



PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1 April to 11 April, 3d Battalion, 11th Marines was in direct support of the 7th Marines in that area of the Chu Lai Combat Base occupied by battalions of the 7th Marines. During the period 13 April to 30 April, 3d Battalion, 11th Marines, reinforced with Battery "A", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines and Battery "K", 1th Battalion 11th Marines, was in direct support of the 7th Marines (Rein) in that portion of the DaNang TACE occupied by battelions of the 7th Marines and 1st Battalion, 26th Marines. As the month began, Battery (moup "I" was still located in the vicinity of Nul Dang (Grid BS\$17,382) where they were participating in Operation "DeSoto". Battery Group "I" was composed of Battery "I", 3d Battalion, 11th Marines, Detachment, 307mm Mortar Battery 3d Battalion, 11th Marines with 2 Howings and Detachment, Battery "K", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines with 2 155mm towed howitzers. Operation "DeSoto" commenced on 26 January 1967 and ended on 8 April. At 0001H on 1 April; search and destroy operation "Boone" commenced and continued to 1200, 7 April. A Battalion Group composed of a Command Group from Headquarters, 3d Battalion, 11th Marines, Battery "Ha(-), 3d Battalion, 11th Marines, Battery "L" (-), 4th Battalion, 11th Marines, Platoon "A", 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) and Platoon "C", 3d 155mm Gun Battery (SP) was formed and supported the operation. Operation "Boone" was conducted in the area north and east of the city of Quang Ngai. On 9 April, the movement of the battalion to the DaNang TAOR commenced when Battery "H" closed station at 0545 to move to the ship loading area. At 1000 on 10 April, the relieving U. S. Army unit assumed control of fires. At 1400 on 12 April, the Chu Lai Combat Base positions were completely vacated. Movement to the DaMang TACR was by ship and was completed at 11,00 on 15 April, when the last elements arrived. The forward elements had arrived on 13 April and had decupied positions. The Battalion Command Post, Headquarters Battery and 107mm Mortar Battery are at Grid AT988652, Battery-"G"-at Grid.AT932665, Battery-"H" at Grid AT921795 and Battery

"I" at Grid AT882580. 3d Battalion, 11th Marines assumed control of fires in the TAOR at 1700 on 13 April. At this time Battery "A", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines located at Grid AT966619 and Battery "K", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines, located at Grid AT898672 with 4 155mm SP Howitzers and 2 155mm SP howitzers located at the position of Battery "I" (Grid 882530) were placed under the operational control of 3d Battalion 11th Marines. During the period 24 April to 27 April, Battery Group "I" (Battery "I" plus the platoon of Battery "K" located at Battery "I" position) supported Op eration "Grand" from base positions.

Operation "Boone", a joint USMC, ROKMC, ARVN Search and Destroy operation was conducted in the area north and east of the city of Quang Ngai from 1 to 7 April. 3d Battalion, 11th Marines Battalion Group supported the operation. (See After Action Report, Tab (6) to Appendix (A)).

During the period 10 to 14 April, the Battalion moved from the Chu Lad Combat Base to the DaNang TAOR.

Battery Group "I", composed of Battery "I" and Detachment, Battery "K", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines, supported Operation "Grand" from base positions from 24 to 27 April.

- do Training. Accent has been placed on individual and section training and on ramiliarization firing of all organic small arms. A field firing range within the Battalion CP perimeter was utilized at the Chu Lai position and a 1000" range constructed by 2d Battalion, 12th Marines, who previously occupied the position now occupied by the 3d Battalian, 11th Marines CP, has been rehabilitated and placed in use for familiarization firing.
- e. Supply, Motor Transport and Logistics. During the month, the Battalion received 30 M35A2 Multi-fuel vehicles and 36 Mul6B1 trailers. A change of tubes was accomplished for all 105mm howitzers needing new tubes. The 107mm towed mortars (Howtars) were turned in and the Mortar Battery was issued 6 4.2" M30 mortars.
- f. Medical, Messing and Other Services. There was nothing significant to report in these areas.
- g. Civil Affairs/Civic Action. While at the Chu Lai position, MED CAP visits were made on 5 occasions at Tri Binh (1) (Grid BS555987). A total of approximately 180 people were treated. At the DaNang position, MED CAP is carried out immediately outside the entrance to the Battalion CPs on Monday, Wednesday and Friday of each week. During April 6 MEDCAPs were conducted, treating a total of approximately 114 people. This Battalion class assumed the responsibility for the support of a school located approximately 1000 meters north of the Battalion CP. This school was constructed by 2d Battalion, 12th Marines and was supported by that unit until they were relieved by this Battalion.

