PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

On 1 December 1967 the 3d Battalion, 11th Marines was in direct support of the 7th Marines in that portion of the Da Mang TAOR occupied by its Pattalions. The units of 3d Battalion, 11th Marines were located as follows: Headquarters Battery at coordinates 963619; Battery "G" at coordinates AT 923691; Rattery "H" at coordinates AT 921795; Ratterv "I" at coordinates AT 883580; and Mortar Ratterv at coordinates AT 964618. Two 4.2 Inch Mortars were located at coordinates AT 815382 reinforcing Battery "E" 2d Pattalion, 11th Marines. Operation PITT commenced at 050900H December 1967. Battery "F" provided direct support from its position. Rattery "M", 3d R" How Battery (SP), and 3d 155 Gun Pattery (SP) had the mission of general support reinforcing 3/11. Operation PITT terminated at 120600 December 1967. Operation NO NAME commenced at 071500H December 1967 with Battery "I" supporting this operation from its position until the operation terminated at 1017004 December 1967. Operation CITRUS commenced at 151200H December 1967. Battery "I" provided direct support from its position. Pattery "F" 2/11, one platoon of 155 Gun Battery (SP), and one platoon of 3d 8" How Battery (SP) provided supporting fire from their position on a "not to interfere" basis. Pattery "K" provided reinforcing fire from its position. Operation CITRUS terminated at 2310304 December 1967. At 2102454 Rattery "G" and OP Month were subjected to a mortar attack. The mortar firing positions were determined by triangulation. Pattery """ and Pattery """ were designated to fire on mortars firing at Patterv "G". Fortar Patterv 3/11 fired counter mortar fires at the enemy mortars in the vicinity of OP Month.

10. Concept of Operation: The commanding officer of the 11th Marines directed the 3d Battalion, 11th Marines to provide artillery support to the deployed forces in the area of operations.


11. Execution. Battery "I" was in direct support of the 3d Battalion, 7th Marines from its present position, (Hill 65). Battery "E" was available for support of operation CITRUS on a "not to interfere" basis from its present position at An Hoa. A platoon from 3d 8" Howitzer Battery and a platoon from 3d 155 Gun Battery provided general support reinforcing fires from their normal positions at An Hoa. Battery "B" was in general support and delivered supporting fires from the Battery position. At 231030 December, Operation CITRUS terminated and all units reverted to the control of their parent organizations.

- 13. Administrative Matters. Administrative Plan 301-67 applied to this operation.
- 1h. Special Equipment and Techniques. 15 Time-on-Target Missions were fired utilizing all supporting artillery.
- 15. Commander's Analysis. Initially, the coordination between air and artillery was poor but this was remedied and for the remainder of the operation went smoothly. On the first day of the operation, not all artillery units were monitoring India Battery's Conduct of Fire Net because of supporting units not having received the Regimental Frag Order for Operation CITRUS. Once this situation was corrected, no other communications problems were experienced. The artillery support thereafter went smoothly. Accurate and effective fire was provided throughout the operation. Time-on-target missions were fired on heavily fortified villages in the operational area to produce surprise, destruction and shock effect on the enemy.



- a. That consideration be afforded to permit artillery to conclude a target engagement before check fires for air in the area be initiated. In some instances, artillery missions in process had to be abandoned to permit air to engage the same area. By allowing artillery to complete its mission, air can become well criented, flak suppression is effected, and the enemy is fixed, rendering him vulnerable to the spectrum of ordance available to the aircraft.
- b. That more time-on-target missions be fired in support of infantry forces. The tremendous surprise, destruction and shock effect of massed catteries firing TOT's more than compensates for the effort required to effect coordination.
- c. That Sav-A-Planes be rigidly observed by aircraft transiting over operational area,
- d. That check fires be instituted for only those aircraft which intersect the gun target line, and that this check fire be effective only for the time the aircraft is actually endangered.
