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g. Intelligence. During the month of March 1969, the S-2 made three trips to rocket sites. Four liaison trips were made to Regimental S-2.

(1) No SVN was expended for the Volunteer Informant program during the month.

h. Organization and Operations.

(1) Units in the Battalion participated in 2 operations during March. Operation Taylor-Common ended and Operation Oklahoma Hills commenced. Upon termination of Operation Taylor-Common Battery LY was dissolved. The guns of Battery LY are presently being maintained at the Battalion C.P.

(2) During March the Battalion was advised by DSO 148-69 that as of 25 February 1969, Battery V was chopped to the 3rd Marine Division.

(3) Battery K is currently located on Hill 52 in support of Operation Oklahoma Hills. They are providing technical fire direction for the four guns that 1st ALVT's has at the same position. 1st ALVT's is Reinforcing 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines on Operation Oklahoma Hills.

(4) Surveillance from significant missions yielded 23 enemy KIA, 28 secondary explosions, 36 structures destroyed, 14 bunkers destroyed, 1 observation post destroyed, and 1 sampan sunk. 2297 missions were fired throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOB. A total of 13,597 rounds were expended.

i. Training.

(1) Lesson plans for Drug Abuse and Heat Casualty lectures were developed during the month for presentation early in April.

(2) The Battalion Quarterly Training Bulletin was published during March. The bulletin included, this month, a detailed listing of references for MOS training. This should assist the Battery commanders in organizing their training programs.

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j. Logistics, Equipment and Supply.

(1) During this period the deadline rate for M109 Howitzers remained at a very low level. Power rammer failure was the greatest cause of deadlining. No M109's were deadlined at the end of the month.

(2) One TD-18 which was returned inoperative from an operation at Liberty Bridge was the only TD-18 on deadline at the end of the month. The battalion had two TD-15's which were in excess of allowance. They were invoiced to 1st Engineers. Arrangements were made with FLSG-A to return their BIMCO tractor we were using as soon as transportation is available.

(3) Four motor transport vehicles are presently deadlined for a rate of 4%. Of these four, three are deadlined at 3rd echelon facilities. One M54A2C and two M37B1's were received under the R&E program.

(4) Requisitions submitted since this Battalion has been in the Republic of Vietnam, total 28,138. Of this number 26,268 have been filled.
