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PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Operation Oklahoma Hills ended and Operation Pipestone Canyon commenced during the month. Battery K returned to General Support, 1st Marine Division on 17 May 1969 and Battery L assumed a mission of reinforcing 1st Battalion, 11th Marines on 31 May 1969.

On 2 May in accordance with SSDC FragO 1-69, 4th Battalion assumed responsibility for coordinating the defense effort on Hill 34 relieving 7th Communication Battalion.

On 11 May the 4th Battalion received a letter of Appreciation from General J. A. FEELEY Jr., Commanding General, Force Logistics Command, for assistance rendered to FLC personnel when ASP #1 exploded.

On 30 May, 4th Battalion assumed operational control of the 3rd Section, 1st Platoon, 1st Armored Amph Company (2 ALVPH's) located at OP Hawk. OP Hawk has been reassigned to the Southern OP system for counter rocket purposes.

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g. Intelligence.

(1) During the month of May the S-2 made eight trips to inspect OP Tiger and three trips to OP's Hawk and Panther. The S-2 also made three liaison visits to Division G-2 and eleven visits to 11th Marines S-2.

(2) No SVN was expended during the month.

h. Organization and Operations.

(1) Units in the battalion participated in Operation Oklahoma Hills and Operation Pipestone Canyon. Battery K displaced from Hill 52 to Hill 65 on 9 May 69, mission remained General Support/Reinforcing 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines. Battery L assigned mission of Reinforcing 1st Battalion, 11th Marines in support of Operation Pipestone Canyon effective 31 May 1969.

(2) The eight 155mm Howitzers (TD) were turned in to FSR for repair. Four have since been returned and two each are presently located at Batteries L and M.

(3) Surveillance from significant missions yielded 52 enemy KIA, 10 structures destroyed, 3 structures damaged, and 13 secondary explosions. 1137 missions were fired throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR. A total of 10,335 rounds were expended.

i. Training. Normal GMS and MOS training was conducted during the month as operational commitment allowed.

j. Logistics, Equipment and Supply.

(1) During this period the deadline rate for M109 Howitzers remained at a low level due to the outstanding performance of maintenance crews. At the end of the month (0) M109 Howitzers were deadlined.

(2) Thirteen motor transport vehicles are presently deadlined for a rate of 12.5%. Of these thirteen, seven are deadlined at 3rd echelon facilities.

(3) Requisitions submitted since this Battalion has been in the Republic of Vietnam, total 28,501. Of this number 26,912 have been filled.
