On 1 November 1967, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines commenced participation in Operation Scotland in support of Regimental Landing Team - 26.

On 2 November 1967, 12th Marines message 020430Z Nov67 was received stating the intention to return Mortar Battery (-), 1st Battalion, 13th Marines from Camp Evans, RVN to 1st Battalion, 13th Marines at Khe Sanh, and return Battery "I" (-), 3rd Battalion, 12th Marines to Camp Carroll, RVN. Air-lift data for Battery "I" (-) was forwarded to 12th Marines by 26 Marines message 031545Z Nov67. Planning commenced whereby three 105mm How Td from Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines would be heli-lifted to hill 881 as replacement weapons for the three 105mm How Td of Battery "I" (-) when that unit displaced to Camp Carroll. With this exchange of weapons, the three vacant 105mm How Td positions at Battery "C" would be utilized as gun positions for the three 4.2 inch mortars returning with Mortar Battery (-), 1st Battalion, 13th Marines. Planning was completed and on 9 November 1967 the exchange occurred. At 091730Z Nov67, OPCON of Battery "I" (-), 3rd Battalion, 12th Marines was chopped to 12th Marines and at 091740Z Nov67, OPCON of Mortar Battery (-), 1st Battalion, 13th Marines was assumed by 1st Battalion, 13th Marines. Presently, Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines has three 105mm How Td emplaced on hill 881S and three 105mm How Td emplaced within the Khe Sanh Combat Base. Mortar Battery, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines has two 4.2 inch mortars and one 107mm Howtar located on hill 861 and three 4.2 inch mortars emplaced within the Khe Sanh Combat Base.

The defensive fire planning for the Khe Sanh Combat Base continued with the selection of 4.2 inch mortar positions on the eastern and western sides of the Combat Base. Survey was established at these positions and construction of gun emplacements, ammunition and personnel bunkers was commenced. When completed, 4.2 inch mortars within these positions will improve the close-in defensive fires for the Combat Base. A perimeter survey of the U. S. Army Forward Operating Base #3 was conducted. Defensive fire plans were modified to include Forward Operating Base #3.

Four forward observer schools were conducted during the month to train replacement personnel from Company "B", 3rd Reconnaissance Battalion. Adjustment of fire was emphasized and training missions from hill 881S were conducted. A forward observer school was presented to the U. S. Army Forward Operating Base #3 on 26 Nov 67. The instruction included target location, the initial fire request, and projectile-fuze combination and effects. Adjustment procedures were emphasized during a firing problem.

During November 1967, improvement of the Battalion area continued. Additional living bunkers were constructed and camouflage techniques emphasized. Planning commenced for the construction of dummy artillery weapons to be implaced within alternate firing positions.

During the month two MEDCAPs were conducted. One on 26 November and again on 28 November 1967 treating approximately 100 people. MEDCAPs were not conducted earlier in the month due to adverse weather conditions. MEDCAPs are conducted on an weekly basis weather and medical supplies permitting.

1. In accordance with the instructions contained in reference (a), the following report is submitted:

a. On 25 November 1967, this Battalion conducted a MEDCAP in the Hamlet of PAROH, which consist of 23 houses. The Hamlet Chief, HOO, was present during the MEDCAP and approximately 45 persons were treated. The Battalion Medical Officer made two house calls and advised that two persons be taken to the medical aid station in the Village of Khe Sanh for treatment. The Civic Affairs Officer requested the local GAO unit to assist in transporting the persons to Khe Sanh and the GAO squad leader made arrangements for the sick to be taken to the medical aid station in Khe Sanh on 27 November 1967.

b. The Battalion MEDCAP Team then proceeded to the Hamlet of RACHAC which is divided into two sub-hamlets, HOC THUONG and TANOK and conducted a MEDCAP in the portion known as TANOK which consist of 21 houses. The Hamlet Chief, UA, was present during the MEDCAP and approximately 50 persons were treated and soap was distributed.

c. The Hamlet Chief of TADOQ, RAPUN, sent a runner to request the MEDCAP Team visit his Hamlet after completion of the MEDCAP in TANOK due to the illness of an elder. The MEDCAP Team proceeded to TADOQ consisting of 35 houses, treated approximately 40 persons and distributed soap.

d. A Mountgard wedding had been conducted during the day and the MEDCAP Team attended the feast which included the Hamlet Chief RAPUN of the Hamlet of TADOQ, PAQLAHAM of the Hamlet of HOC THUONG, CHAI of the

Hamlet of CLONG SAREH and NEH of the Hamlet of TOGANG. All Hamlet Chieftains requested the MEDCAP Team visit their respective Hamlets and arrangements were made for MEDCAP visits.

e. The wedding provided an opportunity to discuss construction of a shower, bunks and desks at the local school with the principle Hamlet Chieftains involved and plans were made to begin construction.

1. In accordance with the instructions contained in reference (a), the following report is submitted:

a. On 28 November 1967, this Battalion conducted a MEDCAP in the hamlet of LAMBOIQ, which consists of 32 houses. Approximately 30 persons were treated.

b. The Battalion MEDCAP team then proceeded to the hamlet of CHOAH, which consisted of 78 houses. The hamlet chief, CHOE, was present during the MEDCAP and approximately 25 persons were treated. The Battalion MEDCAP team was forced to cut short the MEDCAP visit in CHOAH due to the lack of medical supplies. MEDCAP supplies were requested in late October and a very limited supply was received in early November and these supplies have been exhausted. The Battalion is unable to requisition MEDCAP supplies through normal supply channels as this unit's supplies are drawn from the 9th Marine Amphibious Brigade in Okinawa, and no provision have been made for this unit drawing additional medical supplies from the Brigade. This problem has been discussed with the Civil Affairs Officer of RLT-26 with a view toward drawing MEDCAP supplies through 3rd Marine Division. The Civil Affairs Officer of RLT-26 indicated that he would look into this problem and advise this unit of a possible course of action.

c. Before conducting the MEDCAP a visit was paid to Mr. ANHA, leader of the local Brou to discuss items of mutual interest. The distribution of Christmas toys to the children was discussed and decided that they should be turned over to him for distribution to the local hamlet chiefs for distribution within their hamlets.
