Part II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1-31 January 1969, the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines, under the operational control of the 11th Marines, provided direct support to the 26th Marines.

On 8 January 1969, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired 77 Illumination rounds in support of a contact by 1st Battalion, 26th Marines.

On 10 January 1969, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired 150 rounds in preparation for an offensive operation by an element of 1st Battalion, 26th Marines.

On 11 January 1969, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired 172 Illumination rounds in support of a contact by 1st Battalion, 26th Marines.

On 14 January 1969, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired 81 rounds, including 18 Improved Conventional Munitions, on a suspect enemy force that was identified through intelligence channels.

On 15 January 1969, 134 rounds were fired by 1st Battalion, 13th Marines on an enemy bunker complex called in by 1st Battalion, 26th Marines. A surveillance of numerous secondary explosions was provided for these artillery fires.

On 16 January 1969, the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired 75 rounds of HE and 165 Illumination rounds in support of a 1st Battalion, 26th Marines contact. A subsequent sweep of the area revealed several enemy KIA, 2 of which were credited to the Artillery.

On 19 January 1969, the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired 560 rounds in support of an element of 1st Battalion, 26th Marines that was in contact with a large enemy force. A subsequent sweep of the area revealed several enemy KTA, 5 of which were credited to the Artillery.

On 24 January 1969, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired 89 Illumination rounds in support of a 1st Battalion, 26th Marines contact.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 8 January 1969- 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fires numerous Illumination rounds in support of 1st Battalion, 26th Marines.
- 15 January 1969- 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired 134 rounds on enemy bunker complex reported by 1st Battalion, 26th Marines.

 Numerous secondary explosions resulted from these fires.
- 16 January 1969- 1st Battalion, 13th Marines fired numerous HE and Illumination rounds in support of a 1st Battalion, 26th Marines contact; two enemy KIA credited to Artillery.
- 19 January 1969. Five enemy KIA credited to 1st Battalion, 13th Marines as 560 rounds were fired to support 1st Battalion, 26th Marines contact.
