Liaison Officers also assisted the CAP units with defensive fire planning and firing defensive fires.

12. Administration Matters

a. Administrative details were covered in a conference prior to the operation.

(1) Supplies: Supplies were furnished through normal channels.

(2) Maintenance: Normal.

(3) Transportation: Transportation was furnished by organic vehicles.

(4) Communications: PRC-25 radios provided the primary means of communication.

13. Special Equipment and Techniques: None.

14. Commanders Analysis: As in all joint operations, it was found advisable to attach a liason officer with communication personnel and equipment to the ARVN maneuver battalion. This facilitated clearances and enabled the ARVN requests for fire to be efficiently processed. Due to the brief duration of the operation and an absence of enemy contact there was nothing else of significance on which to comment.
