PART II

COMMANDERS NARRATIVE

During the period 1-30 June 1968, the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines participated in Operation Mameluke Thrust in direct support of the 26th Marines.

At 031200H, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines assumed OPCON of Battery "G", 3d Battalion, 11th Marines.

At 051500H 1968, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines chopped OPCON of Battery "A" to 3d Battalion, 11th Marines, 2 155mm Howitzers, (TOWED), to the 4th Battalion, 11th Marines.

On 7 June 1968, the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired 120 rounds in support of the 3d Battalion, 26th Marines as they operated in the vicinity of Hill 1235. These rounds were fired at NVA elements that were attempting to withdraw from the 1235 hill complex and were responsible for 8 enemy KIA.

On 10 June 1968, 3 NVA KIA were credited to the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines as 128 rounds were fired in support of a 3d Battalion, 26th Marines unit that was in contact near Hill 1235.

At 161500H, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines chopped OPCON of Battery "G", 3d Battalion, 11th Marines and assumed OPCON of Battery "A", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines.

At 171600H, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines chopped OPCON of Detachment, Mortar Battery, 2nd Battalion, 13th Marines to 2nd Battalion, 13th Marines.

At 190600H, the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines assumed OPCON of Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines and Mortar Battery, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines.

On 20 June 1968, the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines arranged for reinforcing fires from the 11th Marines in preparation for a 3d Battalion, 26th Marines operation in Happy Valley. A subsequent search of the area revealed 9 enemy KIA which were credited to the artillery.

On 27 June 1968, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired in support of a Reconnaissance Unit in the vicinity of Happy Valley. Surveillance by supported unit indicated that fire support was responsible for the destruction of trench lines, 3 bunkers, and some living quarters.





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On 28 June 1968, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired numerous Prep Fires in support of 3d Battalion, 26th Marines as they conducted operations in Happy Valley. A subsequent search of the area revealed 11 enemy KIA, 5 of which were credited to the artillery.
