~~SECRET~~PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period from 1 October through 20 October, Battery K, 4th Battalion, 13th Marines, was in general support of the 7th Marines in the Que Son Mountain and Valley area of Southern I Corps, RVN. Battery K, remained under the command, less opcon of 1st Battalion, 13th Marines and remained under operational control of 11th Marines, Reinforcing 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines.

The Battery fired all types of fire missions during the month, including observed fires, intelligence targets, prep fires, harassing and interdiction fires, and numerous T.O.T's. With the cooperation from the liaison officer 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines, grids on seismic intrusion devices were established for Kilo to fire, but, as of now, have not been fired upon.

3rd Battalion, 11th Marines continued to use Battery K as a general support, reinforcing battery and, as a result, the round expenditure for the period 1 Oct through 20 Oct was less than previous months. The main emphasis during the month was on Planned and H&I type fires, with numerous T.O.T's.

L.Z. ROSS received negative incoming during the period covered as a result no counter mortar/rocket fires were shot.

Kilo Battery continued improvement on its defensive structures with the construction of new F.D.C. bunker, powder bunkers, and numerous strands of concertina and tangle foot wire.
