**PART II****NARRATIVE SUMMARY**

During the period 1-31 March 1968, the Battalion continued to support operations of the 1st Marine Division (Rein), in the Danang TAOR.

At 0100 on 4 March a rocket attack was launched on the Marble Mountain airfield and upon the Hill 34 complex in which the Battalion Command Post is located. The Battalion C.P. received 7 122mm rockets. One of these destroyed one living hut, damaged another and caused 9 casualties: 1 KIA (SgtMajor HODAL); 4WIA (Evacuated) and 4 WIA (minor, not evacuated). The rocket firing sites were located and the Battalion fired counter rocket fire employing Battery "M-X" and the section of 1st Armored Amphibian Company at Hill 47. Counter rocket fire commenced at 0107 and terminated at 0300.

On 3 March the 2nd Provisional 155 Howitzer Battery (Towed) began to move by helicopter airlift to Hill 34 from Hill 63 where it had been OPCON to the U.S. Army's Americal Division. The CH 53 had made two lifts (1 155mm Howitzer and one M105 trailer) and was returning to Hill 63 for the second howitzer when it was hit by ground fire and forced down. The air move was cancelled and the remainder of the battery weapons equipment and personnel were brought to Hill 34 by road march on 4 March. The convoy departed

## 2. Intelligence

- a. Daily perimeter patrols and nightly ambushes/listening posts were conducted throughout the month.

- b. During the month of March there has been a slight decrease in guerilla activity in the Southern Danang TAOR. An increase in conventional warfare activity by the enemy was apparent.

## 3. Training

- a. Normal training and certain technical training has been conducted in the Battalion with the goal of increasing firing efficiency.

- b. Renewed emphasis has been placed on weapon safety procedures and upon defense against chemical attack.

## 4. Logistic, Equipment, and Supply

- a. Approximately 87% of 21,145 requisitions have been filled since arrival in Vietnam. 18,494 requisitions are completed.

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Hill 34 at 0900, under the command of the Battalion Motor Transport Officer 1st Lt EGGER, proceeded to Hill 63 and returned with all remaining weapons, personnel and equipment at 1400. The move was without incident.

During the period 6-10 March Battery "K" fired in support of Operation "ROCK".

Operation "WORTH", which began on 13 March, was Battery "M", less two sections, together with C Platoon 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery displaced from their permanent position at grid AT 92037974 to the Battery "G" 3/11 position on Hill 10 at grid AT 92296910 in order to provide what amounted to direct support fire for 1/7 operation in densely canopied terrain. Battery "K" also provided the same type fire support for 2/7 from their primary position on Hill 65 at grid AT 87975779. It was felt that the 155 round would be more effective in penetrating the canopy in the area of operations. The operation progressed steadily with 1/7 moving westward along the northern ridge of Happy Valley to a point where it became necessary for Battery "M" and C Platoon 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery to displace in order to keep the maneuver elements within effective range. A new position was selected and occupied at grid AT 91186696. D/1/7 provided one platoon as a security force. This was augmented by 2 squads from Regimental Headquarters and Headquarters 3/11 and two LVTH-6's from 1st Armored Amphibian Company. C Troop 3rd Squadron, 5th Cavalry (USA) was operating in the vicinity blocking the eastward end of Happy Valley and also contributed to the security of the battery position. Operation Worth, which terminated on 26 March, was characterized by light contact. However, during the last several days of the operation, several mass graves were discovered. These contained the bodies of approximately 110 NVA which had apparently been recently killed by artillery fire and/or air strikes.

On 29 March, 2 guns with crews and prime movers from the 2nd Provisional 155 Howitzer Battery (Towed) were chopped OPCON to 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines. This same day 2 of Battery "L" 109 Howitzers were moved by road march and LCU from the Lang Co Bridge area to Danang for installation of a package modification at 1st FSR. The two towed 155 howitzers remaining OPCON of 4/11 were on 29 March, in company with the two going to 2/11 road marched to Phu Gia where they were emplaced in Battery "L" 109's position to maintain that battery's fire capability at 4 weapons.

During the month of March 5,253 missions were fired expending a total of 17,544 rounds.

5. Civic Action/Civil Affairs

a. Medcaps were conducted in the hamlet of Phu Hoa on an average of once a week. A school construction project which had been started by the villagers was near completion by the end of the month. Several truck loads of Dunnage, thirty-four bags of cement, and tin for roofing material were donated to the hamlet to aid in the completion of the project. Two homes in the Phu Hoa area were rebuilt with donated material after a parachute flare destroyed the structures. One serious incident report was filed after a Vietnamese child was struck by a hit and run driver in the hamlet of Duong Phouc.
