## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During May the Second Battalion, Twelfth Marines fired a total of 1,910 observed missions, 3,646 unobserved missions, and 2,781 H&I missions in support of the Ninth Marines. Ammunition expenditures were 72,972 rounds of 105mm, 8,842 rounds of 155mm, and 9,303 rounds of 107mm.

Enemy casualties inflicted during May were 326 KIA and 220 WIA. In addition there were 27 secondary explosions, 8 fires were started, 47 bunkers destroyed, 12 bunkers damaged, 2 mortar positions destroyed, 1 boat destroyed, 17 fighting holes destroyed, 1 village burned, 1 village damaged, 2 houses destroyed, 1 house damaged, 1 foot bridge destroyed, 2 artillery pieces damaged, and 75 meters of trench line destroyed.

On 22 May, Battery "H" 3d Battalion, 12th Marines was joined OPCON and displaced from Dong Ha to Cl. Battery "H" 3d Battalion, 12th Marines was chopped OPCON to 3d Battalion, 12th Marines on 26 May 1968.

On 27 May, Battery "B" 1st Battalion, 13th Marines joined OPCON and displaced from Quang Tri to Dong Ha.

## PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Combat Missions Assigned. Direct support of 9th Marines
2. Significant Operations Conducted. Operations Kentucky and Highrise. As part of Operation Kentucky, 9th Marines conducted 4 major multi-battalion sweep operations in widespread areas of their assigned AO. Each operation was directed toward establishing a cordon around the enemy force followed by intensive neutralization and preparation fire into the cordoned area. The concept proved thoroughly effective and resulted in the highest number of enemy kills achieved during Operation Kentucky.
3. Casualties Inflicted on the Enemy. 326 KIA and 220 WIA.
4. Casualties Sustained. 7 WIA (Enlisted)
5. Logistics. Complete logistic support was furnished for four organic batteries. Class V resupply and ordnance repair were furnished to two OPCON batteries. A total of 91,117 rounds of artillery ammunition were moved by truck convoy and helicopter this month. Motor transport deadline : remains high at 35.8%. The primary cause is very slow return of vehicles from external repair facilities. Ordnance cleaning materials remain in critically short supply. A new P.X. branch store was opened within our perimeter.

6. Civic Action. One well was completed in Thiet Trang Phuoc and a second one is now under construction. The battalion continued to support the local schools in Thiet Trang and Vinh Dai with the donation of maps, notebooks, papers, pencils, and crayons to the students. A total of 453 Vietnamese civilians were treated at the regularly scheduled MEDCAPS in Vinh Dai.

7. Personnel. The battalion was 85% T/O strength at the end of the reporting period. Shortages exist in MOS's 0122, 0239, 0811, 0841, 0849. Thirty-eight Marines participated in the R&R program during May.

8. Intelligence. The month of May reflected a marked increase in enemy activity over the month of April. By the end of April the enemy seemed to have overcome his supply and replacement problems of the previous month. In May, May was marked by heavy movement, attacks by fire, numerous ground contacts, and attempts at interdiction of LOC's.

The first week of the month was highlighted by heavy fighting in the Dai Do region. The enemy were believed to be elements of the 48th and 52d regiments of the 320th NVA division. Both large and small ground contacts continued in this area throughout the month. During the last week, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines made contact with a large NVA force resulting in over 200 NVA KIA. This engagement reflects a contrast when compared to tactics observed the previous month during which the enemy avoided large scale contact. Attacks by fire also showed a marked increase. Shelling of Con Thien, C-2, Dong Ha, and A-3 increased significantly over the previous month.

The enemy activity seems to indicate that the second phase of the winter-spring offensive has started. However, due to superiority in numbers of friendly ground forces and supporting arms it has thus far not met with success in this area.

9. Communications. The extensive operations conducted during the month of May placed heavy demands upon the communications system. As many as 14 radio nets were operated at one time from the battalion FDC. A communications inspection team from III MAF visited the battalion. The overall grade received by the communications section was outstanding with noteworthy comments directed toward training and maintenance programs. Second Lieutenant A.S. Kyle reported to the battalion and will assume duties as Communications Officer in June.

10. Training. During the month of May particular emphasis was placed on individual and crew served weapons training. A 3d Marine Division contact team provided a thorough program of instruction on the M-16 and supervised fam firing and zeroing for all batteries. Two hundred and eighty-nine members of Headquarters Battery and the firing battery rears fired for familiarization with the M-16 rifle.

An exchange program was completed between Mortar Battery and Battery "F", in which all cannoneers of Mortar Battery participated in at least 24 hours of familiarization and on the job training with a 105mm howitzer section. In turn, cannoneers from Battery "F" received formal instruction and training with 4.2 inch mortar sections.

The high school GED test was administered to forty members of the Battalion, while seventeen completed the college GED test.

A contact team from the 1st Air Cavalry Division gave instruction to key Battalion staff personnel as well as gun section chiefs and key NCO's from the firing batteries on the planning organization and execution of heliborne artillery operations. Following the instruction, a demonstration was held showing the preparation and lifting of a 105mm howitzer and ammunition by helicopter.

Four battalion personnel attended out-of-country formal schooling consisting of Infantry Weapons Repair School, Non-Commissioned Officer School and Embarkation School. In addition, five battalion personnel attended in-country formal schooling, consisting of Personnel Response School, Supply School, and Multifuel Engine Maintenance School.
