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PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1-25 April, this battalion continued to support operations of Task Force Xray in the Chu Lai TAOR. Headquarters Battery and Battery "M" displaced by sea transport to Danang to support operations of the 1st Marine Division (Rein), on 26 April and occupied their present positions. Battery "I" remained in the Chu Lai TAOR in support of the 5th Marines while awaiting shipping. Battery "K", presently under operational control of 3d Battalion, 11th Marines in conjunction with Operation GREGON, displaced to the Danang TAOR independent of the battalion. The battalion and its assigned batteries have the following missions:

The 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) and the 3d 155mm Gun Battery (SP) continued to occupy collocated positions with the battalion at coordinates BT441100, BT39461445, and BS53909441; however, areas of operational control terminated upon execution of Operation GREGON. The battalion observation post at An Hoa (BS473303) was manned until 21 April when relieved by elements of the U. S. Army. The battalion continued to furnish personnel to man the observation post at Nui Tron (BS516778) until 21 April. During the month the battalion fired 1547 missions, with a total of 12619 rounds. The six 155mm towed howitzers were turned over to 2d Battalion, 11th Marines effective 200830H April.

Normal administrative functions were accomplished during the month. No difficulties were encountered.

The battalion forward observer team at An Hoa continued to furnish reports on enemy movements and actions.

a. Daily perimeter patrols were conducted and listening posts were established nightly.

b. Local Vietnamese civilians reported information to the battalion on VC activity on three separate occasions.

3. Training. Normal training on general military subjects and technical training was conducted.

4. Logistics, Equipment and Supply. (See Appendix 4)

a. Approximately 65% of the total requisitions submitted since arrival in Vietnam have been filled.

b. The current deadline status of motor transport equipment is 21%. Eight are deadlined for 2d echelon only (awaiting parts); 13 are deadlined for a combination of 2d and 3d echelon work.

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5. Civic Action/Civil Affairs. (See Appendix 5)

a. MedCaps were continued throughout the Civic Action Area of Responsibility. Work was continued on the access road at BT440014, but due to operational commitments could not be finished. School kits were distributed in the school (BT445117) to 90 children.

b. Clothing was distributed to 60 children in the hamlet of Khuong Dai during the month.

c. The repairs and replacement of school tables and benches in the schools at Khuong Dai, Khuong Phu and Khuong Hung were completed. The repairs of the school (BT437107) was delayed as the Hamlet Chief was late in submitting his requirements to the Battalion S-5 (2dLt J. W. WELLS).

- 091400H A Vietnamese male informant (Chung Vien) reported that a company of VC (100) were located at BT325107 on 9 April. The VC leader was reported to be Thai Lam who lived at Doang An (1) (BT506092) prior to 1964. The VC are armed with pistols, 8 .30 caliber MG, 1 60mm mortar and wearing yellow pajamas. Information was reported to the 1st FAG, 11th Marines. An artillery TOT was fired on the suspect area at 101640H.
- 111800H Received information from local hamlet chief that the VC had distributed anti-American propaganda leaflets in the hamlets surrounding the battalion CP on 10 and 11 April. Two copies of the leaflets were recovered and forwarded to 1st FAG.
- 111850H Received information from District Headquarters at Binh Son that 3 VC battalions were located in the vicinity of BS470950 and BS470930, and have the mission of attacking the Battery "M" complex between 11 and 14 April. Information was reported to 1st FAG. TOT was fired on suspect area at 112100H.
- 121930H A Vietnamese male informant (Chung Vien) reported that 300 VC, designated the 402nd Battalion, commanded by Nguyen An Thong, was located in vicinity BT405997 and BT418012 at 121600H. VC armament includes 82mm mortars. Information passed to 1st FAG.

