NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Battery T, having been changed to OPCON 2/11 last month, was changed ADCON 2/11 on 21 October and is no longer a part of 4/11. While a part of 4/11, the men and howitzers of Tango Battery performed faithfully and well under adverse conditions. We were proud to have had them with us.

Battery W continues to serve with the Third Division as the northernmost outpost of 4/11. Weekly liaison visits are made to maintain, within operational limitations, the morale and welfare of this remote detachment.

Battery Z added three more howitzers when detachment, Battery Z was changed to OPCON 4/11 from 1/13 on 16 October. A sixth howitzer was obtained from FLC on 28 October. The battery ended the month: one officer and thirty-nine enlisted Marines. Two howitzers were emplaced and being used primarily in training ARVN cannonners. The other four were being prepared for deployment.

On 1 October 1stLt R. A. BRALEY and an F0/liaison team left for five days with the 37th ARVN Ranger Battalion on operation Talledoga Canyon.

On 6 October 2dLt J. W. McCARVER Jr. and an F0/liaison team left for 12 days with the 51st ARVN Regiment on operation Maui Peak.

On 10 October LCol M. J. BROWN flew a met balloon and reestablished the battalion's metrological capability.

On 18 October 1stLt R. A. BRALEY joined the ⁵¹st ARVN Regiment as an F0 for the last five days of operation MAUI PEAK.

On 21 October the battalion began training the first of six increments of ARVN artillery men in a special one-week cannoner training course. There will be 30-37 trainees in each increment. They are from the newly organized 64th Battalion stationed near Danang. This group completed their training on Sunday, 27 October and were presented certificates in an informal ceremony by Lt. Col. J. M. COCKEY, Commanding Officer of 4/11.

On 28 October, the second increment of ARVN cannoners began training.

On 30 October, Battery L fired its 100,000th round in Vietnam.

During October, 3446 missions were fired expending a total of 20,505 rounds. Fires were delivered throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR.

g. Intelligence. During the month of October 1968, the S-2 Section processed secret clearances and maintained the enemy situation map. There was no unusual enemy activity.

h. Organization and Operations.

(1) Units of the battalion participated in six operations during October.

(2) Reinforcing fires were provided to 1st Battalion, 13th Marines, and all three direct support battalions of the 11th Marines in support of Operations Halleluga Canyon, Maui Peak, Mameluke Thrust, Henderson Hill, Sabine Draw and Garrard Bay during the period 1-31 October.

i. Training. MOS proficiency training was emphasized this month. The fundamentals of firing battery procedures, technical fire direction, and communications were stressed and will continue to receive particular attention.

j. Logistics, Equipment and Supply.

(1) During the month, the motor transport deadline rate rose to 32 per cent. Of vehicles deadlined, 59 per cent are at third echelon.

(2) M109 Howitzer operational status remained satisfactory. At the end of October, three of the Battalion's 18 M109 Howitzers were deadlined, all awaiting second echelon parts.

(3) One TD-15 tractor went down for third echelon maintenance during October, leaving the Battalion's organic tractor capability zero. Of six TD-15's authorized, four are now at third echelon maintenance facilities and two have been condition coded beyond economical repair.

(4) Of 25,788 requisitions submitted since the Battalion has been in Vietnam, 22,954 have been filled.
