increase responsiveness, a "Quick Fire" channel was established with A Battery, 2nd of the 94th, an Army artillery unit located at LZ ROSS. In addition, close liaison was immediately effected with A Battery, 3rd of the 82nd when they were emplaced at LZ BALDY with their 105mm M102 Howitzers.

On 1 October, a composite battery designated B Battery Forward, consisting of four (4) 105mm howitzers from Battery A, was motor marched to Hill 55 in order to effect a relief for elements of the 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines which were standing down. Battery B was augmented at LZ BALDY by two (2) 105mm howitzers from Battery D at LZ ROSS in order to maintain adequate artillery coverage in the eastern 5th Marines AO. On 5 October, Battery B Forward returned to LZ BALDY and the two (2) Howitzers originating from Battery D returned to LZ ROSS on the following morning.

On 8 October, at 2400, WX Forward, with two (2) 155mm Howitzers (TD) located at AN HQ, received one round of unknown ordnance which landed 100 meters from their battery center outside the wire. Immediate crater analysis was not possible due to the danger of going outside the wire at night. At dawn, the crater analysis team was disappointed to find that a crater analysis was impossible because the round detonated in a water hole. The pre-cleared counter rocket plan was activated and two (2) rounds per target were delivered, with unknown results.

After dallying off the coast for several days, Typhoon JOAN finally came ashore on 17 October at HOI AN, just 5 miles north of LZ BALDY. Her presence in the area severely hampered artillery operations for three days. Producing severe flooding, low visibility and high winds, the road net throughout the AO was effectively interdicted, including the MSR, QL-1 going north to DANANG. Both LZ ROSS and FSB RYDER found themselves totally isolated for a period of one week. The road to LZ ROSS was cut through and inundated by flood waters, and heavy fog and mist precluded helicopter flights to either LZ ROSS or FSB RYDER. The stockpile of all classes of supply proved adequate for the emergency.

The extensive flooding of the lowlands in the entire Division AO caused mass movement of indigenous personnel to high ground. Because of this, severe safety restrictions were imposed on all supporting arms fire to insure that targets were clearly identified as enemy. It is a credit to all personnel of the battalion that outstanding artillery support was provided

to the 5th Marines during this period without a single firing incident. Through the diligence, professional competence and alertness of fire direction and firing battery personnel, rounds were accurately delivered on target. In spite of the threatening weather, motor transport, supply, communications and other support personnel were able to carry out their duties and keep all vital operations of the battalion functioning. All hands were active in preparing for the typhoon and, with their activities during the typhoon, can be credited with the lack of casualties or severe damage to any units of 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines.

W Battery Forward finally managed to rid itself of the mud of AN HOA Combat Base on 19 October when it returned to LZ BALDY. Its movement from AN HOA had been prevented earlier by the flooding of Liberty Bridge. The move was barely completed before the weather again closed in during the afternoon of the 19th and continued with a full week of continual rain and high winds. Again due to the advance warning and preparations, the battalion suffered only minor discomforts during Typhoon KATE.

To further enhance the capability of the battalion to support the 5th Marines and, in particular, to provide support for the NONG SON CIDG Camp, two (2) 155mm Howitzers (TD) were displaced from W Battery to Battery F at FSB RYDER. To accommodate these weapons, two (2) 105mm Howitzers were removed from their gun pits and placed in hasty firing positions near the LZ. With these weapons on FSB RYDER, the ability to provide illumination in the western AO was greatly enhanced.

The majority of the remainder of the month of October was devoted to preparing plans for the establishment of Fire Support Bases. Numerous weapons, personnel and equipment combinations have been prepared in order that a Fire Support Base establishment can be executed with a minimum of up-dating and delay. Poor visibility and flooded conditions made resupply difficult, but also were contributing factors for fewer sightings causing the ammunition expenditure for the battalion to be half that of previous months.

b. INTELLIGENCE

During the month of October 1970, the high threat OP's (Freedom Bird and Short Timer) were activated twice. The periods of activation were from 021400H to 070800H and again from 131530H to 171730H.

There were no significant enemy sightings reported by the FO's for this reporting period.

Also during the reporting period, the S-2 had changes in the Intelligence Chief position. SSgt MONROY, from regimental S-2, relieved GySgt VILLASISTA, who was transferred to "D" Battery.

The most significant event for the month of October was Typhoon KATE. Typhoon KATE passed within four (4) miles of Headquarters, 2/11. Winds were 50 - 60 knots.

During the month of October, the Battalion continued to devote a substantial amount of time to training. Increased emphasis was placed on weapons safety procedures and security of the position area, while gunnery procedures, general military subjects and refinement of skills within the occupational field were also stressed.

d. LOGISTICS

The month of October saw this unit continue to improve its posture with the redistribution of T/s equipment. The most significant area of reporting is the continued resupply of FSB HYDA and LZ ROSS. 1,129,307 pounds of equipment and supplies were lifted in support of these positions. No lifts were made from 26 October to the end of the month due to heavy rains and low visibility.

e. COMMUNICATIONS

This Battalion received twelve (12) KY 38's and two (2) PRC-25's during this reporting period.

f. MOTOR TRANSPORT

The major problem of the Battalion remains to correct first echelon maintenance. This has caused an upgrading of second and third echelon repairs which has created excessive downtime on a number of vehicles. The M-37 3/4 Ton trucks still remain on administrative deadline. This unit received one (1) 5 Ton Wrecker (M543A2C), four (4) M151 1/4 Ton trucks and six (6) M149 Water Trailers during the month of October.

g. ENGINEER

This Battalion has two (2) LMC0 Tractors in for third echelon repair, and one (1) TD18 Tractor deadlined awaiting evacuation to third echelon repair. One (1) TD18 Tractor was Code H during the month of October.

h. ORDNANCE

Four (4) 50 Caliber Machine Guns were invoiced to this unit. There still continues to be a shortage of second echelon repair parts for the rifle (M16A1).

i. CIVIC ACTION

During the month of October, 2/11 conducted Med Caps in the villages of PHU HUONG and PHU HLEP near LZ BALDY. 2/11 also supported 5th Marines S-5 operations by providing lumber for the building of a school. Soap, tooth paste and tooth brushes were also distributed in conjunction with the Med Cap program.
