(1) Designation/Location: 2d Battalion, 12th Marines, 3d Marine Division (Rein), FMF, Da Nang Sector, South Viet Nam


(a) Battery F, 2d Battalion, 12th Marines remains detached OPCON to 3d Battalion, 9th Marines for extended operations in the AN HOA area.

(b) Mortar Battery, 2d Battalion, 12th Marines remains detached.

b. Sequential listing of significant events especially as they relate to:

(1) Personnel. The battalion was at 83% T/O strength at the end of the reporting period. This percentage does not reflect on unit combat readiness and the battalion is still fully capable of accomplishing its mission. However, shortages in the OF 35, OF 25, and MOS 0811 will become critical with the rotation of personnel during the succeeding weeks. There were nine combat casualties during July, four KIA and five WIA, and three noncombat casualties. Thirty-two personnel participated in the R&R program during the month of July.

(2) Administration: None

(3) Intelligence: The present location of the battalion CP makes it necessary to carry out extensive small unit patrols. Tunnels and caves have been destroyed within the command post area. Punji traps and firing stakes have also been uncovered. Enemy activity within the area has been light and actual enemy contact has not been experienced by patrols. On 19 July and on 20 July a Headquarters Battery patrol apprehended one VCS, both for a lack of proper identification. Five incidents of hostile small arms fire were experienced by the battalion with no casualties or damage sustained. On 20 July two Marines from Battery E were killed by automatic weapons fire from apparently five VC when they jeopardized their safety by moving into a hostile area alone.

(4) Training. Training continues to be initiated in conjunction with operational commitments. Small unit patrols provide an excellent means to gain proficiency in current tactical trends.

(5) Operations. On 6 July Operation MACON commenced within the boundaries of the Operation GEORGLA area. Battery E displaced to (AT 967584) Btry A, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines displaced to (BT 067581), one platoon from Battery L, 4th Battalion, 12th Marines displaced to (AT 965618) and a composite battery of two 155mm Gun SP M53 and two 8 inch Howitzers SP M55 displaced to (AT 986645). Battery D (AT 965618) and Battery F (AT 875473) maintained their original firing positions in support of the operation. Thirty-two artillery pieces were prepared to support Operation MACON. The 2d Battalion Command Post and operations section established operational control at Battery D's position on 060945 July. Artillery support during the operation continued through 141430 July. Extracts from the S-3 Journal, enclosure (2), indicate significant missions fired during the operation. 8,758 rounds were expended in support of Operation MACON and enemy casualties reported were 40 KIA (conf), 30 KIA (poss) and 25 WIA. The battalion fired a total of 529 observed missions, 16 unobserved missions, and 1,538 H&I missions in support of the 9th Marines during July, expending 14,378 rounds of 105mm ammunition and 169 rounds of 155mm ammunition. Other enemy casualties reported other than those inflicted during Operation MACON were 7 KIA (conf) and 35 KIA (poss).


(6) Command and Control. The command post location and mission of the 2d Battalion, 12th Marines remains the same.

(7) Communications/Electronics. The battalion communication section received two KW-7's on 11 July for use with teletype equipment and during the period from 18-21 July, the battalion received eight MRC 109s and two MRC 110s. The MRC 109s and MRC 110s remain on administrative deadline in accordance with division orders and are being held at battalion.


(8) Logistics. Logistics posture for this command is satisfactory. The overall motor transport deadline rate currently averages 16-18%. The deadline rate for M-35 trucks, however is currently 30%, due primarily to lack of 2d and 3d echelon repair parts. The overall deadline rate is attributed to a shortage of trained personnel and repair parts shortages. Except as noted, second echelon motor transport and communications maintenance continues to be completed in a reasonable time despite shortages of certain repair parts.

(9) Civic Action.

a. The battalion distributed 50 school kits to HA DONG school. 400 lbs of clothing, 1200 bars of soap, and 800 lbs of miscellaneous medical supplies were given to the Da Nang Civilian Hospital. Medical personnel treated 87 civilians during July.


b. The battalion chaplain conducted 41 services, made 61 visits to batteries and made 139 hospital calls during July.
