PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 3d Battalion, 11th Marines, during the period 1 February to 28 February was in direct support of the 7th Marine. Regiment in that area of the Chu Lai Combat Hase occupied by battalions of the 7th Marines. As the month began, Battery "I" (-) was still located in the vicinity of Nui Dang, grid (BS 317382) where they are participating in Operation "DeSoto" which commenced on 26 January 1967. As of this date, their location remains the same. Two guns from the 107mm Mortar Battery had been at Minh Long, grid (BS 534:14) in support of CIDG Forces since 9 January 1967. On 3 February 1967 the Battery "H" firing position at grid (HT 500033) was permanently closed down. Battery "H" CP moved to the former Battery "I" position at grid (BS 568957). The two remaining howitzers from Battery "I" occupied & position at grid (BT 548011). On 6 February 1967 the platoon of Howtars that had been supporting CIDG Forces at Minh Long was thelitifted back to the 107mm Mortar Battery position at grid (BS 551009). From 170001H Bebruary 1967 to 211300H February 1967, a Battalion Command Group, Battery "H"(=) Battery "L" 4th Battalion, 11th Marines, and a platoon of Howtars from the 107mm Mortar Battery participated in Operation "RIO GRANDE" in the area west of Quang Ngai. At 241300H the Battalion Command Group and

Battery "G" (-), (2 Howitzers and a headquarters from Battery "G", and 2 howitzers from Battery "I" (rear)) departed from the Chu Lai Base by convoy for Queng Ngai. The following morning they were helilifted to the vicinity of Nui Dang, grid (BS 812382) and Battery "G" (-) was ready to fire at 251200H. Battery "D" (-) 2d Battalion, lith Marines was placed under the operational control of this Command Group and was helilifted to grid (BS 760470) on the morning of 26 February 1967. These movements were all in conjunction with Operation "DE SOTO" and "DECKHOUSE VI" which will continue into the morth of March.



- b. Intelligence. Nothing Significant to report.
- c. Organization and Operations. Operation "DE SOTO" continued through the month of February in the Nui Deng area (BS \$17383) with Battery "I" (-) supporting the forces involved. A battalion command group and Battery "G" (-) began participation in the Operation on 25 February 1967, and Battery "D" (-) came under the operational control of the 3d Battalion, 11th Marines and began supporting the operation on 26 February 1967.

Operation "RIO GRANDE", a joint USMC, ROK, RWN, Search and Destroy Operation was conducted on 17-21 February 1967 in the area west of Quang Ngai. A command group from this battalion, Battery "H" (-), a 2 gun platoon from the 107mm Mortar Battery, and Battery "K", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines, participated. (See enclosed After Action Report Appendix A Tab 5).

- d. Training. A cross training program of field artillery men (0811) which is in effect within the Regiment in order to familiarize canoneers with several types of artillery weapons continued through the month of February. This Battalion cross trained 24 canoneers during this period. A field firing range which was constructed with the aid of the 1st Engineer Battalion was put into operation during February. It is designed for the fam-firing of the pist(1, M-14, M-16, and M-60 machine gun.
- e. Supply, Motor Transport and Logistics. There was nothing significant to report in these areas.
- f. Medical, Messing and Other Services. There was nothing significant to report in these areas.
- g. Civil Affairs/Civic Action. The hamlet of Tri Bihn I, grid (BS 553988) was visited 5 times during the month of February, and MEDCAPS were held on each visit. Approximately 40 to 50 Vietnamese were freated per visit for various aflictions. Approximately one cord of wood which was cut down during the clearing of fields of fire around the Battalion's defensive perimeter was turned over to the S-5 of the 7th Marines for distribution to the Vietnamese people. The Vietnamese of Tri Bihn I have completed the re-construction of a three room school house. Road improvements have been a continuous task in which this command has assisted by providing transportation for materials and supplies. The hamlet is in the process of building a local hospital for the

area. This command has offered its help whenever requested to assist in this project.







107mm Mortar Battery sent ó man patrol to investigate 3 small arms rounds fired from undetermined location at 2 vehicles on Highway #1 in the vicinity of grid (BT 555009). Negative results.

