PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During February the Second Battalion, 12th Marines fired a total of 1,609 observed missions, 1,877 unobserved missions, and 2,646 H&I missions in support of the 9th Marines. Ammunition expenditures were 36,146 rounds of 105mm, 4,758 rounds of 155mm, and 4,592 rounds of 107mm.

Enemy casualties inflicted during February were 121 KIA and 70 WIA. In addition there were 48 secondary explosions and 11 bunkers, 2 rocket launchers, and 1 recoilless rifle destroyed.

On 19 February 1968 the first live mission using the new firecracker munition was fired resulting in 4 KIA. During the month of February a total of 29 105mm firecracker and 34 155 firecracker munitions were fired at an estimated total of 100-120 troops in the open resulting in 30 KIA and 9 WIA.

On 2 February 1968 W-3-12 chopped OPCON to 1st Battalion, 12th Marines and was helilifted from A-3 to Camp Carroll. First Platoon, 1st Armored Amphibian Company and Detachment, W-1-12 chopped OPCON to 12th Marines on 8 February 1968.

1. Combat Missions Assigned. Direct support of 9th Marines
2. Significant Operations Conducted. Operations Kentucky, Highrise and Napoleon
3. Casualties Inflicted on the Enemy. 121 KIA and 70 WIA
4. Casualties Sustained. 27 WIA, 1 MIA.
5. Logistics. Logistical support was furnished for four organic batteries. Class V resupply and ordnance repair services were furnished to two OPCON battery. Approximately 49,496 rounds of artillery ammunition were moved by truck convoy and helicopter this month. Motor transport repair parts and ordnance cleaning materials are in very short supply. A new 500 man messhall is under construction. A grease rack has been added to the motor pool.
6. Civic Action. The battalion assisted in the relocation of refugees from north of the Cam Lo River. Trucks began moving household effects into Thiet Trang Hamlet. General purpose tents were provided as temporary shelter.
7. Personnel. The battalion was 86% T/O strength at the end of the reporting period. Shortages exist in the following MOS's 0122, 0239, 0441, and 0848. Forty Marines participated in the R&R program during February.

8. Intelligence. Enemy activity during the month of February has increased over January. Major ground contact was made by 3/3 in the vicinity of Alpha 3. A large scale attack was made on the Cam Lo District Headquarters by an NVA force up to four battalions. The attack on Cam Lo was part of the Tet Offensive. The enemy has continued his attacks on convoys and mining of routes of supply. During the past month traffic on the Cua Viet River has come under attack. In March, increased interdiction of supply routes can be expected. Enemy artillery attacks during February have increased in volume and frequency throughout the entire month. Con Thien has received as many as 220 rounds of various calibers in one day. C-2 has come under rocket and artillery attacks. A-3 and Dong Ha Combat Base have also received enemy artillery attacks. The enemy has massed fires on three occasions on Con Thien, Cam Lo District Headquarters and Dong Ha Combat Base. With the present level of activity it appears that the month of March will continue to have enemy activity at least at the present level. The enemy will retain the ability to launch large artillery or ground attacks or both.

9. Communication. A Battalion Command Net was activated using AN/PRC 47's and ANMRC-83. The purpose of the net is to pass routine administrative traffic and to train personnel in the employment, operation, and maintenance of the medium and long range radio equipment.

10. Training. During February the battalion utilized two contact teams. Forty-seven men were trained on the use of the M-72 LAW by the Division Contact Team. A 3rd Engineer Contact Team instructed forty-one men in booby traps and field expedient mines. All firing battery personnel and FDC personnel were trained in the employment of the new selected munitions which were fired for the first time in February with excellent results. All of the battalion's engineer personnel are being trained by the maintenance section of the G/S Battalion of this regiment in the maintenance and record keeping for the following equipment: tractors, generators, reefers, and water pumps. Three of the organic batteries have run gas mask drills during actual firing for a period of at least one half hour. Two of the organic batteries have performed direct fire training with each battery fired over 50 rounds including beehive ammunition and anti-tank ammunition. Formal schools attended by members of this battalion were: communication security, basic organic supply, and Vietnamese language school.
