PART I
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period of 1-30 September, the Battalion continued to support operations of the 1st Marine Division (Rein), in the Danang TAOR. Battery "H" located at Grid (88827737) was maintained as a provisional battery supporting the Divisional Counter/Rocket program. Battery "H" provided two guns for positioning at Hill 190. Battery "H" was dissolved at 091150H Sept 67. Battery "H" Guns returned from Hill 190 on 13 September 1967 to the Battery primary position. Battery "L" Guns that were in Battery "H" and "H" positions returned to Battery "L" primary position on 15 September 1967.

Headquarters Battery displaced by echelon the first element departing the Danang area on the 10th of September. Final movement was completed by 111200H September 1967. On assuming command in the TRIEM TRUNG Artillery complex 3rd Platoon 8" Howitzer Battery became OPCON to 4th Battalion, 11th Marines. Operation of Observation Posts "FALCON" (AT93147821) and "PLAID 24" (AT09778211) was assumed by Regimental Headquarters on or about the 10th of September 1967. During the month the Battalion fired 3241 missions, expending a total of 11,123 rounds.

2. Intelligence. (See APPENDIX 2)

a. Daily perimeter patrols were conducted throughout the month. In the new positions Listening Post's have been established and manned at predetermined times nightly.

b. Received from a reliable informant. NVA Regiment broke up after engagement with 5th Marines. Moved North. 2 Battalions went to XUYEN THAI, XUYEN LONG and BAN THACH in XUYEN district. 1 Battalion went to PHU-KY in DIEN BAN district. No exact date or time this incident occurred is not known. However, it was quite recent. It was also reported that they might attack HOI AN and surrounding outposts with mortars.

3. Training

a. Normal training and certain technical training has been conducted in the Battalion with the goal of increasing firing efficiency.

4. Logistics, Equipment and Supply. (See APPENDIX 4)

a. Approximately 60% of the total 17790 requisitions have been filled since arrival in Vietnam. 10665 requisitions are complete.

b. The current deadline status of motor transport equipment is 16%. There are 7 vehicles down for 2nd echelon, and 9 vehicles for 3rd echelon maintenance.

5. Civic Action/Civil Affairs.

a. The Battalion Civic Action area of responsibility was the village of HOA LAC until Headquarters Battery displaced to TRIEN TRUNG on 11 September 1967. Consisting of seven hamlets of DAI LAI, XUAN LOC, PHU THONG, THON PHU HA, LAC HOA, KHE LUN and THOUNG PHI.

b. Medcaps were conducted at DIA LA hamlet treated 24 persons; PHU THUONG, treated 31 persons; XUAN LOC, treated 29 persons.

c. The Battalion S-5 distributed 100 school kits to the children of PHU THUONG hamlet.

a. The Battalion complex had no incidents from 1-10 September 1967. Headquarters Battery furnished two squads of security troops to Battery "N" 1-9 September 1967. On 020020H Battery "N" received mortar fire and infiltration of VC with satchel charges, 3 USMC (KIA) 3 USMC (WIA). Casualties were all from Headquarters security squads. At 020055 Battery "N" received 3 - 122mm rockets, one CP tent damaged, no casualties. On 020055 Battery "M-Z" reported receiving small arms fire. On 020058, Observation Post "PLAID 24" was under small arms fire. On 030725 Battery "N" Listening Post captured 1 POW and weapons over to 7th Marines. On 070010 Battery "K" received incoming grenades. On 080015 Battery "N" received 15 rounds small arms, VC attempting infiltration, returned fire received assistance from 2/7 with HE and ILL mortar support. Headquarters Battery and Battery "L" received 5 rounds rocket size unknown, 110330, Battery "L" had 3 casualties. 2 of which were med-evaced. Headquarters Battery was established at new location 111200H September 1967, Grid BT105582.