090120H

Battery "H" reported hearing S/A fire. Rounds were observed ricocheting to the rear of the battery position. Fire appeared to be coming from vicinity of grid (BS 575970). Battery was put on 100 percent alert and 3 rounds of 105 Illumination were requested. Firing ceased and no movement was sighted.

121500H

Battery "G" patrol located possible VC aiming device. A hole $1\frac{1}{2}$ feet in diameter, and 2 feet deep. A stake 2 feet high with burned top 3 feet away and a small tree trimmed 30 inches high with a burned top, all pointing toward Battery "G" CP. All devices were destroyed.

142330H

Battery "H" received 3 incoming M-26 grenades, one of which was a dud. They called for 81mm mortar illumination. No movement was sighted. Returned 3 rifle grenades toward suspected enemy position with negative results.

151030H

Follow up on 142330H: Battery "H" patrol inspecting wire found a VC claymore-type mine secured to the protective wire. BOD disearmed and removed the mine.

171015H

Battery "H" patrol found 1 ChiCom grenade outside of protective wire.

172300H

Battery "H" OP sighted movement on the wire. 81mm mortar illumination was fired, and one M-26 grenade was thrown. The following morning a patrol found





Execution. At 0100 17 February the Battalion Command Group with Battery "H" (-), 3d Rattalion, 11th Marines, (4 105mm howitzers), Battery "K", 4th Battallica, little Marines, (6 towed 155mm howitzers), a reinforced platoon form Company "L", 3d Battalion, 5th Marines, a detachment from Company "B", 1st Engineer Battalion, and a detachment from Company : "C" lst Anti Tank Battalion departed from the Chu Lai Combat Base to coopy apposition areal in the vicinity of grid BS545735 in support of Operation "RIN GRANGE". The group arrived at the Quang Ngal Airfield at 17070CH. The Command Group and Battery "K" departed from the airfield at 170730H and were ready to fire from grid BS568728 at 170830H. At 171400 Battery "H" (-) was laid and ready to fire at grid BS569728. At 170830H a plateon from the 107mm Mortar Battery (2 howters) was helilifted from MARION Pan grid BT549013 to AN HOA grid BS473864. The 107mm Montar platoon was laid and ready to fire at 171030H. At 181215H the Command Group and Battery "H" (-) displaced for grid 55547732. Battery "H" (-) was laid and ready to fire at 181330E. Battery "K" and a second echelon of the Command Group displaced from grid BS568728 at 181330H. Battery "X" was laid and ready to fire at grid BS-546731 at ESISTON. At 191200H the 107mm Morter platoon was hedilifted from AN HOA to grid BS547732. At Equator the helilift was completed and the platoon was laid and ready to fire. On 10830H Battery "K" displaced for the Quang Ngai Airfield grid BS60472l and was laid and ready to fire at 211130H. Battery "H" (-), the 107mm Mortal Platcon, and the Battalion Command Group displaced for a motor march to the Cha Lai Coubat Base at 201400H.

The group provided fire support to USMS, RVN, and ROK Forces until 211300H at which time Battery "K" was returned to the operational control of 4th Bath intalian, 11th Marines. The rifle platoon from Company "L", 3d Battalian, 5th Marines was left in support of Battery "K" at Quang Ngai.

The detachments from the 1st Engineer Battalion, and 1st Anti Tank Battalion were returned to operational control of their parent units at 211900H when the group arrived at the Chu Lai Combat Base



- 12. <u>Besults</u>. 7 Confirmed KIA, 12 Probable KIA, 1 Secondary Explosion, 3 buildings destroyed. It is also noted that the ARVN Airborne Task Force attributed a Confirmed VC body count of over 800 to combined Air, Artillery and ground action during the operation.
- 13. Administrative Matters. Administrative Plan 301-66 applied to this operation.
- a. Supplies. All classes of supply were provided from the ISA Quenc Igai with excellent results, with the exception of resupply for 107mm Mortar Battery in the AN HOA position. These supplies were provided by the battalion, and flown directly from the permanent position at Chu Ini.
 - b. Maintenance. No significant events.
 - c. Ammunition Handling. No significant events.
 - d. Communications. No significant events.
- 14. Special Equipment and Techniques. No significant events.
- 15. Commander's Analysis. The operation provided valuable experience in the following areas:
 - a. Displacement of the Battalion Command Group by echelon.
- b. Close coordination of artillery fires with and in support of RVN Forces.