11. Exaution. At 1300 on 26 Jan 67. Battery "I" (4 105mm howitzers) departed from Chu Lai Combat Base and proceeded to Quang Ngai airfield where they, with 3d Battalion, 7th Marines commenced airlift to the *icinity of Nui Dang at 1700. Their movement completed, Battery "I" was in position, ready to fire at Grid BS 818382 at 271859H January 67, with 4 105mm Howitzers. There were 2 155mm Howitzers of the ARVN forces located at Nui Dau, Grid bS 870321 with a detachment of the 4th Battalion, 11th Marines under OPCON of Dattery "I" to support the operation. At 241300H Febuary, the Battalion Command Group and Battery "G" (4 105mm Howitzers) departed Chu Lai Combat Base to Quang Ngai airfield where they stayed overnight. Airlift to the vicinity of Nui Dang started at 250800H and was complered at 251400H. Battery "G" was laid, ready to fire at 251400H at Grid BS 811384. Battery "I" controlled and coordinated fires intil 261000H when the Battalion Command Group assumed control. Battery "D" (4105mm howitzers) completed helilift from the Chu Lai Combat Base to Grid BS 762471 and was ready to fire at 261330H. On February 27 the SLF landed. The SLF artillery was in position at 271245H. Battery "G" 3d Battalion, 12th Marines was at Grid BS 811385 and 407mm Mortar Battery. 3d Battalion, 12th Marines was at Grid BS 810490. At 021000H Battery "D" was released and directed to return to the operational control of 2d Battalion; 11th Marines. Helilift from their position to Quang Ngai airfield commenced immediately. At 021400 the Battalion Command Group CP was closed and control of artillery fires was passed to Pattery "I". Helilift of the Battalion Command Group commenced at 021430H. Battery "G" displaced at 030800H and commenced helilift to Quang Ngai airfield. Airlift of the Command Group and Battery "G" was completed at 040930H. Battery "I" displaced from their position on top of Nui Dang to a lower position at Grid BS 812384 with 6 105mm Howitzers at 031650H. On 24 March, 2 107mm mortars (Towed) from 2d Dattalion, 11th Marines and 2 155 Howitzers (towed) from 4th Battalion, 11th Marines departed from Chu Lai Combat Base to be helilifted to position at Nui Dang. The mortars were in position at Grid BS 818382 and the 155 Howitzers at Grid BS 814383 at 241710H. On 25 March at 0845, 2 107mm mortars (towed) from Mortar Battery, 3d Battalion, 11th Parines commenced airlift to replace the 107mm mortars from 2d Battalion, 11th Marines. The exchange was completed at 252120H. At 071200H April the operation was ended and movement. of the Detachment, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines, Detachment 107mm Mottar Battery, 3d Battalion, 11th Marines and Battery "I" was commenced. Movement completed at 161000H April 1967 when the last elements of the 107mm Mortar Battery rejouned their parent unit in the Da Nang TAOR.

12. Result, 109 confirmed KIA, 190 probable KIA, 2 confirmed WIA, 3 probable WIA, 17 bunkers destroyed, 75 structures destroyed, (2 structures damaged, 4 boats destroyed, 3 boats damaged, 9 secondary explosions, and considerable domage to trenches.

