PART II: NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the reporting period, the Battalion was responsible for the Eastern sector of the 9th Marines TAOR. This responsibility included the occupation and defense of the assigned sector from enemy attack, execution of offensive operations in the assigned sector, maintaining the Main Supply Route open to traffic, establishment and maintenance of a reconnaissance network in the assigned sector, preparation to execute offensive operations beyond the assigned sector, and the support of pacification programs as directed. Three County Fairs were conducted during the reporting period with each lasting approximately 48 hours, and the sweep portions of the County Fair lasting an average of 8 hours. Companies B, C, and D chopped OpCon to other units on several occasions as indicated in paragraph 5 (Special Operations). Except for that stated above, enemy activity consisted mainly of sniper action and booby trapping, and friendly activity consisted of daylight combat and reconnaissance patrols and night ambushes. 1st Battalion, 26th Marines CP was visited by MajGen NICKERSON and Miss Beverly DEERE, correspondent, on 3 February 1967.

During the month of February 686 Military and Civilian vehicles traveled the supply route, with security being furnished from this Battalion. The majority of these vehicles were in route to AN HOA industrial complex.

PART III: SEQUENTIAL LISTING
OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Personnel. During the period the Battalion had a drop in officer and enlisted strength.

a. Losses are as follows:

(1) 6 Marine Officers transferred for duty and 2 transferred by service records by reason of med-evac.

(2) 123 Marine enlisted transferred for duty and 29 by service records by reason of med-evac.

(3) One USN officer and 5 enlisted transferred for duty.

b. Joinings are as follows:

(1) 3 Marine and 1 Navy officer joined for duty.

(2) 47 Marine and 3 Navy enlisted joined for duty.

c. Casualties for the period are as follows:

(1) 8 Marine enlisted KIA.

(2) 2 Marine officers, 24 Marine and 1 Navy enlisted WIA.

2. Administrative. The Marine Corps Disbursing On-site Audit Team visited the command and examined administrative records during the period 15-16 February 1967. The 3rd Marine Division Administrative Inspectors visited during the period 22-28 February 1967, the overall administrative inspection was graded satisfactory with minor discrepancies, legal was considered satisfactory with no discrepancies.

3. Intelligence.

a. Enemy Contacts. There were no significant contacts during February. Enemy activity consisted of long range harassing fire and a reduced amount of mining.

b. Surveillance. A 50 foot tower was completed at the Company C CP (AT 967587). All of Liberty Road North and 50% of Route 14W are kept under surveillance, day and night. Observers in the tower also supported Operation Stone II (1st Marines) by locating and reporting VC movement to the east.

c. Weather. weather conditions, although still influenced by the crachin period, continued to improve. All LOC are trafficable to wheeled vehicles. Cross country movement for both dismounted troops and tracked vehicles was good. A synopsis of the weather for February follows.

4. Training. On the job training was conducted for all MOS's, and the five day indoctrination period for newly arrived personnel continued. In addition, advance training conducted for newly arrived officers and Staff NCO's in supporting arms and demolitions.

The Battalion Psychological Operation Officer attended a three day school on psyops conducted by the 244th PsyOps Company.

A total of 535 Marines from this command received lecture on the M-17 Field Protective Mask, were checked for proper fitting, and went through the gas chamber.

Familiarization firing of the M-16 rifle continued with 475 personnel firing during the month of February. All newly arrived personnel fired their M-14 for battle sights.

5. Special Operations. County Fair 9-39, 9-40, 9-43 were held respectively in DUC KY (2) (AT 967608) on 03-05 February, in South BICH BAC (AT 980622) on 16-18 February, and in BICH NAM (1) (AT 997635) on 22-24 February. A total of 887 Vietnamese civilians were screened resulting in 3 VC KIA. Friendly casualties consisted of 1 USMC WIA (gunshot wound) 1 USMC WIA (Fragmentation Wound) and 1 Vietnamese Village Chief WIA (Fragmentation Wound).

Co D at 010600H chop OpCon to 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines for Operation INDEPENDENCE.

Co B at 030800H chop OpCon to 9th Marine Regiment for Operation INDEPENDENCE.

Co D at 030800H chop OpCon to 1st Battalion, 26th Marines.

Co D at 031300H chop OpCon to Task Force XRAY.

