PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During March the Second Battalion, 12th Marines fired a total of 1,233 observed missions, 2,101 unobserved missions, and 3,664 H&I missions in support of the 9th Marines. Ammunition expenditures were 27,731 rounds of 105mm, 5,418 rounds of 155mm, and 4,038 rounds of 107mm.

Enemy casualties inflicted during March were 114 KIA and 211 WIA. In addition there were 12 secondary explosions and 21 bunkers and 2 automatic weapons destroyed.

On 28 March 1968, H/3/12 was chopped OPCON to 1st Battalion, 40th Artillery. On 28 March 1968, W/1/12 joined OPCON and was helilifted to A-3 from Camp Carroll.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Combat Missions Assigned. Direct support of 9th Marines
2. Significant Operations Conducted. Operations Kentucky and Highrise
3. Casualties Inflicted on the Enemy. 114 KIA and 211 WIA
4. Casualties Sustained. 21 WIA and 1 DOW
5. Logistics. Logistic support was furnished to four organic firing batteries. Class V resupply and ordnance repair services were furnished to two OPCON batteries. A total of 37,187 rounds of artillery ammunition was moved by truck convoy and helicopter this month. The present vehicle deadline rate is 44%. The primary cause for deadline is the lack of required repair parts. Ordnance cleaning materials are in critically short supply. The 500 man messhall was completed and the installation of collateral equipment commenced. Power required to operate the messhall equipment is not yet available.
6. Civic Action. During March 2d Battalion, 12th Marines continued to assist in the relocation of refugees from north of the Cam Lo River. A total of 44 truck loads of household effects and 341 people were moved from Troung Xa Hamlet to Thiet Trang Hamlet. Approximately 10 acres of land were cleared and plowed for farming using a bulldozer and a plow provided by 11th Engineers. Refugees were presented 750 pounds of clothing donated by church groups in the United States. Battalion medical personnel treated 149 Vietnamese at MEDCAPS. Finally, the two room school house in Thiet Trang was opened on 25 March. A GVN teacher is teaching 48 first and second graders. SSgt. Sau, the interpreter assigned to this battalion, is teaching 15 third and fourth graders. School kits and miscellaneous school supplies have been distributed to the students.

7. Personnel. The battalion was 86% T/O strength at the end of the reporting period. Shortages exist in MOS's 0122, 0239 and 0848. Thirty-eight Marines participated in R&R program during March.

8. Intelligence. Major ground contacts were made by elements of 3/3 in vicinity of A-3 and Gio Linh on 3 March and again on 6 March resulting in 132 and 96 enemy KIA respectively. The enemy forces involved were believed to be elements of the 48th Regiment, 320th NVA Division. The enemy continues his attempts to interdict lines of supply and communication with emphasis on the river traffic between Cua Viet and Dong Ha. The MSR traffic on Routes 1, 9 and 561 have had sporadic mining and sniper fire incidents. The mining attempts have included mines ranging in size up to a booby-trapped 500 pound bomb. Enemy incoming has remained at approximately the February level with more frequent use of rockets. Enemy forces appear to have massed in the Quang Tri area south and east of Dong Ha, but the enemy still retains the capability to conduct diversionary ground attacks on all bases within the 9th Marines AO. There have been several indications of enemy armor units north of Con Thien and Gio Linh and also sightings of tracked vehicles west of C-2 and south of Cam Lo. With the upcoming dry weather there is an increasing possibility of the use of armor in coordination with ground and artillery attacks.

9. Communication. During the month of March, the wire section fabricated and buried ^{new} 25 pair slash wire cable running to 12th Marines Regiment and into the 3d Marine Division wire system. The number of frames within the battalion CP was reduced and new cables were made and rerouted. These improvements will reduce the vulnerability of the wire system to damage during artillery and rocket attacks. The radio section initiated an intensified training program for the 7 new radio operators that reported during March. All new 2531's and 2533's are now held in Headquarters Battery for training. The major subjects covered are radio procedure, artillery procedure, KY-8 operation, and operation and maintenance of the AN/MRC-83, AN/PRC-47 and AN/PRC-41.

10. Training. During March emphasis was placed on individual and section technical training. Service of the piece drill was conducted regularly in each battery to reemphasize the importance of correct procedures. Each 105mm howitzer section has now conducted direct fire training to increase readiness to respond to either enemy armor or close-in personnel threats. A new program of formal technical training classes is being conducted in the battalion CP area covering personnel administration, fire direction procedures and techniques, survey and meteorological techniques, communication, motor transport operations and maintenance, and supply. These classes are designed to increase the technical proficiency of headquarters battery personnel as well as personnel from the firing battery rear areas. Individual technical training records are being maintained to monitor the progress of this program. Formal schools for Basic Ammunition Technician and Basic Supply were completed by two men from this battalion during the month. In addition the Career Advisor attend Career Advisory School in Okinawa.
