

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

On 8 May 1968, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines began providing two (2) men to 1st Reconnaissance Battalion for concurrent duty with Reconnaissance Teams of that organization in manning OP Duck, (Grid AT 838827). This cooperative venture appears to be profitable in that recent enemy rocket launches from the Elephant Valley Area have been immediately detected from this OP. Since instituting OP Duck there has been a increase in the number of artillery kills by observed fire in the Elephant Valley Area.

Upon commencement of Operation Allenbrook on 8 May 1968, Battery K displaced two (2) howitzers to Liberty Bridge to better support the operation. These 155mm howitzers were assigned the mission of reinforcing 3d Battalion, 11th Marines and were co-located with Battery I (-) at grid AT 921539. On 17 May these howitzers were assigned the mission of reinforcing 2d Battalion, 13th Marines when that Battalion assumed the direct support mission for Operation Allenbrook ground forces.

The commencement of Operation Mamoluke Thrust on 17 May 1968, required a redistribution of Artillery assets and a provisional organization of batteries to provide an additional 155mm SP howitzer battery. The two Battery K howitzers, previously at Liberty Bridge, were designated battery KY and took OpCon of two 155mm SP howitzers from Battery M. Battery KY with 4 guns then displaced to Hill 65 where it relieved Battery K (-) in place and assumed the mission of General Support Reinforcing 3d Battalion, 11th Marines. Battery K (-), upon being relieved by Battery KY, displaced forward to the vicinity of Hill 52 (Grid ZC 210550) where it co-located with Battery G, 3d Battalion, 11th Marines and assumed the mission of reinforcing 3d Battalion 11th Marines. Battery K (-) subsequently displaced on 27 May to the vicinity of Thuong Duc (Grid ZC 151599) with Battery G, 3d Battalion, 11th Marines.

On 19 May 1968, provisional howitzer battery, 3d Battalion, 12th Marines came under the Operational Control of 4th Battalion, 11th Marines. The battery located at Hill 55 (Grid AT 965618) and was assigned the mission of reinforcing 2d Battalion, 13th Marines. On 27 May Provisional Howitzer Battery was assigned the mission of General Support so as to provide reinforcing fires in support of Operation Allenbrook and Mamoluke Thrust.

On 23 May 1968, Battery MX, (two 155mm howitzers towed) was assigned the mission of reinforcing 1st Battalion, 13th Marines and displaced to the vicinity of Hill 10 (Grid AT 922690). On 27 May this firing unit came under the Operational Control of 1st Battalion, 13th Marines.

On 27 May Battery KY was assigned the mission of General Support/Reinforcing 1st Battalion, 13th Marines in support of Operation Mamoluke Thrust.

During the month of May the cumulative surveillances of fire missions participated in by batteries of this Battalion reflect the following statistics: 168 enemy KIA, 4 enemy WIA, 24 structures destroyed, 4 structures damaged, 1 82mm Mortar destroyed, 47 secondary explosions and 1 large fire.

Organization and Operations

(1) Units of this Battalion participated in three operations during the month of May.

(a) Reinforcing fires were provided to 3d Battalion, 11th Marines, in support of Operation Ballard Valley during the period 29 April - 8 May 1968. After action statistics will be reflected in report by 3d Battalion, 11th Marines by mutual agreement.

(b) Reinforcing fires were provided to 3d Battalion, 11th Marines and 2d Battalion, 13th Marines in support of Operation Allenbrook during the period 4-31 May 1968.

(c) Reinforcing fires were provided to 3d Battalion, 11th Marines and 1st Battalion, 13th Marines in support of Operation Mameluke Thrust during the period 17-31 May 1968.

i. Training

(1) Emphasis was placed on ammunition handling and proper fuze setting for various ammunition components.

(2) General Military Subjects Training was augmented by the employment of the 1st Marine Division Mobile Training Team at Battery M and Battery K for a two day training program at each battery.

j. Logistics, Equipment and Supply

(1) Approximately 89% of 22,424 requisitions have been filled since arrival in Vietnam. 19,974 requisitions are completed.

(2) The current deadline status of Motor Transport equipment is 20%. There are 2 vehicles deadlined for 2d echelon maintenance and 17 deadlined for 3d echelon maintenance.

k. Civic Action/Civil Affairs

(1) The new school house in the hamlet of Phu Hoc was completed during May. This school has not yet been dedicated. Medcaps were conducted on a weekly basis in the village Phu Hoc.

