

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

010001 - 312400 December 1968

The 12th Marines (-)(Rein), consisting of its organic battalions (less units attached to Special Landing Forces), two provisional 155 Howitzer batteries, the Composite Artillery Battalion, 1st Field Artillery Group, 1st 8" Howitzer Battery (SP)(Rein), FMF, 1st Searchlight Battery, 1st 155 Gun Battery (SP), FMF, 3rd Platoon, 1st Armored Amphibian Company (LVTH-6), 1st Battalion (-), 11th Marines, the 108th Artillery Group (USA), 1st Battalion, 40th Artillery (USA), 2nd Battalion, 94th Artillery (USA), 8th Battalion, 4th Artillery (USA), exercised tactical fire direction, provided fire support coordination and fire planning throughout Quang Tri and Thau Thien Provinces of the Northern I CORPS area. During special operations ashore "A" Battery, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines and Mortar Battery, 2nd Battalion, 12th Marines (SLF "A") functioned under the Opcn of the 12th Marines.

The 108th Artillery Group (USA) provides tactical control, logistical and administrative support for all U. S. Army units Opcn to 12th Marines, Battery "C", 2nd Target Acquisition Battalion, 26th Artillery continued to supply accurate locations of active enemy gun positions. The accuracy of targets located by Battery "C", 2nd Target Acquisition Battalion has checked favorably with reliable intelligence sources to include captured documents and trig lists, special agent reports, imagery interpretation, prisoner of war interrogations and air observation. All radar, sound and flash ranging bases started in November have been completed. An intergrated Counter Battery Intelligence Center, staffed by Marine and Army personnel, continued to prove invaluable in assisting in the neutralization and destruction of enemy artillery/mortars.

The Regiment supported 3d Marine Divsion elements in Operations HIGHRISE, KENTUCKY, LANCASTER, SCOTLAND, NEOSHO, NAPOLEON, and supported the 1st ARVN Division with direct support, reinforcing fires as requested and reinforcing fires for LOM SONG 156. The Regiment also supported the 1st Marine Regiment (OPCON 3dMARDIV) in Operation OSCEOLA.

Operation HIGHRISE was conducted concurrently with operations as listed above. Units participating in HIGHRISE were 108th Field Artillery Group (USA), Composite Artillery Battalion, 1st 8" Howitzer Battery (SP)(Rein), 1st Battalion, 12th Marines, 2nd Battalion, 12th Marines, 90mm Tanks from 3d Tank Battalion, and Twin 40mm from 1st Battalion, 44th Artillery (USA), attached to the Composite Artillery Battalion.

Additional supporting fires for Operations HIGHRISE, KENTUCKY and NAPOLEON were furnished by Naval Gunfire Support Ships. (See NGF List on following page).

B. INTELLIGENCE

(1) Enemy Action. The enemy pressure in the DMZ area decreased considerably during December. There was a significant decrease in incoming rounds at all combat posts in the DMZ area except A-3. Ground contact was also decreased. There was a definite lack of information concerning enemy movement, and operations. Two different sets of enemy survey notes were captured. The notes provided valuable information concerning enemy NVA survey control points and battery locations in the DMZ area. Many of these locations confirmed intelligence reports and sound, flash, or radar plots. A complete analysis of these notes was made by the regimental survey section. The results were reported to higher echelon by messages 221123Z and 231350Z December 1967.

(2) Counterbattery. Counterbattery policy remains active. Information is evaluated in the Counterbattery Information Center (CBIC) co-located with the Fire Direction Center (FDC). Locations obtained are analyzed, plot accuracy is determined and results transmitted directly to the FDC. All information is forwarded to the Target Information Center in the Fire Support Coordination Center (FSCC).

The existing CBIC, unique in the history of the Marine Corps, is made possible by combining assets of a Target Acquisition Battery (TAB) and elements of an Artillery Intelligence Section provided by the United States Army. The CBIC contains two flash ranging direction centers and a TAB processing section. Hostile locations identified by means of flash observation posts and sound ranging direction centers, located at Con Thien and Gio Linh, and as augmented by counterbattery radars previously reported, are processed and accuracy of the plot established by the processing section. Information obtained is passed to the Counterbattery Information Officer for immediate comparison with current data, and then passed directly to the FDC for counterfire action. Concurrently with counterfire action information is recorded and plotted for future reference. TAB 1 depicts a flow chart for counterbattery information.

