Narrative Summary

Continuous fire support was provided to the 27th Marines during this reporting period. Missions were also fired in support of other units, including 70 for the ARVN, 3 for CAP units, 4 for the KMC's, and 20 for the 11th Marines. The above includes 68 Battalion mass missions.

Three saturation missions were fired for the 3rd Bn, 27th Marines. These missions were fired in confirmed enemy storage areas, booby trap areas, and areas in which repeated contact had been made.

Echo Battery displaced from Hill 55 to their present position on 9 April 1968.

Foxtrot Battery received 6 rounds of incoming mortar resulting in 1 friendly KIA on 14 April 1968.

One platoon from Delta Battery (Delta X-ray) displaced to support 5th Special Forces Group vic YC 965009 on 26 April 1968.

Mortar Battery (-) remains OPCON 1st FAG.

The 2nd Battalion, 13th Marines fired 10353 rounds during this reporting period.
