NARRATIVE SUMMARY

010001 - 302400 November 1967

The 12th Marines (-)(Rein), consisting of its organic battalions (less units attached to Special Landing Forces), two provisional 155 Howitzer batteries, the Composite Artillery Battalion, 1st Field Artillery Group, 1st 8" Howitzer Battery (SP)(Rein), FMF, 1st 155 Gun Battery (SP), FMF, 3rd Platoon, 1st Armored Amphibian Company (LVTH-6), 1st Battalion (-), 11th Marines, "A" Battery, 2nd Battalion, 12th Marines (SLF "A"), 4.2" Mortar Battery, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines (SLF "A"), the 108th Artillery Group (USA), 1st Battalion, 40th Artillery (USA), 2nd Battalion, 94th Artillery (USA), 8th Battalion, 4th Artillery (USA), exercised tactical fire direction, provided fire support coordination and fire planning throughout Quang Tri and Thau Thien provinces of the Northern I Corps area.

The 108th Artillery Group (USA) provides logistics and administrative support for designated U. S. Army units within the northern ICTZ and will provide tactical control of designated U. S. Army units on 010001H December 1967. The integration of Battery "C", 2d Target Acquisition Battery with the 12th Marines provides a target acquisition capability that has not existed in the Marine Corps since Korea. The establishment of flash and sound bases by "C" Battery 2d TAB at CON THIEN and GIO LINH, coupled with the additional target acquisition radars, AN/MPQ-10's, AN/MPQ-4, received during November from both Army and Marine sources has increased tremendously this Regiment's capability to perform its counterbattery/mortar mission. A Counterbattery Intelligence Center, manned jointly by Marine and Army personnel has been established, contiguous with the Regimental FDC, in order to fully exploit the increased target acquisition capability acquired during November. Response time in the engagement of active artillery targets, acquired by flash and sound station and by radar, has thus been reduced and as procedures for processing target information is refined. A further reduction in response time is anticipated. The Regiment now possesses the capability to engage artillery/mortar targets with a relatively high assurance of achieving neutralization of the target.

The Regiment supported 3d Marine Division elements in Operations KENTUCKY, LANCaster, SCOTLAND, NEOSHO, NAPOLEON, HIGHRISE, COVE, OSCEOLA, BALLISTIC ARCH, and supported the

1st ARVN Division with direct support and reinforcing fires. The Regiment also supported the 1st Marine Regiment (OPCON 3d MarDiv) in Operation OSCEOLA.

Operation HIGHRISE was conducted concurrently with operations as listed above. Units participating in HIGHRISE were Composite Artillery Battalion, 2d Battalion, 94th Artillery and 8th Battalion, 4th Artillery, 1st 8" Howitzer Battery including their reinforcement of a platoon of the 5th 155 Gun Battery, units of 2d Battalion, 12th Marines and 90mm tanks from 3d Tank Battalion attached to Composite Artillery Battalion.

Additional supporting fires for Operations HIGHRISE, KENTUCKY, and NAPOLEON were furnished by Naval Gunfire Support ships. (See NGF list below.)

B. INTELLIGENCE

(1) Enemy Action. During November the enemy has continued to maintain pressure on forces in the DMZ area. There was a decrease in actual enemy contact, and in the number of artillery rounds fired at outposts and Combat Bases in the Northern Quang Tri Province. The enemy pressure was characterized by sporadic artillery, mortar, and rocket attacks. There was a definite lack of intelligence information concerning enemy movement during the month of November.

(2) Counterbattery. There was no change in the counterbattery policy of the Regiment. Operation ~~HEADHUNTER~~ took place during the period. Aerial photography was used for pre and post strike analyses.

(3) Target Acquisition. During November the target acquisition capability of the Regiment was increased by four U.S.A. AN/MQ-4A. At the present time the Regiment has two sound bases, (Gio Linh-Con Thien), five AN/MQ-10A's, Camp Carroll, Con Thien, C-2, Gio Linh, Dong Ha, and seven AN/MQ-4A's. Additionally the Target Acquisition Battery has assumed responsibility for manning five flash observation posts.

(4) Observation. Air Observers continued their mission of artillery spot throughout the 3d Marine Division TAOR. Flight time has been cut due to the rainy season and overcast clouds. The average number of AO's in flight status remained at eleven including three U.S.A. The number of hours flown by Regimental AO's is 238.0.

(5) Personnel. There has been no improvement of the status of intelligence personnel during this period.

(6) Weather. November was characterized by scattered rain showers and overcast clouds. Cloudiness and precipitation increased over the month of October. Precipitation for November was 9.19 inches. The high temperature was 90°, low of 64, with an average of 76. November was characterized by early morning showers and cloudiness usually clearing in the afternoons.

(7) Miscellaneous. From Con Thien Regiment received a complete 120MM mortar round and a Chicom 105 round which penetrated a 4.2 mortar base plate and failed to explode.

B. LOGISTICS

(1) A command interest letter submitted to CG 3d Mar Div concerning the general lack of supply admin clerks, and motor transport mechanics. The Regimental average for all three fields approximating 74%.

PART III, SECTION 6. CIVIL AFFAIRS

1. MEDCAP. The MEDCAP program has continued to show an increase of treatments during the month of November. A total of 732 people were treated, which is an increase of 201 over the previous months total.
2. CIVIC ACTION PROGRAM. 12th Marines had a very active month. Through PGM-11, 300 pounds of clothing and 100 bars of soap were made available. These items were given to the Catholic Orphanage in Dong Ha. Several homes in Dong Ha were damaged during the early part of the month. Aid in reconstructing these homes was furnished. A second visit showed that the damage was almost completely repaired. A message from this office to the distribution list was sent out concerning the Vietnamese celebrations of Christmas and Tet. Much interest had been indicated previously, and a good response is hoped for. On Thanksgiving Day, a coordinated project was held with 1st Battalion, 40th Artillery (USA). 50 Vietnamese youngsters were treated to dinner at the two 1st Battalion, 40th Artillery (USA) mess halls, with the necessary coordination provided through 12th Marines.
3. WELFARE. The construction of the public head in Dong Ha Village continued as the main project for the month. Construction is now 75% complete. Acquisition of cement continues as the major holdup. The necessary requisition has been placed, and a re-supply is expected shortly.