The CBIC is responsible for counterbattery intelligence and maintains permanent records on information received from all sources, i.e., prisoners of war, captured documents, special intelligence, agent reports, infrared, aerial photograph and those previously mentioned. All information is analyzed and compared

to produce current intelligence. Since its inception during November, 1967, results have been significant-sixty-five counterbattery intelligence targets were generated during the reporting period, and reduction in hostile artillery fire during the reporting period must, to some degree, be attributed to the effectiveness of the system. Target Acquisition resources provided 85 radar ranging plots, 55 sound ranging plots and 52 flash ranging plots on hostile artillery or mortar locations.

(3) Target Acquisition.

(a) During December a Sound Locating AN/TNS-3 was tested at Con Thien. The set originally designed to locate small arms and recoilless rifles was found to be extremely sensitive. All sounds, including vehicle, aircraft, wind, and outgoing mortar and artillery fire prevented the set from performing satisfactorily. A formal report will be submitted to III MAF via 3dMarDiv in the immediate future. The second TAB Radar Set AN/MPQ-10A was moved temporarily to C-1 (YD 212675). In the immediate future this set will be displaced to A-2 (Gio Linh). Planned replacement of this set at C-1 contemplated by movement of the MPQ-10 presently located at Camp CANROLL. Detachment 238, equipped with the Radar Set AN/MPQ-4A was relocated from Dong Ha to C-1. In addition Detachment 240 equipped with the AN/MPQ-4A Radar was positioned at Quang Tri.

(b) Advanced parties for two new Target Acquisition means, the VITALS (Visual Airborne Target Locating System) and the Omnidirectional Sound location Set AN/TNS-9 arrived. Environmental testing of this equipment is to be conducted during the next ninety (90) days. The 108th Field Artillery Group (USA) has been designated to conduct the testing.

(4) Observation. Aerial Observation during December increased significantly due to the unseasonable good weather and improved availability of aircraft. Total hours flown was 306.2. Total number of artillery spot missions conducted was 137. An average of eight (8) air observers were in a flight status during this period including three (3) USA AOs.

(5) Personnel. There is a continued requirement for renewed emphasis in providing intelligence personnel to the Regiment. Recapitulation of personnel status within the Regiment is as follows.

(6) Weather. Cloudiness and precipitation increased over the month of December, however most of this took place during the first part of the month. The rainfall for December was 16.27 inches. There was a high temperature of 78 and a low of 57 with an approximate average of 70.

(7) Miscellaneous

(a) The Regiment was given Operational Control of the Detachment, Combined Material Exploitation Center. This included one officer and two NCO's. These individuals will assist in the collection, analysis and identification of enemy ordnance in the 3d MarDiv Area.

(b) The Director, Combined Intelligence Center, Vietnam, Colonel PONDER made a visit to the Headquarters. The purpose of his visit was to meet with the Commanding Officer and S-2. He explained the functions of his center and services his organization could provide to the intelligence effort in the DMZ area. Lieutenant Colonel SUTTON, Combined Material Exploitation Center who accompanied the Director, narrated a movie produced by his center. This movie depicted the effects of the Soviet RP6-2 and RP6-7 against sand bagged emplacements, with and without reinforcement; additionally the effects with stand off material (PPS Airfield Matting, Chain link fences). Conclusions of the tests were that the RP6-2 and RP6-7 will penetrate eight rows of sand bags reinforced with 2"x6" wood. Further that the chain link fence will materially reduce the effectiveness of both rounds.

A. NEW EQUIPMENT. None.

B. LOGISTICS

(1) Routine requests for modification to the Table of Equipment and for special allowances were submitted to CMC through appropriate command channels.

(2) A command interest letter was submitted to the Commanding General, 3d Marine Division concerning the failure of reset counters of the Panoramic Telescope M117 of the M109 Howitzer. Float sights were obtained alleviating the grievous situation in which five howitzers of k/4/12 were deadlined on 2 December 1967 due to problems with the sight.