- 13. Administrative Matters. Administrative Plan 301-66 was applied this operation.
- a. Supplies. All classes of supply were provided from the Nut Dang LSA with excellent results.
 - b. Maintenance. No significant events
 - c. Ammunition Handling, No significant events
- d.Communications. Die to T/O and T/E limitations, it was necessary to borrow both personnel and equipment from other units in order to support the operation. Each with the borrowed equipment, there was an inadequate backup for possible equipment failures. The MRC-109 proved to be very useful, particularly for long range communications. However, a problem developed where by one radio out out two or more other radios. This was primarily with the MRC-109 but also occurred with PRC-25 radios. The frequency spread was such that this should not have occurred and antennas were separated to the maximum extent possible. It became necessary to discontiune use of some frequencies in order to avoid this problem.
- 14. Special Equipment and Techniques, No significant events
- 15. Commander's Analysis. This operation provided valuable experience in the following areas:
- 1. Planning, coordinating and controlling amillery fires at battery level.
- 2. The logistics problems involved with resupply and movement by helicopter over an extended period of time.

- 9. Mission. Provide artillery support to USMC, ROKMC and ARWN forces in the area of operations.
- 10. Concept of Operation, The Commanding Officer, 1st Field Artillery Group, directed 3d Battalion, 11th Marines to provide artillery support to deployed forces in the area of operations.
- 11. Execution. At 1500 31 March, the Mattalion Command Group, a plant teen from Company "A", 1st Pattalion, 5th Marines, and detachments from Company "B", 1st Engineer Pattalion and Company "C", 1st Anti-Tank Battalion departed Chu Lai Combat Base and proceeded to a position in the vicinity of the LSA at Quang Ngai Airfield where they arrived at 1745 and remained overnight. Battery "H" (-) commenced helilift at 311200H to a position in the vicinity of Grid BS 676860. Movement was completed at Oll500H. The remainder of the Task Organization departed from the Chu Lai ombat Pase to occupy positions in the vicinity of Grid BS 631852 and were laid and ready to fire at 311845He, At 0615 April the Battalion ommand Group, accompanied by the infant my engineer and anti-tank detachments, displaced from the wang Ngai Airfield to a position in the vicinity of Grid BS 691773 and opener CP at 010835H, Pattery "I" was assigned the mission of direct support of 1st Battalion, 7th Marines until the completion of the helilift of Battery "H". At 011540H, Battery "H" was assigned the direct support mission, Battery "L" was assigned the mission of general support reinforcing 3d Battalion 11th Marines and was ordered to displace. Battery "L" (-) (3. 155mm SP Howitzers) occupied position at Grid BS 690772 and was ready to fire at Oll830H. One 155mm SP Howitzer was left in old position because of electrical failure. This gum was repaired and was brought to the forward position on 2 April, Battery displaced and returned to the hu Lai Combat Base and was returned to the operational control of 4th Battalion 11th Marines. At 1700, 5 April, the infamtry platoon was returned to 5th Marines forward CP and the Battalian Command Group with the Anti-Tank and Engineer detackments displaced and returned to the Cau Lai ombat Base. Operational Comtrol of Battery "H", "A" Platoon 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) and "C" Platcon, 3d 155 Gun Battery (SP) was assumed by the forward CP of 1st Field artillery Group. Battery "H" was released from the operation and commenced air movement to the Chu Lai Combat Hase at 1030, 7 April.

During this period the group provided fire support to USMC, ARVN





- 12. Results. 11 probable KIA, 10 emplacements destroyed, 1 thench line destroyed, and several structrues destroyed.
- 13. Administrative Matters. Administrative Plan 301-66 applied to thes operation.
- a. Supplies. All classes of sipply were provided from the Quang Ngai LSA except for class V for the 155 Gun and 8" Howitzer platoons. Results were generally good except that the lack of sufficient helicopters did, at times, result in Battery "H" (-) getting dangerously low in ammunition and water. It should be noted that when an artillery unit is helilifted into a position and must be resupplied by air, the helicopter squaddon at MAG must be in all phases of planning for the operation. During this operation difficulty was experienced in getting helicopters for the resupply of Battery "H". While this did not develope into a serious problem it could have very easily if the infantry units which they supported had become heavily engaged for any long duration.
 - b. Maintenance. No significant events.
 - c. Ammunition Handling. No significant events.
 - d. Communications. No significant events.
- 14. Special Equipment and Techniques. Nosignificant events.
- 15. Commander's Analysis. The operation provided valuable experience in the following areas:
- a. Close coordination of artillery fires with and in support of multi-national forces.
 - b. Planning and execution of saturation missions.
- c. The tactical employment within a task groupment of light, medium and heavy artillery.
