NARRATIVE SUMMARY

September was marked by the mobility of the firing batteries as this command continued to provide timely fire support to the 7th Marines throughout its area of operations. All firing batteries were involved in the six helicopter operations in which this battalion participated. There was a total of five 105mm howitzer battery moves, and one lift of a plateon of 4.2 inch mortars.

Engineers and SEABEE!'s built bunkers and living spaces in each of the battery positions. Additionally, a new fire support base was constructed atop a mountain peak in the Que Son Mountains (vic BT016464). That new position, FSB BUSHWHACK, was occupied upon completion by a howitzer battery. Construction of FSB BUSHWHACK was part of a plan which includes the selection and preparation of other sites in the Que Son Mountains which will present a series of mutually supporting fire bases which can be occupied with little or no preparation.



- b. <u>Intelligence</u>. The enemy continues his basic plan of operation to harass Free World Military Armed Forces by mortar and rocket fire. Heavy contact could develop in Antennae Valley (vicinity AT9138) where there have been numerous sightings of large groups of the enemy.
- c. Organization and Operations. Units of this battalion did not participate in any named operations during the month of September. Firing batteries occupied positions at LZ's BAIDY and ROSS, and FSB's RYDER, PONY, and BUSHWHACK at various times throughout the month. 2nd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery was assigned the mission of General Support/Reinforcing of 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines during the period 11-18 September 1969. Battery K 4/13 and 3rd 175mm Gun Battery (-) continued their mission of reinforcing 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines.

- d. Training. New members joining the battalion continue to attend a two-day orientation program. Due to the frequent displacements of the firing batteries, training was geared to improvement and defense of the battery position.
- e. Logistics, Equipment and Supply. Logistics, equipment and supplies continued to be provided in a timely and efficient manner. Especially noteworthy warm the accessful heli-lifts of the different firing batteries during the month of September. Battery G was displaced by helicopters three (3) times, while Batteries H and I and a platoon of Mortar Battery were heli-lifted to their Fire Support Bases once each. A total of 769,000 pounds of re-supply were air-lifted to the outlying batteries.
- f. Civic Action/Civil Affairs. This command employed eighteen (18) local national civilians for use as laborers within the cantonment areas. As of this date, this command has not been assigned a Civic Action Area of Responsibility. Two (2) laundry/barber shop facilities continued to be operated by Vietnamese civilians and utilized by members of this command.
- g. <u>PSYOPS</u>. No significant activities were conducted by this unit due to the recent movement into the Battalion CP.
 - h. Combined Action Company Program. Negative report.
- i. <u>Medical</u>. The Battalion Aid Station treated 301 outgoing Marine patients and referred 45 other Marine patients to other medical facilities. No Vietnamese patients were treated during the month of September.






