

- 5. <u>logistics</u>. During the month, the battalion continued air operations and resupply. A split logistics section is still in operation. The forward section is still handling the air resupply with the rear section providing class II and administrative support. A total of 35,323 rounds of 105mm, 107mm, and 155mm armunition were moved this month, primarily by air.
- 6. <u>Civil Action</u>. This battelion participated in the mid-autumn festivel by distributing toys to the children of Thie Trang hamlets. A weekly Medcap program was begun in Thie Trang hamlet.
- 7. Personnel. The battalion was at 92% T/O strength at the end of the reporting period. Shortages exist in the MOS's 0141, 0239, 0849, 2111, 2311, 2841, 3041, 3516, and 3531. Forty-nine Marines participated in the R&R program during October.
- 8. <u>Intelligence</u>. Enemy activity continued at the same low level throughout the month of October. Attacks by fire continued to be the harrassing type against bases along the DMZ. Ground action was again limited to small scale probes and interdiction of LOC's.

Operations by friendly forces continued to deny the enemy avenues of approach to major installations. Arms and supply caches uncovered during Operation Trousdale have rendered the 320th NVA Division almost combat inefficient, forcing the division to withdraw to the north for refitting, resupply, and retraining of new personnel.

At the present time the enemy retains his ability to continue his harassing attacks by fire and small ground probes, but it is highly doubtful he has the ability to launch any major offensive.



- 9. Communications. During the month of October the Communications platoon supported the operation of the battalion rear area at Dong Ha and the FDC position at Vandegrift Combat Base. A Regimental Inspection was held on the 8th and 9th at the forward and rear of Headquarters Battery. On the 20th, the firing batteries were inspected by the Communications Chief and were all scheduled for reinspection on 1 November. The forward position at Vandegrift was wired for communications and electric power in a semi-permanent installation. A request for special allowance of 11 additional AN/PRC-25 radio was submitted.
- 10. Training. During the month of October, training was primarily oriented toward section and MOS classes in view of heavy field commitment of all batteries. Normal troop indoctrination classes and GMS training were carried out whenever possible. The battalion utilized the Division M-16 Contact Team for a training program in which all batteries participated. Six battalion personnel attended out-of-country formal schools consisting of Staff Noncommissioned Officer School, Personal Response, Civil Action and Forward Observer School.
