

#### PART II

## NARRATIVE SUMMARY

As of 1 November, the 4th Battalion was exercising operational control of B/1/13, L/4/12, and the 1st 155 Gun Battery(SP). Administrative control was being exercised over B/1/13, K/4/13, L/4/12, M/4/12 and the 1st 155mm Gun Battery.

A liaison team was maintained throughout the month at NAM HOA (YD 762129) to assist in coordinating supporting fires from the ARVN 105mm Battery (2 Guns) located there.

During the month, two significant events concerning major items of equipment occurred. The 4th Battalion received MI6Al rifles for issue to personnel on a training basis. By 30 November, the required imitial training program was approximately 80 porcent completed. Also, on 9 November, the 4th Battalion began limited operations with one MI8 Gun Direction Computer (FADAC) and associated equipment.


The 4th Battalion was assigned the additional mission of general support of the 4th Marines(-)(Rein) engaged in Operation COVE in the vicinity of PHU LOC (ZD 085007) during the period 17-22 November. On 22 November, B/1/13 displaced to the vicinity of PHU LOC (ZD 100000) in D/S of the 1st Battalion, 4th Marines(-) conducting search and destroy operations in that area. The Battery returned to its primary position at PHU BAI (YD 884127) on 26 November.

Throughout the month, renewed emphasis was placed on basic principles of both maintenance and training in preparation for the Commanding General's Inspection to be conducted from 26 November to 2 December.

As the month of November closed, the 4th Battalion continued to function as the senior artillery headquarters in the PHU BAI AO. B/1/13, L/4/12, and the 1st 155mm Gun Battery remained under the operational control of the 4th Battalion.

- 5. Logistics
- a. Logistical situation. Currently, 4/12 has ADCON of four medium battorios: K/4/13, L/4/12, M/4/12, and 1st 155 Gun Battery: one light artillery battery: B/1/13; and Headquarters Battery 4/12.
- b. Supply. The overall supply situation is satisfactory. Major items of equiptment on requisition for the organization include:
  - (1) One Generator Set PU-482/M
  - (2) One Generator Set PU-348/G (3) One - Generator Set PE-214
  - (4) Two Trk, Cargo, 3/4 Ton, M-37
  - (5) Two Trk, Utility, M422
- c. Food Services. The 4/12 Mess Hall provides messing facilities for Headquarters Battery, B/1/13, L/4/12, 3/12 Rear, and 1st Field Artillery Group.
- d. <u>Cantonment</u>. Construction of the access road from Headquarters Battery to Battery "L" has been started. Construction of the concrete ramp for the Buller building in Headquarters 4/12 Command Post has not been started.
  - e. Water. All batteries truck water to their positions.



- f. Motor Transport. The Motor Transport situation is satisfactory.
- g. Artillery Maintenance. Artillery maintenance will not support operational objectives due to the shortage of repair parts for the 155mm Howitzer (SP) M109.
- h. Embarkation. All batteries are submitting changes in their embarkation data to this battalion monthly.
- i. Equipment. During the month the 4th Battalion received three new major issues of equipment;
- (1) Mabal rifles were issued on a training basis to each individual armed with an Ml4 rifle. Between 15 and 30 November, in excess of thirty hours of instruction on the operation and maintenance of the Mlbal were presented by instructors from within the battalion. Five familiarization firing exercises were held daring this time. By 30 November, approximately 80% of the battalian had received the recommended initial instruction and zeroed their weapon.
- (2) One Gun Direction Computer M18 (FADAC) with associated equiptment was received and placed in limited operational service on 9 November. Training with the computer was continued in preparation for full scale employment early in December.
- (3) 18 new M54 5-Ton multifuel cargo trucks and one wrecker were received as replacement for similar gasoline-powered vehicles.
- 6. Administration. The 4th Battalion continues to exercise ADCON of HQ/4/12, L/4/12, B/1/13, K/4/13, M/4/12, and the 1st 155 Gun Battery.