Co B at 080700H chop OpCon to 1st Battalion, 26th Marines.

Co C from 120600H to 151830H in blocking position in support of 1st Marine Regiment for Operation STONE, PHASE I.

Co C from 180800H to 200001H in blocking position in support of the 1st Marine Regiment for Operation STONE, PHASE II and conducted a one day sweep on LA HUAN (2) and CHAU LAU on 19 February.

Psychological operations included aerial speaker broadcasts and leaflet drops, ground speaker broadcasts, and ground leaflet dissemination. Each of the three County Fairs conducted this month were supported by psywar teams using audio-visual aids. Special emphasis was placed on the CHIEU HOI program.

On 12 February the S-3 assigned an action officer for overall direction of the Kit Carson Scout program. The four Kit Carson Scouts within this command have been assigned to rifle companies and have participated in patrol and sweep operations during the month. A comprehensive orientation program was conducted for company commanders in support of the Kit Carson program.

On 15 February, the 51st ARVN Regiment began relocation of civilians into several peace villages, located in the Northern Sector of the 1st Battalion, 26th Marines TAOR.

6. Nuclear, Biological and Chemical Warfare. Nothing significant.
7. Command and Control. The Battalion was commanded by LtCol D. E. NEWTON throughout the reporting period. Company D chop OpCon to Task Force XRAY on 031300H February and remained there throughout the reporting period. 1st Battalion, 26th Marines remain AdCon 3rd Marine Division and OpCon 1st Marine Division.
8. Communications and Electronics. Nothing significant.
9. Close Combat. Nothing significant.
10. Fire Support and Fire Support Coordination. During February artillery fired on targets of opportunity, fired zone fires on suspected enemy positions, harassment and interdiction fires, and registration missions. Both offensive and defensive on-call fires were utilized during the reporting period.

Artillery fired 105 missions against a known enemy during February. Casualties resulting from artillery were reported to be 13 KIA (Conf), and 32 KIA (Prob). Confirmed figures might have been higher, but conditions in many cases precluded an immediate search of the target area. Surveillance by FO's indicated that artillery was both effective and accurate. There were 13 missions of a registration type carried out.

Two 81mm Mortar sections were attached to outlying rifle companies while the other two sections were kept on Hill 55, one on Hill 55 proper and the other on Hill 55, Finger 1, in a general support role. Mortar H&I's, observed and unobserved fire missions were fired during February.

11. Logistics. During this reporting period, the companies were supplied a total of 137,855 pounds of supplies. These supplies were transported 6,787 miles by M54 trucks. In addition to these supplies each of the forward companies were supplied two hot meals each day. Battalion vehicles traveled 25,433 miles in support of the battalion during this reporting period. The addition of two M54 trucks have substantially improved the transportation support.

The most critical problem remains the lack of Motor Transport repair parts. Heavy building materials for bunkers are critical and hampering efforts to improve company positions prior to the monsoon season.

During this reporting period, significant developments in the cantonment/bunker program include a 50' Sniper/Observation Tower, two tent decks, two storage huts, one ammo bunker and two machinegun bunkers.

12. Air Defense. Nothing Significant.

13. Combat Air Support. Nothing Significant.

14. Medical and Dental. The following orders were received. LCDR STONE to 3rd Medical Battalion, Lt GONCHER reported from 3rd Medical Battalion and Lt DEMAGG assumed the duties as battalion surgeon.

During the month 543 Marines were treated at routine sick call. 24 Marine WLA's, 18 of whom were released for duty, and 3 Marine KIA's were handled through the Battalion Aid Station. Average in-patient census for the month was 9.

67 Vietnamese civilians were treated at the Battalion Aid Station and another 1,391 were treated through field MEDCAP facilities.

The Dental Facility treated 108 Marines from this command and 155 Vietnamese civilians through DENTCAP.

