

## Narrative Summary

As of the first of April, the 4th Battalion was exercising operational control of C/1/13, the 1st 155 Gun Battery, and the 1st and 2d Provisional 155 Howitzer Batteries. Administrative control was exercised over C/1/13, K/4/12, M/4/12, and the 1st 155 Gun Battery. The 1st and 2d Provisional 155 Howitzer Batteries administratively functioned as detachments of Headquarters Battery, 4th Battalion, 12th Marines.

On 9 April the Battalion chopped OPCON of the 1st Provisional 155 Howltzer Battery to 3/12. On 16 April the battalion assumed APCON of L/4/12 and on 28 April, assumed ADCON of the 1st 8 inch Howitzer Battery.


On 6 Aprill, the 1st Provisional 155 How Btry (Rear) and the 8 inch Platoco from the 1st 155 (Aun Btry mere attacked at their position at PK 17 (YD 646279) by an estimated two companies of VC. After an inchall mortar attack, the VC attacked with small arms and satchel charges. The elements suffered 2 USMC KIA, 1 USM KIA, 7 USMC WIA, and 1 USM WIA. In addition, an 0 inch howitzer was demaged by a direct hit during the mortar attack. Fire was returned (including direct fire from the remaining 8 inch howitzer) and as a result, there were 20 confirmed and 40 probable VC KIA. The following night (7 April), PK 17 was hit by mortars again and the elements sustained 8 WIA.

On 28 April, the PHU BAI vital area received approximately 150-82mm mortax rounds, of which this battalion received approximately 60. The battalion fired counter mortar fire and the mortars were silenced within two minutes. The battalion sustained 9 WIA during the attack. In addition, eight vehicles were damaged.

On 29 April, a vehicle from the 1st Provisional 155 Howitzer Pattery struck a mine resulting in 4 WIA, and the vehicle destroyed.

 $\int$  On 30 April, K/4/12 rotated to Okinawa and was replaced by K/4/13.

As the month of April closed the 4th Battalion continued to function as the senior artillery headquarters in the PHU BAI TACR. Batteries under the operational control of the battalion were C/1/13, 1st 155 Gun Battery, and 2d Provisional 155 Howitzer Battery,

#### e. Logistics.

l. Logistical Situation - Currently, 4/12 has ADCON of seven G/S artillery batteries; K-4-12, L-4-12, M-4-12, Ist 155 Gun Battery. 1st 8 inch Howitzer Battery. 1st and 2d Provisional 155mm Detachments; one D/S artillery battery, C-1-13, and Headquarters Battery 4/12.





- 2. Supply. The overall supply situation. is satisfactory. Major items of equipment on requisition for units of this organization include:
  - (a) Two Generator Sets PU-462/M
  - (b) One Generator Set PU-348 A/G
  - (c) Two Tractor, Full tracked, TD-15
- 3. Maintenance. Six Month Maintenance has been completed on all 155mm Towed Howitzers. At the present time this unit has nine 155mm Towed Howitzers with the speed shifting device. Modification of the tenth is in progress.
- 4. Food Services. Headquarters 4/12 opened a Battalion Mess Hall on 18 April 1967. The 4/12 Mess Hall provides messing facilities for Headquarters Battery, C/1/13, 2d Provisional 155mm Detachment and 3/12 Rear.
- 5. Cantonment. The Artillery Cantonment was completed during the menth of April.
- 6. Bunkers and Perimeter Security. On 1 May 1967, Division Engineers will commence construction of one 20 x 30 bunker, and two 12 x 24 bunkers for the Artillery Cantonment.
  - 7. All batteries truck water to their positions.
- 8. Motor Transport. This section is receiving special attention to assist in reducing the deadline vehicle rate.
- f. Civic Action. During the month of April, the proposed plans for the THUY PHU area were approved for building a dispensary, widening an existing read, and the constructions of homes for about 15 families was were forced to leave their hamlet due to VC terrorism. No further action can be taken in this area until the Vietnamese governmental agencies begin construction.

During the last part of April elections were held, down to and in-

Medcap is being conducted every Tuesday afternoon and is receiving a good response. Treatment was administered to 461 Vietnamese during April.

g. Administration. This Battalion currently has ADCON of C/1/13, K/4/12, L/4/12, M/4/12, Hq/4/12, the 1st 155 Gun Battery, and the 1st 8" Howitzer Battery. The 1st and 2d Provisional batteries function as detachments of Hq Btry 4/12.


