NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of April the Battalion remained in General Support of the 1st Marine Division. The Battalion supported no named operations during the month.

Battery E's mission remained Reinforcing, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines, throughout the month.

Battery L remained in General Support throughout the month. On 17 April, Battery L, (-), moved to a position located at Mike Tower, coordinates AT92034731, in support of an operation conducted by the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines. During the period of the operation, Battery L, (-), was chopped to the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. The operation concluded on 27 April 1970, and at 272000 April 1970 the battery was chopped back to the 4th Battalion, 11th Marines. Battery L, (-), expended 5227 rounds in support of the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines; however no KIA's were observed.

Battery H remained in General Support-Reinforcing, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines. The battery continued to answer calls for fire directly from reconnaissance units and observation posts operating in the southern portion of the 1st Marine Division AOR.

During the month of April, units of the Battalion fired a total of 166 missions, expending 25,350 rounds in support of the following units:

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(1) During the month of April 1970, the Battalion S-2 made 8 liaison trips to the Regimental S-2 and 4 liaison trips to Division S-2. For the purpose of training and inspection, Counter Rocket O. P.'s Tiger, Laugh, Hawk, Lou, and Crowsnest were visited.

(2) A total of 9800 \$VH was expended for the purchase of Ordnance turned in through the Volunteer Informants Program. Examples of Ordnance turned in ranged from enemy 82mm mortar rounds and grenades to new M5 H-79 Grenade Launchers and M-33 Hand Grenades.

h. Organizations and Operations.

(1) The Battalion remained in General Support of the 1st Marine Division throughout the month.

(2) Organization for combat at the end of the reporting period was:

Battery K - Reinforcing 3/11
 Battery L - General Support
 Battery M - General Support, Reinforcing 2/11

(3) During the period 1 April to 15 April the 4th Battalion provided a forward observer team which occupied an OP on Hill 327 during the expected high threat period. The team had no enemy sightings during the period.

(4) On 17 April Battery L, moved to Mike Tower area in support of the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines.

(5) On 27 April Battery L, (-), returned to the Northern Artillery Cantonment.

(6) On 27 April the OP on Hill 327 was again occupied by the forward observer team from the 4th Battalion. The team will remain in position until the present expected high threat period has passed.

i. Training.

(1) Normal M5S and M5S training was conducted as operational commitments allowed.

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(2) An 81mm Mortar FIVE was conducted by the Operations Section, 3rd Battery on 12 April at Sea Gun Training Range.

J. Logistics, Equipment and Supplies.

(1) During this period the deadline rate for the M109 Howitzers has remained at a satisfactory low level due to the continued outstanding performance of the maintenance crews. However, due to the large number of rounds fired from each weapon, the down time is increasing and a much greater turnover of major M109 components is anticipated.

(2) The motor transport deadline rate varies a great deal from day to day, but continues to average out well below 10 percent. There are presently four vehicles on deadline for a four percent deadline rate. Of these, three are in transit to fourth echelon and one in transit to third echelon.

(3) Requisitions submitted since this Battalion has arrived in the Republic of Vietnam total 52,700. Of this number 32,470 have been filled.