15. Chaplain and Moral Welfare. Protestant coverage given by Bn Chaplain. Protestant services held in Battalion CP Sunday mornings, Sunday evenings, and Wednesday evenings; in A Co positions Sunday afternoons; in other line companies on weekdays. No services held for D Co by Bn Chaplain this month while they operated in Chu Lai. Bn Chaplain normally remained with B Co and C Co one night weekly. Total Protestant services held were 19, attended by 503 Marines. Six Bible Classes held in Bn Cp, attended by 53 Marines. Bn Chaplain gave lecture on Religious Customs in Vietnam to 11 replacement troops, counseled with 39 Marines, visited with patients in BAS daily, made visits to 30 patients in 1st Med Bn and NSA Hospital, wrote nine pastoral letters to NOK of deceased Marines, handled 4 cases with AmCross, and distributed over 1,900 New Testaments and religious booklets. Bn Chaplain has continued liaison with American Protestant missionaries in Danang, having one missionary as guest speaker at Protestant service on Hill 55.

Roman Catholic coverage was provided by Regimental Chaplain, 9th Marines, with Mass in Battalion CP Sunday mornings and in forward line companies on weekdays when possible.

Bn Chaplain provided Protestant coverage to 2/12 CP and B/1/11, conducting five services for 58 men.

16. Civic Action. During the month of February the most significant occurrence of civilians response in the CAAOR of this battalion was during the TET holidays. During this period, numerous groups of surrounding villagers came to the hill to present food, candies and flowers to the Marines.

On the 17th of February, construction of an elementary school commenced at BICH BAC. Villagers from that hamlet are building the school with supervisory help of Marines.

There were three County Fairs held for the month.

During the three previously mentioned County Fairs, a detachment from 244th Psychological Warfare Company showed propaganda movies and Walt Disney cartoons for approximately two hours at each fair. They also played Vietnamese music.

During the month, 3,225 Civilian patients were treated at the Medical Civic action programs throughout the Battalion.

(b) Analysis. Although virtually no trace of VC influence was found, the County Fair provided an outstanding opportunity for Civic Action/Psychological Operations, and helped to cement CVN influence in the subject hamlet.

This portion of the program was very successful. Candy was given to children. Volley ball set given to elders to take home for children of hamlet.

(g) showed four (4) films on hygiene and child care. Total time 35 minutes. A one hour demonstration on how to wash with soap and care for children and one hour on how to use oral antiseptic were followed by distribution of soap, Micrin and Listerine.

(h) Tobacco was distributed prior to termination for all the adults.

10. Psychological Operations

(a) A member of the CHIEF HOI program spoke to the elders explaining why he had returned to GVN forces. He distributed five (5) letters to Families believed to have VC relatives which urged the VC to surrender.

(b) Safe conduct passes were given out to be available to relatives of hamlet families.

(c) Propaganda speeches were given to all elders. These speeches attempted to explain why the VC was in Vietnam, what the GVN was doing to aid hamlets and how the war was being conducted. ARVN village chiefs and interpreters spoke.

11. Other Significant Results. Marines mixed freely with families providing an overall congenial atmosphere. Discussions were held on what elders could do to keep VC out of their hamlets, how they could aid our intelligence network and protect themselves. Questions were answered by B-5A. Projects and technical assistance for hamlet were discussed also. This resulted in several recommendations by elders for agricultural assistance.

12. Comments. The overall atmosphere was good. It is believed that much was accomplished in good relations and that this should be followed up by a visit to the hamlet to discuss problems that arise.

12. Comments.

(a) the overall atmosphere was good. The people accepted the GVN-Marine forces, and it is believed that good relations will prevail with them. A follow up visit to discuss more assistance and cooperation should be planned.

(b) MOAP did extremely well. The fact that VN from adjacent villagers attended gives evidence of the confidence which they have in our Medical services. Although the people were initially hesitant to be displaced from their homes, they adjusted rapidly and appeared content.

Regiment cannot go without comment. They performed their function as a sweep element in an aggressive and well trained manner yet at the same time were very responsible as far as the possessions of the villagers were concerned.

b. The PayWar Team is a very essential part of the County Fair Operation. However, during this County Fair equipment failure reduced their effectiveness. For example, the generator required to run their PA system runs out of fuel after about fifteen minutes and therefore limits the time allotted to each speaker.

c. Fifteen tunnels of various sizes ranging from four feet long, three feet high, three feet high to 15 feet long, 3 feet high and 3 feet high were found. In each case the tunnel was cleared using CS grenades and the tunnel was then destroyed using charges of C-4 or TNT varying from 2 1/2 pounds to 15 pounds.