(3) A request was submitted to the Commanding General, 3d Marine Division for the assistance of a calibration team for all the weapons of the Regiment including U. S. Army Artillery.

(4) Detailed ammunition stockage objectives for all artillery ammunitions, based upon current density and available supply notes, were submitted to FLSU-1 to eliminate daily "ordering".

(5) Daily expenditure rates were developed for each battery to ensure against over expenditure of directed supply and at the same time permit the issue of 105mm ammunition to U. S. Army batteries whose AM is 36 rd/tube/day as compared to 61.9 rd/tube/day for USMC batteries.

(6) Initial steps were taken to process the last two M55 eight inch howitzers for retrograde. The two howitzers were authorized to provide hull defilade protection to gun crews at Gio Linh. Availability of the C-1 site eliminated this requirement during the reporting period.

(7) A two hundred man working party under the control of the 12th Marines was furnished for the final site construction work at C-1. Logistic support for the detail was provided by 12th Marines and Sub Unit #2.

(8) A tropical hut for use as a classified files office and post office was constructed through self help with materials made available by the Base Facilities Coordinator.

(9) Excess end items and repair parts held by the Regimental Headquarters Battery were offered to the other commands of the Regiment for redistribution. The excesses were generated through changes to allowances and changes to previously experienced expenditure rates.

~~SECRET~~PART III, SECTION 5, COMMUNICATIONS

A. GENERAL. The communications posture has experienced one major and a number of minor changes during this reporting period. There were some major outages experienced affecting the teletype communication to Third Marine Division. Causes of this excessive down time have hopefully been eliminated by close liaison with the Wire Officer of Communication Support Company, 7th Communications Battalion, and the Signal Officer, 37th Signal Company. Teletype lines connecting machines to Radio Relay TRC-66 were improved, thereby eliminating poor reception of teletype copy received by the Twelfth Marines.

B. RADIO. All radio facilities operated in Division FSCC at Dong Ha are now remote from the Radio Central adjacent to the Twelfth Marines Communication Center. The relocation of these facilities relieved two radio operators for duty elsewhere.

C. WIRE. External wire lines handling teletype traffic to the Third Marine Division remain the responsibility of Communications Support Company, 7th Communications Battalion, however new trouble shooting agreements facilitate speedier repairs.

D. RADIO RELAY. The TRC-27 link to Gio Linh has maintained a high degree of effective operation, 93.8% for the month of December.

E. COMMUNICATION CENTER.

1. MEDCAP. The MEDCAP program for the month of December resulted in a total of 741 treatments. On 12 December 1967, the MEDCAP team was just setting up in the Dong Ha Village dispensary when an enemy artillery round impacted near one of the schools. HM2 RICE ~~went~~ to the schoolyard and began helping the wounded. One woman and twenty-three children were injured, and 5 of the children died from their wounds.

2. CIVIC ACTION PROGRAM - During December, contact was made with MCB-5 on establishment of a civic action program for them in the Ha Thanh Refugee Camp. The Sea-Bees will begin active work as soon as they are sufficiently organized in their new area.

Condolence calls were made to those families in Dong Ha Village who had sons or daughters injured or killed during the artillery attack on 12 December 1967. Aid, in the form of 105mm ammunition boxes was also given to those families whose homes ~~had~~ been damaged. Property damage was very light, and the homes were quickly repaired.

Coordination was facilitated through this office between 1/40 Arty and the Catholic Orphanage in Dong Ha Village for a small Christmas party for the orphans. This party was held on the 24th, and 1/40 distributed a few small gifts to the orphans. The clothing that had been donated from 12th Marines was also distributed at this time.

3. KEY PROJECT. The key project for the month of December continued to be the public head in Dong Ha Village. Construction was once again held down to almost nothing due to the failure of the needed supplies to arrive. The necessary requisitions had been submitted two month ago, but they have been held up in the GVN structure. A command interest letter has been submitted, and several visits have been made by this office to Quang Tri, but the results have been negative. Attempts are now being made through Division to acquire the necessary supplies.


