PART II

The month of February began with the 3rd Battalion, 12th Marines continuing operation OSCEOLA II which consisted of direct support to the 3rd Marines search and destroy operation in the vicinity of Quang Tri and direct support for the defense of the Quang Tri Vital area. 3rd Battalion, 12th Marines also provided reinforcing fire for the 1st ARVN Division and the 1st Air Cavalry.

On 1 February 1968, a double change of command took place with 1stLt C.R. RASOR taking over as OIC of the 2nd 155 Howitzer Provision Battery, vice Capt. R.J. LUCAS. Capt R.J. LUCAS in turn relieved Capt. S.B. GRIMES, who became the Battalion Assistant S-3.

On the 16 February 1968, there were two (2) significant events. At 0800 the 2nd 155 Howitzer Provisional Battery sent one (1) of the two (2) remaining 155 Howitzers to Khe Sanh to replace one (1) Howitzer belonging to 1st 155 Howitzer Provisional Battery. The second significant event took place at 2400 with the ending of Operation OSCEOLA II. The 3rd Battalion, 12th Marines continued its mission of direct support of the 3rd Marines in defense of the Quang Tri Vital area.

On 21 February 1968, a change of command ceremony took place with LtCol ROGER W. GREER being relieved by LtCol J. A. COMO.

The latter portion of February was spent preparing for the relocation of Headquarters Battery 3rd Battalion, 12th Marines within the Quang Tri complex. As of 29 February 1968, the 2nd 155 Howitzer Provisional Battery still has only one (1) 155 Howitzer.

- 5. Equipment. The overall maintenance situation is good. Ten of the battalion's motor transport prime movers are deadlined. The TD-15 tractor continues to be deadlined.
- 6. Logistics. Supply support improved during the month due to the Battalion Supply Administrative section being moved to Quang Tri. T/E shortages of some major items of equipment continue to be a problem area.
- a. Food Services. The Battalion served 38% "A" rations, 60% "B" rations, and 2% "C" rations during the month of February.
- b. Medical. During February there were 315 outpatients treated by the BAS. There were no KIA's and 8 WIA's during the month.

7. Administration

- a. Morale has maintained a high level due to wide participation in R&R apportunities. Training of new administration personnel is being carried out in compliance with the training schedule.
- b. There was one Commanding Officer's Non-Judicial Punishments awarded during February. There were no courts-martial.
 - (1) Article 91, UCMJ Article 92, UCMJ
- c. On the 29th of February the battalion ceased operating on Battalion Administration. All batteries are back on battery administration.
- 8. Personnel. The average strength for the month was 87% of the authorized manning level. The battalion is currently operating at 87% of the manning level. During the month the battalion joined 4 officers and 126 enlisted. There were no officers rotated. One officer was transferred and there were 49 enlisted Marines either transferred or rotated.

9. Intelligence

- a. Enemy Activity. The activity early in the month centered around the Quang Tri air strip in the form of probes of the lines, mortar attacks and rocket attacks. Toward the end of the month there has been a decrease in activity around the air field and adjoining areas. Some movement from Base Area 101 to the area west has been sited.
- b. Enemy Intentions. Activity during the past two thirds of this month seem to indicate that the enemy is recovering from heavy losses of the "Tet" offensive and is resupplying his troops in the area for a possible new offensive.
- c. Administration. The counter mortar/rocket plan for the Quang Tri positions was made up and successfully implemented.





10. Communications-Electronics

- a. During the month of February the battalion supported the Third Marine Regiment, in Quang Tri Province.
- b. Slight difficulties were encountered in this AO, due to interference from Air Cavalry frequencies being the same as USMC frequencies. These problems were resolved at division level by the CEO. No other significant radio problems have been encountered.
- c. Wire communications have had some difficulty due to the sandy terrain. Vehicles will cut wires lines unless they are burisduat least two feet and sand bagged. A minimal amount of outage was experienced on all radio relay circuits.
- d. On 19 February the Battalion welcomed aboard a new Communications Chief GySgt G. A. HEESH.
- e. On 19 February the Battalion Communitions Officer attended a one week Crypto school, for off-line crypto, at Yokosuka, Japan.
- f. At the end of the month the Communitions in the Fire Direction Center moved from the Fire Direction bunker into a tent that will be utilized as an FDC while a new FDC bunker is under construction at a new position. The transition was effected very smoothly.

OPERATION OSCEOLA II

1 FEBRUARY

PARASOL (Recon) requested fire on 4 VC in the open at YD 273545 at 1340H. Battery "I" expended 3 rounds of WP and 6 rounds of HE. The surveillance reported 1 VC WIA.

2 FEBRUARY

No significant missions were fired during this 24 hour mission.

3 FEBRUARY

At YD 318605, YD 318604, and YD 318603 the 3rd Marines FSCC requested reinforcing fire on a confirmed VC battalion. At 1120H Battery "G" expended 96 rounds of HE on this unobserved mission.

HINDERANCE (Recon) requested fire on 1 VC in open at YD 260525. Battery "G" at 1425H expended 18 rounds of HE. A negative surveillance was reported for this mission.

4 FEBRUARY

Elements of 1/3 reported that they were receiving sniper fire from YD 275549. At 0934H Battery "I" expended 4 rounds of WP and 18 rounds of HE. Sniper cease firing was the only surveillance given.

Elements of 1/3 reported that they were again receiving sniper fire at 1155H. Battery "G" expended 3 rounds of WP and 30 rounds of HE at YD 267535. Sniper cease fire was the surveillance.

5 FEBRUARY

At 0845H Battery "G" expended 8 rounds of WP and 10 rounds of HE on 4 VC in the open. This mission was called in by elements of 1/3 at YD 274548. Negative surveillance was reported for this mission.

6 FEBRUARY

At 2200H MAC-V (Military Advisors Command-V) requested fire on an NVA Co. at YD 307607. Battery "G" expended 36 rounds of HE on this unobserved mission.