Batteries K (-) and KI continued to support Operation Mameluke Thrust and Allenbrook during June. Battery KI, is a provisional firing unit consisting of 2 M109 SP Howitzers each, from Battery M and Battery K. The Officer-in-Charge of Battery KI is 1stLt F. S. MARTIN, whose normal duty assignment is Executive Officer of Battery K.

Battery H (-) supported Operation Swift Saber during June.

Provisional Howitzer Battery, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines was formed at grid 011627 on 8 June 1968. This battery is administratively subordinate to Headquarters Battery, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines. The tactical responsibility for this firing unit; however, is direct from the Officer-in-Charge to the Battalion Commander. Captain Stephen J. BUCK 093267 has been designated Officer-in-Charge. Provisional Howitzer Battery, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines is commonly referred to as Battery T, throughout the 11th Marine Regiment. This battery possesses four 155mm towed howitzers and has a self sustaining FDC capability. Additionally, two 155mm self-propelled guns are attached to Battery T.

On 17 June 1968, Battery P (1st Provisional Howitzer Battery, 3d Battalion, 12th Marines OPCON 4th Battalion, 11th Marines) commenced it's host program of instruction for ARVN cannonners of the newly formed 30th ARVN Artillery Battalion. During June two groups of trainees graduated from the 7 day course of instruction and on the job application. Each of the two groups consisted of 30 ARVN trainees, 2 ARVN NCO/Interpreters and an ARVN Officer-in-Charge. The program appears to be quite successful in achieving both the primary objective of attaining basic proficiency for the cannonners and furthering U. S. - Vietnamese relations. A noticeable spirit of cooperation and appreciation exists among the Marines and the ARVN soldiers and their respective officers.

During the month of June the cumulative surveillances of fire missions participated in by batteries of this Battalion reflect the following statistics: 151 enemy KIA, 11 enemy WIA, 14 structures destroyed, 5 structures damaged, 29 secondary explosions, 2 fires, and 4 boats destroyed.

During the month of June 5,125 missions were fired expending at total of 19,620 rounds. These figures include statistics from missions in support of Operation Mameluke Thrust, Operation Allenbrook, Operation Swift Saber, and fires delivered throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR which were not involved in support of a particular named operation. Each of these categories are reflected in separate tables on the next four succeeding pages.

(2) The S-2 office has recently expanded it's role within the Battalion staff functions. This has been facilitated by the joining of a technically qualified Staff Sergeant in the MOS field of Intelligence.

h. Organization and Operations

(1) Units of this Battalion participated in three operations during the month of June.

(a) Reinforcing fires were provided to 2d Battalion, 13th Marines, and 3d Battalion, 11th Marines in support of Operations ALLENBROOK and MARLUKE THRUST during the period 1-30 June 1968.

(b) Battery M provided reinforcing fires to 3d Battalion, 11th Marines in support of Operation Swift Saber during the period 7-14 June 1968.

(c) To facilitate the support of all operations engaged in and retain normal support responsibilities the assets of the Battalion were distributed as noted under the listing of subordinate units and in the Narrative Summary.

i. Training

(1) The formation of Battery T necessitated a concerted effort on the part of the Battalion Staff and all members of that firing unit to train toward attaining a state of technical proficiency in gunnery and fire direction equivalent to the mission. It is felt that the minimal requirements have been met, however; intensive on-the-job training continues with a special emphasis and close battalion supervision in this particular battery.

j. Logistics, Equipment and Supply

(1) The month of June was characterized by the requirement to support seven positions with various forms of assistance. Primary emphasis of effort was directed to support Battery K with class I, II, III, IV and V items and Battery MY with class V. Additional efforts were devoted to organizing and preparing Battery T for displacement to An Hoa. The task of providing the necessary equipment Battery T was completed by mid June.

(2) Approximately 89% of 22,852 requisitions have been filled since arrival in Vietnam. 20,562 requisitions are completed.

(3) The current deadline status of Motor Transport equipment is 16%. There are 3 vehicles deadlined for 2d echelon maintenance and 13 deadlined for 3d echelon maintenance.
