

# NARRATIVE SUMMARY


As of 1 January 1968, the 4th Battalian exercised operational control of B/1/13, L/4/12, and 1st 155 Gun Battery (SP). The 4th Battalian exercised administrative control of B/1/13, K/4/13, L/4/12, M/4/12 and 1st 155 Gun Battery (SP). On 14 January 1968, operational and administrative control of 1st 155 Gun Battery (SP) was dropped to 1st FAG.

On 17 January 1968, the 2d Battalion, 12th Marines assumed operational control of B/1/13. On 20 January 1968, the 4th Battalion assumed operational control of 1st Platoon, 5th 155 Gun Battery (SP). On 21 January 1968, the 4th Battalion assumed operational control of M/4/12 from the 2d Battalion, 12th Marines. On 27 January 1968, the 1st Platoon, 5th 155 Gun Battery (SP) was dropped from the operational control of the 4th Battalion.

Commencing on 3 January 1968, the 4th Battalion displaced to DONG HA, RVN (YD 214597) from PHU BAI, RVN (YD 885129). Convoys on 3 January 1968 and 9 January 1968 carried equipment exclusively. A convoy on 6 January 1968 carried additional equipment and the advance party. On 17 January 1968, subsequent to the arrival of the 2d Battalion, 11th Marines in PHU BAI, the main body with the remaining equipment displaced to DONG HA.

The 4th Battalion relinquished control of the PHU BAI TAOR FDC on 16 January 1968 to the 2d Battalion, 11th Marines. On 17 January 1968, at DONG HA, the 4th Battalion, commenced centralized FDC operations.

On 31 January 1968, one platoon of L/4/12 was displaced from the battery position at DONG HA to a firing position at C-1 in order to support operations farther north.