- 031043H 2d Platoon, 3d 155mm Gun Battery (SP) fired 9 rounds HE on 5 VC in trenchline at BS501796 reported by N-24 (Nui Tron) resulting in 1 WIA (Prob).
- 032130H Battery "M" fired 8 rounds HE at BS436870 on VC position area reported by M-24 (An Hoa) resulting in 12 KIA (Conf) and 9 WIA (Conf). Body count reported by U.S. Special Forces, CIDG, Tra Bong.
- 041850H Battery "M", 2d Platoon, 3d 155mm Gun Battery (SP), and 2d Platoon, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) fired 36 HE and 29 WP on 200 VC at BS502882 reported by M-24 (An Hoa) resulting in one large secondary explosion and several fires burning.
- 051415H Daily security patrol from Battery "M" discovered an antipersonnel mine at BS545943. An explosive ordnance team, requested from 2d Bn, 7th Marines, blew the mine in place at 051430H.
- 050025H Post #2 on the battalion's northern perimeter, west side of Highway #1, received one fragmentation grenade 20 meters north of the post. Area was illuminated with hand flare with no enemy activity observed. Suspect area to be kept under close surveillance.
- 051600H Battery "L" (-) displaced for return to primary position. Reverted OpCon 4/11; arrived in battalion area at 052000H to remain overnight. Departed battalion area at 060800H, arrived in primary position at 060920H and resumed normal mission.
- 061838H Battery "M" fired 16 HE and 3 WP on 5 VC on a trail reported by M-24 (An Hoa) resulting in one secondary explosion and one fire.

- 091855H Battery "M" fired 5 WP and 6 HE on 6 VC in house at BS508860 reported by M-24 (An Hoa) resulting in 3 fires, 1 house damaged, 1 secondary explosion, and 6 WIA (Prob).

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- 102100H One fragmentation grenade was received 40 meters outside of wire on the northern battalion perimeter between Posts 18 and 19. Area was illuminated with 5 155mm rounds; negative surveillance enemy movement. Fire team swept suspect area on the way to listening post site with negative results.
- 102135H An estimated squad of VC fired 50 rounds small arms at the An Hoa observation post. The FO fired 5 artillery missions on grid BS470876 and BS47898774; ROKMC elements on An Hoa fired 200 rounds small arms and ARVN elements on An Hoa fired 15 rounds 60mm mortar. VC broke contact. No casualties incurred. No known enemy casualties observed.
- 121445H Battery "M" fired 6 HE on 2 VC with packs in house at BS501869 reported by M-24 (An Hoa) resulting in 2 KIA (Prob) and a hut destroyed.
- 130704H Battery "M" closed station in preparation for displacement to Danang in conjunction with Operation OREGON, chop OpCon 3/11.
- 131030H Battery "M" fired 3 HE, 2 WP on 5 VC with packs in open at BT295069 reported by 1st Reconnaissance Team resulting in 5 KIA (Prob).
- 131415H Battery "K" embarked aboard LST at Chu Lai sand ramp.
- 170745H M37 from Headquarters Battery ran over a mine at BT435104 resulting in 5 WIA (USMC), 4 KIA (VN), 2 WIA (VN) and total damage to vehicle.
- 172140H Post #10 on the battalion's southern perimeter received an undetermined number of small arms fire from houses southeast of the post at BT444093. Sentry on Post #10 returned 15 rounds of small arms. Condition Amber 2 was set; 2d Bn, 11th Marines fired 4 rounds 105mm illumination. Post #7 reported a figure crawling near the outer wire and illuminated with a hand illumination. Post #8 reported seeing a figure run behind a house to the front of Post #7. One 105mm round illumination was fired, but nothing further was observed. A fire team swept area and checked house at BT444093 at 180630H with negative results.
- 181345H Daily squad security patrol received 1 incoming grenade at BT435095. One man suffered shock and was med-evaced. Squad swept area with negative results. Patrol continued with assigned mission.

212330H Post #18 on the north side of the battalion perimeter received 3 bursts of automatic weapons fire totaling 30 rounds of unknown caliber from a position 300 meters southeast of Post #18. Rounds passed high over Posts 18 and 19. Condition Amber 2 was set; no fire returned.

221706H Battery "M" fired 9 HE on 6 VC at BS494842 reported by US Army observer (Upshot 61) resulting in 1 KIA (Prob).

230635H Battery "M" advance party completed embarking aboard LST 715 in preparation for move to Danang TAOR in conjunction with Operation OREGON and departed Chu Lai.

251125H Headquarters Battery and Battery "M" closed station and displaced to the embarkation area at Chu Lai in preparation for movement to the Danang TAOR in conjunction with Operation OREGON.

251147H Control of fires of Battery "L" passed to 1st FAG, 11th Marines while awaiting shipping to Danang.
