NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Battery T consists of 2 officers 51 USMC enlisted and one USN enlisted with four 155mm towed howitzers. It is carried on the rolls of Headquarters Battery. As of 271200H it is OPCON to 2/11. It is located near AN HOA.

Battery W consists of 18 USMC enlisted with two 155mm towed howitzers. It is carried on the rolls of Headquarters Battery. It has been OPCON to 1/11 all month. It is further OPCON to 3/12 as part of Battery T, 1/11. It is located in LZ GATES.

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Battery Z consists of 52 USMC enlisted with five 155mm towed howitzers. It has been carried on the rolls of Headquarters Battery since 201200H. Eleven USMC enlisted with two 155mm towed howitzers are OPCOM to 4/11 as of 240800H. They are located at the 4/11 CP near DANANG. Forty-one USMC enlisted and three 155mm towed howitzers remain OPCOM to 1/13. They are located near PHU BAI.

4/11 continues to provide (2) men to 1st Reconnaissance Battalion on a continual basis for concurrent duty with recon inserts at OP DUCK (grid AT 838827).

On 7 September, the third and final group of ARVN trainees graduated from a two-week Special Section Chiefs Artillery Course conducted by this battalion at Battery T. This course was provided to assist the newly formed 30th ARVN Artillery Battalion in training their personnel to use the 155mm towed howitzer.

On 11 September, the battalion was inspected by the IG team from FMFPAC.

During the period 12-16 September, the howitzers, self-propelled, M-109, of the battalion were calibrated.

During the period 23-26 September, one officer and three men from the Operations Platoon conducted a Forward Observer School for tenant units of the Southern Sector Defense Command (SSDC). This team also assisted in Fire Planning and orienting forces of the SSDC OP/COP system in the most effective ways of obtaining artillery support in case of an attack.

4/11 continues to maintain an alert force of one liaison officer (Bn. XO), one rifle platoon, and two FO teams to support SSDC OP-PLAN 301-68 in case of a ground attack on DANANG.

During the month of September the cumulative surveillances of fire missions participated in by batteries of this battalion reflect the following statistics: 218 enemy KIA, 5 enemy WIA, 37 structures destroyed, and 24 secondary explosions.

During September 4,241 missions were fired expending a total of 22,684 rounds. Fires were delivered throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR and were not in support of any particular operation.

During the month of September 1968 the S-2 section processed Secret Clearances and made Local Records checks for approx 30 people for Confidential Clearances. There was no unusual enemy activity during the month.

h. Organization and Operations. There were no rounds fired in support of a specific operation.

i. Training. No significant comments.

j. Logistics, Equipment and Supply.

(1) During the period 1-20 September Logistical Support was provided for four firing positions and the Headquarters position. On 21 September and throughout the remainder of the month two additional firing positions were provided with Logistical Support.

(2) As of 30 September 14 vehicles were on deadline; five at 2nd echelon awaiting parts and the remainder undergoing repair at 3rd echelon. All trucks, cargo M54A2C, utilized for transport of ammunition, were operationally ready.

(3) Although the M109 Howitzers sustained numerous mechanical deficiencies throughout the month, the operational status remained satisfactory due to the timely response of maintenance personnel from this Headquarters and 1st FSR.

(4) Approximately 91% (22,433) of the 24,805 requisitions submitted since arrival in Vietnam have been completed.

(5) The deadline rate status of motor transport equipment at the end of the period was 13%.
