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#### PART II

### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of December 1968, the 2d Battalion, 12th Marines fired 2,607 missions and expended 40,347 rounds in support of the 9th Marine Regiment on Operation "Dawson River Afton" and "Dawson River." 33,194 rounds of 105mm, 5,763 rounds of 155mm, and 1,390 rounds of 107mm were expended.

The majority of firing was designed to neutralize helicopter assault landing zones and to channelize enemy forces believed to be operating within the area bounded by the 45GL on the north, the 20GL on the south, the 30GL on the east, and the 86GL on the west (TAB A). ... Ithough infantry units and recommaisance teams had brief contacts with enemy elements during the reporting period, lucrative troop targets were virtually non-existent. Nevertheless, the battalion was credited with 9 probable VC/NVA KIA; 1 cave position, 1 fortified position, 1 structure, 15 bunkers, 2 fighting holes, and 40 meters of trenchline destroyed; 3 mortars and 1 AAA weapon silenced and possibly destroyed; and 32 secondarios indicating a significant quantity of ammunition or POL destroyed.

Positive damage assignments on most suspected enemy locations were difficult to obtain because of dense vegetation and rugged terrain, and also because the infantry scheme of maneuver did not always permit a detailed search of areas attacked by artillery fires.

As the reporting period opened, the 2d Battalion, 12th Marines had operational control of its organic units (less a 3-section detachment of Mortar Battery) and both the 1st and 2d Provisional 155mm (Twd) Batteries (4 howitzers each), which gave the 9th Marines the firepower support of 18 105mm howitzers, 8 155mm howitzers, and 3 4.2" mortars.

During the reporting period, the battalion assumed OPCON of Mortar Battery (-) 3/12 for 11 days, chopped OPCON of the 2d Provisional 155mm (Twd) Battery, and assumed OPCON of the 3d Provisional 155mm (Twd) Battery. The latter unit, unlike the 1st and 2d Provisional Batteries, is a 6-howitzer battery. At the close of the reporting period a net gain of 2 155mm howitzers had been realized by these OPCON changes.

On 1 December all units except the 2d Provisional Battery were situated on Fire Support Bases (FSB) in support of operations south of Vandegrift Combat Base (VCB). Battery D and Mortar Battery were at FSB SHILOH; Battery E and the CP were at FSB DICK; and Battery F and the 1st Provisional Battery were at FSB TUN TAVERN (TAB B). The 2d Provisional Battery remained at CALU to facilitate future operations.

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On 3 December Mortar Battery helifited to LZ CHARLIE (TAB C) to provide support for 1/9 units attempting to exploit sporadic VC/NVA contacts in that area. Although a typical FSB was not developed at LZ CHARLIE, the Mortar Battery position there became known as FSB "LITTLE BIG HORN". Evidence of recent VC/NVA activity was abundant. While improving the position, a well-constructed camouflaged bunker was discovered under one of the mortar pits. The first significant mission for Mortar Battery occurred on the second day in the new position, when 49 rounds were fired on a suspected enemy mortar position. Batteries D, E, F and the 2d Provisional Battery fired an additional 452 rounds on active enemy positions in the same general target area during this 3-hour engagement. Thereafter, no significant missions were fired around LZ CHARLIE until friendly units began to extract from the area. In the last two days at IZ CHARLIE, Mortar Battery fired 434 rounds on targets of opportunity. This represented over 70% of the total rounds fired by that battery during the 12 day operation around LZ CHARLIE.

Simultaneous with the operation around LZ CHARLIE, units of the 9th Marines pushed south, up the DAKRONG hiver valley and east, toward the BASE CAMP 101 area. To support these drives, the 1st Provisional Battery helilifted from FSB TUN TAVERN to FSB SHILOH, and Battery F opened FSB BARNETT (TAB D). These moves added 5kM to the battalion FIRECAP in the east and southeastern position of the AO, and about 3.5kM to the south, as well providing additional artillery weight in the primary operating areas. With the assumption of OPCON on 7 December of the 3d Provisional 155mm(Twd) Battery, which had one 3-howitzer detachment at CALU and another at FSB CATES, the number of firing units under control of the battalion FDC increased to 9, and the battalion FIRECAP extended approximately 52kM form east to west, and 47kM from north to south, along an axis running generally northwest-southeast (TAB E).

