Part II NARRATIVE SUMMARY



During the period 1-30 September 1968, the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines participated in Operation HOUSTON V and OWEN MESA under operational control of the 1st Field Artillery Group and 11th Marines, in direct support of the 26th Marines.

On 3 September 1968, Battery "A", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines displaced from their firing position near Phu Bai to the Northern Artillery Cantonement Area, Daneng. This displacement was necessary in order to provide support to 1st Battalion, 26th Marines, who were assigned a new TAOR in the Danang area.

At 031800H September 1968, OPCON of Battery "A", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines was passed to 3d Battalion, 11th Marines.

At 042400H September 1968, OF CON of 1st Battelion (Rein), 13th Marines was passed from 1st Field Artillery Group to the 11th Marines.

On 9 September 1968, Mortar Battery(Rein), 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired in support of a 3d Battalion, 26th Marines element that observed movement of 40 enemy. A subsequent search of the area revealed 7 enemy KIA which were credited to the artillery as well as 13 probable KIA.

At 120800H September 1968, 1st Battalien, 13th Marines assumed Or CON of Battery "A", from 3d Battalion, 11th Marines

On 12 September 1968, 3 155mm Hewitzers of Mortar Battery(Rein), 1st Battalion, 15th Marines displaced from Rockerusher Site, Cac Doi, and moved to Hill 88, I'm Loc District, where they came under control of Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines. Mortar Battery(-) displaced to the Cac Doi area in the vicinity of the Battalion CP. At this time Mortar Battery had 3 M-30 mortars emplaced at the Hai Van Pass and 2 M-30 mortars, 1 107 howter and battery headquarters at Cac Doi. Battery "C", 1st Battalion(Rein), 13th Marines new consisted of 6 105mm howitzers and 5 155mm howitzers.

Operation HOUSTON V terminated on 12 September 1968.

On 15 September 1968, 2 M-30 mortars from Mortar Battery, 1st Battelien, 13th Marines were displaced to Claymere Pass in support of an operation conducted by 3d Battalien, 26th Marines.

On 16 September 1968, one 107mm howter was emplaced at Claymore Pass with the 2 M-30 mortars. At this time Mortar Battery was emplaced at three location; 3 mortars at Hai Van Pass, 2 mortars and a howter at Claymore Pass and battery headquarters at Cac Doi.

At 181420H September 1968, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines CP started receiving incoming morter rounds. Between 1420 and 1600 hours a total of 40 rounds impacted in the vicinity of the CP, however, most of the rounds landed on the hillside between the CP at the bottom and an US Army bettery that occupied the crest of the hill. On 82mm morter round did impact

at the entrance to the Cl and wounded 1 man; two other personnel received minor shrapnel wounds. Counter fire was delivered by available Army and Marine artillery units and an airstrike was conducted which silenced the mortars.

On 18 September 1968, Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines Esceived approximately 100 incoming mortar rounds during the period 1500-1600 hours; minor damage and no casualties resulted from these rounds. Battery "C" returned fine, however, results were unknown. A convoy moving between Danang and Phu Bai was ambushed at approximately 1430 and the mortar attacks on 1st Battalion, 13th Marines CP, the US Army battery and Battery "C" were probably in conjunction with the enemy ambush at Claymore Pass.

At 181500H, September 1968, the Mortar Battery element positioned at Claymore Pass fired 18 rounds at an active mortar site; the surveillence for the mission included 3 bunkers and 2 mortars destroyed.

On 22 September 1968, three tubes from Battery "A" and Battery "C" were interchanged as a result of calibration data.

On 23 September 1968, Bettery "C", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired 93 rounds on an enemy village and received a surveillance of 15 houses and 5 binkers destroyed, 2 secondary explosions and 20 enemy KIA probable.

At 240800H, September 1968, OPCON of 2 155mm howitzers passed from Battery "C", 1st Bettalion(Rein), 13th Marines to 4th Battalion, 11th Marines.

On 25 September 1968, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines Command Fost displaced from Cac Doi to the 35th Engineer Battalion (USA) area, Danang. The remainder of Headquarters Battery displaced from Cac Doi to the 11th Marines area, Danang, between 26 and 28 September 1968.

On 26 September 1968, a Counter Mortar Radar unit was dispatched by the 11th Marines to Claymore Pass in an attempt to locate enemy mortars that were harassing convoys and friendly positions. This unit, working in conjunction with the Mortar Battery element at Claymore Pass, became operational on 28 September 1968.

On 26 September 1968, Operation OWEN MESA was commenced by elements of the 26th Merines with 1st Battalion, 13th Marines in direct support.

Part III SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

3 September 1968 Battery "A", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines displaced from Phu Bai to Daneng.

OPCON of Battery "A" passes from 1st Battalion, 13th Marines to 3d Battalion, 11th Marines.

- 4 September 1968 Ol CON of 1st Battalion, 13th Marines assumed by 11th Marines.
- 9 September 1968 Mortar Battery, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines credited with 7 enemy KL. and 13 probable as they fired in support of 3d Battalion, 26th Marines.
- 12 September 1968 1st Battalion, 13th Marines assumed OPCON of Battery "A" from 3d Battalion, 11th Marines.

3 155 How TD displaced from Mortar Battery (Rein), 1st Battalion, 13th Marines position and went into position at Hill 88 under control of Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines.

Operation HOUSTON V terminated.

- 15 September 1968 Morter Battery, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines dispatched 2 morters to Claymore lass to support a 3d Battalion, 26th Marines operation.
- 16 September 1968 Morter Bettery, 1st Bettalion, 13th Merines dispatched one 107mm howter to Claymore Pass; position now consists of 2 M-30 morters end one howter.
- 18 September 1968 1st Battalion, 13th Marines receives 40-50 82mm morter rounds in end around Commend Post.

Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines receives approximately 100 mortars rounds in and around position area.

Mortar Battery element at Claymore Fass destroys 3 bunkers and 2 enemy mortars as counter fire is directed against enemy position.

- 22 September 1968 Battery "A" and Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines exchange 3 105mm howitzers.
- 23 September 1968 Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines receives credit for 20 probable enemy KIA as they fired in support of 3d Battalion, 26th Marines.



- 24 September 1968 Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines passed Ol-CON of 2 155mm howitzers to 4th Battalion, 11th Marines.
- 25 September 1968 1st Battalion, 13th Marines Cr displaces from Cao Dci to Daneng.
 - 26 September 1968 Counter Mortar Radar unit emplaced at Claymore Pass.

 Operation OWEN MESA commenced.
