NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Command of the First Battalion, 13th Marines remained with the 11th Marines for the entire month of January. Operational control of Mortar Battery, First Battalion, 11th Marines remained with the Battalion. The Battalion mission remained as direct support of the 26th Marines.

Support to the 26th Marines was provided throughout the expanse of the AO and took the form of several varied roles. In addition to fires provided to units in contact; grid saturations, prep fires, counter rocket fires, rice denials, support of CAP's, base camp saturation, and intelligence targets were rapidly and accurately shot.


The number of confirmed enemy kills totaled 14 for the month. Numerous enemy units were fired upon with success but a variety of reasons prevented an accurate surveillance of the Battalion's fires. On several occasions, blood trails were found as a result of the aforementioned fires. All indications point to much higher casualties among the enemy.

Distinguished visitors for the month included Lieutenant General BUSE; Commanding General, FMFPac; Lieutenant General NICKERSON; Commanding General, III MAF; and Major General WHEELER; Commanding General, 1st Marine Division on 7 January. The purpose of this visit was to present the Battalion with the Meritorious Unit Commendation. On 23 January, Brigadier General ROBERTSON, Assistant Division Commander, 1st Marine Division, and Brigadier General DOEHLER, prospective Assistant Division Commander, 1st Marine Division, inspected the Northern Artillery Cantonment prior to Brigadier General ROBERTSON departing RVN. On 27 January Brigadier General ROBERTSON paid his final visit to the Northern Artillery Cantonment. On 31 January, Major General WHEELER visited the Northern Artillery Cantonment to inspect the Cantonment defensive measures.

On 27 January FSB SIXSHOOTER was closed, and Battery A displaced to a position on Hill 10. On the same day, the three tubes of Mortar Battery, First Battalion, 11th Marines displaced from Hill 10 to a new position on Hill 270. Both moves should add depth and versatility to supporting fires for the 26th Marines.

Logistic problems facing the Battalion in support of widely dispersed positions was held to a minimum. Motor transport assets were available in sufficient quantity to accomplish the necessary resupply mission. First Battalion, 13th Marines continues to enjoy one of the lowest deadline rates in the 11th Marines.
