Operation Oklahoma Hills continued during the month. Battery X continues General Support/Reinforcing, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines from Hill 52. The administrative and support elements of Battery X remain on Hill 65.

On the 1st an M35 truck from headquarters battery detonated a mine on the road to Hill 52. Incident resulted in 2 KIA and 1 MIA.

On the 27th ASF#1 exploded. The battalion C.P. received blast and shrapnel damage to outside structures. Most of the damage has been repaired, however, assistance will be required to rebuild two sea huts that were destroyed by concussion and two butler buildings that sustained extensive blast damage.

On the 29th Major General Simpson visited the battalion to survey the damage caused by ASF#1 exploding.

g. Intelligence. During the month of April 1969, the S-2 made three trips to the village of Phu Hoa for intelligence gathering purposes. Ten liaison trips were made to Division G-2 and Regimental S-2. One trip was made to a rocket site.

(1) 2400 VN was expended for the purchase of three 155mm rounds and small arms ammunition.

h. Organization and Operations.

(1) Units in the battalion participated in Operation Oklahoma Hills during the month. Battery K is still located on Hill 52 in support of this operation, however, the four guns from 1st ALVN's have displaced, relieving Battery K of the responsibility of providing them with technical fire direction.

(2) The eight 155mm howitzer (towed) that were located at the battalion C.P. have been displaced to Battery H and Battery L for maintenance purposes. Four guns went to each battery.

(3) Surveillance from significant missions yielded 27 enemy MIA, 11 secondary explosions, 5 structures destroyed, 15 bunkers destroyed and 1 .50 caliber machine gun destroyed. 1594 missions were fired throughout the 1st Marine Division TACR. A total of 11,691 rounds were expended.

i. Training. Normal GMS and MCS training was conducted during the month with the exception of Battery K who, due to the Battery being split between two positions, conducted only the required weapons safety training.

j. Logistics, Equipment and Supply.

(1) During this period the deadline rate for M109 Howitzers remained at a low level. One M109 was deadlined at the end of the month awaiting repair by 1stFSR. A "Float Gun" was not available.

(2) The M109 tractor which had been on temporary loan from FFSR-A was returned to that organization. Two TD-18's were drawn from the maintenance float to replace deadlined equipment, giving the Battalion six operational TD-18's.

(3) Twelve motor transport vehicles are presently deadlined for a rate of 11%. Of these twelve, ten are deadlined at 3rd echelon facilities. The Battalion received (3) M151's, (2) M35's, (3) M101's and (2) M105's from 1stFAG assets.

(4) Requisitions submitted since this Battalion has been in the Republic of Vietnam, total 28,273. Of this number 26,545 have been filled.