On 12 December the battalion chopped OPCON of both Mortar Battery (-) 3/12 and the 2d Provisional Battery, and those units departed the VCB/CALU complex. Two days later, when the operation around LZ CHARLIE secured, Mortar Battery 2/12 helilifted to its old position at VCB. This move was the first step in the artillary retraction plan for closing Operation "Dawson River Afton". In order to provide an "overshoot" capability for the protection of each FSB during the retraction phase and to complement the infantry scheme of maneuver, the 1st Provisional Battery helilifted to a position in CALU from which it could cover the reopening and occupation of FSB HENDERSON by Battery D. Both of these moves were accomplished on 19 December. By nightfall 19 December, the batteries were aligned in the mutually-supporting positions depicted in TAB F. Retraction was then simply a matter of extracting the most

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distant battery as soon as the infantry supported by that battery had withdrawn to a position within the protective fan of the battery next in line behind it.

On 23 December the command group moved by echelon to its forward CP at VCB. The next day, Battery F closed out FSB BARNETT and helilifted to CALU. After FSB BARNETT had been evacuated, Battery E closed out FSB DICK that same day and helilifted to VCB. On 25 December, when Battery D closed out FSB HENDERSON and helilifted to CALU, the retraction was completed. With all 9th Marines and supporting units within the VCB/CALU complex, Operation "Dawson River Afton" was terminated at 1600 hours 25 December.

A conservative analysis indicates that "Dawson River Afton" had successfully interdicted major infiltration routes south of the BA LONG River valley and had disrupted major VC/NVA headquarters operating areas, thereby reducing the VC/NVA capability to apply pressure in the populated coastal areas to the east.

Operation "Dawson River" opened at 0001 hours 26 December. Responding to reports of enemy units in the rugged mountains between the MAI LOC TAOR and the BA LONG River, the 9th Marines planned to insert one battalion (-) in the vicinity of grids 10843% and 098444. To support this plan, Battery F reopened FSB HENDERSON on 28 December. The infantry assault commenced the following day. During this operation, Battery F Fired 1,461 rounds, of which about half were unobserved TOT's and H&l's on likely enemy harbor sites. 416 rounds were expended prepping assault objectives, and 263 rounds were fired on fleeting targets of opportunity. The problem of inconclusive surveillance of many observed missions, which characterized the previous operation, prevailed during Operation "Daws n River" also. No significant contact had developed at the end of the reporting period, and units were being withdrawn to the VCB/CALU complex to prepare for the next operation, On 3! December, FSB HENDERSON was closed out for the second time within a week, and Battery F helilifted to FSB CATES to facilitate future operations to the west (TAB G).

Noteworthy events occurring during the reporting period and not mentioned above included the 23 December rocket attack on Vandegrift Combat Base and the Christmas cease-fire period. Reaction to the rocket attack was swift and decisively weighted. By aggressively seeking and and quickly correlating fragmentary information from Conduct of Fire and several sources, the battalion was able to commence counterbattery fires before the Spot Report announcing the attack had been received.

330 rounds of 155mm HEQ were expended on the area from which the rockets had been launched.

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The Christmas cease-fire was scheduled from 1800 hours 24 December to 1800 hours Christmas day. The battalion suspended firing unobserved fires at 1532 hours 24 December, after the movement of Batteries E and F from Fire Support Bases BARNETT and DICK to their new positions at CALU and Vandergrift Combat Base. In accordance with the directives of higher authority, at 1800 hours 24 December the battalion reported that it was in a "Standdown" posture; however, full watches were maintained throughout the cease fire period. There were no truce violations involving 2d Battalion units or personnel. At 1800 hours 25 December, the battalion resumed its rocket suppression program.

  - d. Casualties Inflicted on the Enemy. 9 Probable VC/WA KIA.
  - e. Casualties Sustained. 2 WIA
- f. Equipment Maintenance Situation. The DX program has steadily declined. Optical and sighting equipment for howitzers have been in high demand with long delay in repair facilities. Second echelon deadline for parts is very high.
- g. Logistics During the month of December 1968, th Battalion accomplished displacements and subsequent resumply almost entirely by air. These operations necessitated a split logistics section; one sub-section handled air resumply while the other sub-section handled maintenance and administrative functions. The Motor Transport section was afforded opportunity to perform more than the usual preventive maintenance functions since all firing batteries were isolated from roads. A consolidated Battalion transportation schedule was established with two runs daily to Vandegrift Combat Base and the Quang Tri area. This run has made still more vehicles available for maintenance functions while reducing the volume of Battalion traffic on Routes 1 and 9. A total of 37,100 rounds of 105mm, 107mm, and 155mm ammunition were transported during the month.

