PART II

NARRATIVE SULMARY

Command of the First Battalion, 13th Marines remained with the 11th Marines for the entire month of November. The Battalion mission remained in direct support of the 26th Marines.

The total number of missions fired by the Battalion was greatly increased over recent months. The primary reason for this is, that November is the first month since May 1968 that 1st Battalion, 13th Marines has had command of all four of its organic firing batteries. In addition to the organic batteries, the Battalion has operational control of Mortar Battery, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. Fire control for Battery A and Battery C is centralized in the Battalion FDC. Mortar Battery, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines operates its own FDC. Battery B and Mortar Battery, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines operate a joint FDC on FSB, LOS BANOS. Even though the supported units TACR covers a 58 mile front all battery positions within the TAOR are mutually supported by other units of 1st Battalion, 13th Marines, except FSB, LOS BANOS, which receives its fire support from the U. S. Army's FSB, TOMAHAWK.

Enemy activity during November was minimal. The Battalion is credited with five confirmed enemy KIA and four probables. Numerous blood trails and drag marks indicate a much higher kill ratio. One intelligence report indicated that 124 NVA/VC were killed during a single artillery prep in the vicinity of AT8582.

On 30 November 1969 Battery C, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines was privile/ged to act as host to Major General Crmond R. SIMPSON, Commanding General, 1st Marine Division. Major General SIMPSON, fired the 2,000,000th round fired by the 11th Marines during his command. Other distinguished guests during November included Brigadier General C. S. ROBERTSON and Colonel D. D. EZELL.

On 19 November, one of the Marine Corps newest innovations for battle-field surveillance, an Integrated Observation Device (ICD), was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 13th Marines. This ICD is presently located on hill 190 AT897820. Since implacement of the ICD the weather has severely hampered observation.

Logistic support of FSB, LOS BANOS has greatly improved with experience. The 52 mile round trip from supply depots in DA NANG does, however, place severe strain on organic trucks. This; along with a shortage of motor transport spare parts, brake shoes and starters; has caused an appreciable increase in the motor transport deadline rate.

The rehabilitation of the Northern Artillery Cantonment and FSB, LOS BANOS is progressing quite well. Much work remains to be done.