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h. <u>Civic Action</u>. During the month of December 1968, the Civic Action program of this Battalion was centered on the Hamlet of Thiet Trang and the refugee Hamlet of Troung X a. On 7 Dec68 a Medcap and a Dentcap were held. 61 patients and 1 pig were treated. 14 Dec68 a Medcap was held for 53 patients. On 21 Dec a Christmas party was held at the elementry school in Thiet Trang for the children of both Hamlets. 14 enlisted personnel and 2 Officers attended. Toys, candy, refreshments, and clothing were distributed to approximately 300 villagers. Emergency patients were treated also on 21 Dec. On 24 Dec 12 sheets of tin and 30 bags of cement were delivered to Mr. Da the chief of Thiet Trang for school remains and for the construction of a well. On 27 Dec the S-5 interpreter, Mr. Giam (The Hamlet chief of Troung Xa) and 7 villagers went to the CORDS warehouse in Quang Tricity to pick up 150 bags of grain and bulgar for the refugees and delivered same to Troung Xa.

On 28 Dec a Medcap was held for 54 villagers, On 30 Dec 50 bags of cement were delivered to Troung Xa for construction of 2 new wells and an ancestoral temple.

- i. <u>Personnel</u>. The Battalion was at 95% T/O strength at the end of the reporting period. Shortages exist in the MOS's 0122, 0239, 0844, 0848, 0849, 2111, 3041, 3052, 3516, Sixty-four Marines participated in the R&R program during December.
- j. Intelligence. Operation "Dawson River Afton" continued through the month of December 1968. The 9th Marines/2d Battalion, 12th Marines continued applying pressure to NVA/VC units in the DaKrong River and southern Balong areas, generally bounded by the 45GL on the north, the 20GL on the south and the 30GL on the east, 86GL on the west. There were no contacts with large enemy units; however, captured documents and equipment indicated the presence of the 7th Front Rear Service Headquarters, the 812th Regiment and the 808th Battalion.

The 1st Battalion 9th Marines, initially supported by Battery D and Mortar Battery (-) 2/12 and the 1st Provisional Battery at FSB SHILOH, had sporadic contacts with small VC/NWA units between the DAKRONG River and Lactian border. As 1/9 moved east of the DAKRONG River, well developed trails were discovered. Significantly, the battalion discovered what appeared to be a relay station, and captured radio equipment, documents and 3 female detaimees in the vicinity of grid YD 193295. In the same time frame, a heavily-used camouflaged trail was discovered on Hill 1108 (YD 199278), and a well developed trail approximately 8 feet wide and running im a north-south direction was discovered in the vicinity grid YD 175253.

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3/9, supported by Battery E from FSB DICK and Battery F from FSB BARNLTT, continuing working east from the DAKRONG Valley toward Base Area 101. They discovered well-developed trail networks and numerous caches. The battalion found a significant communications cache alongside a trail in the vicinity of grid YD 168312. All equipment was new and in shipping containers.

analysis: As the operation moved to the east/southeast it became evident that the 9th Marine Regiment was working into major infiltration routes and major enemy headquarters operating areas. Communications equipment captured was packed for transport and documents found indicated the presence of 7th Front Rear Service Headquarters. The operation applied pressure, hampering enemy operation and possibly forcing elements of the 7th Front Headquarters to evacuate Base Area 101 and surrounding areas. Thus, it is believed that the operation contributed significantly to reducing VC activities in the adjacent coastal area.

- k. Communications. During the month of December 1968, the Communications Platoen supported the Battalion FDC at FSB DIUK and Vandegrift Combat Base, maintained a rear in Nong Ha, and operated a relay station on Signal Hill. The Tech Shop continued in its Second Echelon Program for the firing batteries. The Radio Section received 19 KY-38 portable voice encryption devices, but the KYK-28 and PRC-77 units have not arrived yet. The policy of training all new radio operators in Headquarters was abandoned. An attempt is now made to retate experienced operators from the field to the Headquarters Battery. Cross training of wiremen in the radio specialty was used extensively due to the emphasis on radio communications in the fire support base concept of operations.
- 1. Training. All cannon batteries conducted training for self-defense of FSB's, including the firing of illumination and bechive. Although 1.2 M munitions are included in these self-defense plans, proximity of friendly troops did not permit practice firing of T.C.M. during the reporting period. An FO School was conducted on 27 December.
- m. Weather. Good weather prevailed for most of the reporting period, but morning ground fog conditions at the Vandegrift Combat Base Logistics Support Activity reduced the volume of resupply. While this this did not significantly affect combat operations, it did require conservation of artillery ammunition to a greater degree than would have been necessary if resupply had been continuous. The worst weather of the reporting period occurred during the retraction phase, which required several adjustments in the retraction schedule.

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n. Air Support. The capability of Marine helicopters to support operations of this nature appiars to be marginal, due to low aircraft availability. A requirement exists for command/control aircraft to be available to the artillery battalion commander for reconnaisance, liaison, and command visits almost every day. This requirement could not be supported during the reporting period.
