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PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The month of June proved to be an interesting period for 2/26.

The Bn. departed Operation Cimмерon June 5th and moved by motor march from the Cam Lo Area to Phu Bai. On arrival at Phu Bai the first few days were spent surveying clothing and 782 gear, getting record books up to date, and general rest and relaxation for 2/26.

On June 8th, 2/26 started operations in the Phu Bai TAOR. First relieving 3/26 in the last phase of Operation Golden Fleese in the Troui Area.

During the month 2/26 conducted Plt and Company size saturation patrolling and ambush operation throughout the TAOR. In addition many search and destroy missions were conducted in coordination with the Houng Thuy and Phu Loc district Chiefs.

2/26 assumed OPCON of CAC A and H and supported their mission in the form of Sqd and Plt size patrols and ambushes in the CAP TAOR.

Contact with the enemy was restricted to small unit action on ambush and patrols. Cumulative Losses were: Friendly WIA -12. Enemy KIA (C) 18; KIA (P) 2; Detainees 25; POW 1; Wpns Capt 9.

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INTELLIGENCE

CAM LO-CON THIEN AREA: (Operation Cimarron, 1-5 June 67).

1. Summary of Enemy Situation at beginning of period.
 - a. No enemy activity had occurred in the battalion ZOA since 29 May 67.
2. Summary of Enemy activity during the period.
 - a. No contact was made with the enemy at any time during the operation. Evidence of recent enemy movement through the ZOA was found but no contacts were made.
3. Weather and Terrain
 - a. No adverse weather conditions occurred.
 - b. The terrain consisted primarily of hills (ranging in heights up to 190 meters) which were predominately covered with elephant grass. Scattered strands of trees were generally found on the slopes of the hills and in the valley basins. The trees within the strands were sufficiently dense to prohibit direct movement through them, but sufficient avenues of approach existed to permit relatively easy movement around these dense strands.

HUE PHU BAI: (5-30 June 67)

1. Summary of Enemy situation at beginning of period.
 - a. Reports received from the 1st CIT, 7th ITT, and the CAC Companies indicated that the enemy were concentrating their main efforts on rice collections. The enemy increased his rice taxation on the villagers that had recently harvested their rice crops from the fields located generally north and east of HUE PHU BAI.
2. Summary of Enemy activity during the period.
 - a. The only offensive activity the enemy initiated was to conduct six hit-and-run ambushes against CAC or Marine patrols, and sniper/harrassing fire on seven occasions. Three villagers one male with the RD program, one village chief and one female who had helped CAC units were reported to be assassinated and two villagers were kidnapped. The two may have been kidnapped to replace local VC who have been killed, but it is more likely that they are being held hostage to insure that their families "contribute" rice to the local NVA/VC forces.

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4. Weather and Terrain

- a. No adverse weather conditions occurred.
- b. The area around HUE PHU BAI is predominately flat coastal lowlands which are in turn bordered on the north and east by the Gulf of TONKIN and to the south by the mountains which are an eastern extension of the Annamite Chain. The flat coastal lowlands is mostly under rice cultivation. Along the coast, many sand dunes are encountered. In the areas not under cultivation, vegetation ranges from grasslands, brushwood thickets, and strands of bamboo. Hedgerows are often found around hamlets and rice fields. Many of the mountains are bare of vegetation but for the most part they are covered by a dense broadleaf evergreen forest. The taller trees reach heights of 75-90 feet, with some ranging to 150 feet. The canopy is generally continuous, and in areas where it is broken, a thicker undergrowth with spring rattans, full bushes, vines, and briars will be encountered.

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OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

1. Missions

a. Mission assigned. During the period 1 June to 30 June 1967 the Battalion was assigned the following mission.

- (1) Establish and maintain a reconnaissance screen throughout assigned TAOR and OA's when assigned.
- (2) Conduct unilateral offensive operations within assigned TAOR and OA's as directed.
- (3) Conduct unilateral and/or coordinated offensive operations in Division Area of responsibility as directed.
- (4) Occupy and defend PHU BAI Vital Area and assigned TAOR.
- (5) Maintain combat outpost on hills #180 and 230.
- (6) Provide security for rough riders to BONG VA, etc and for the minesweep teams.
- (7) Maintain not only Sparrowhawk platoon on 5 minute alert, but also reaction company and rough rider reserve.
- (8) Assume OPCON of CAC A and H, providing reinforcements as required.
- (9) Be prepared to counterattack against possible enemy penetration into TAOR.
- (10) Conduct coordinated U.S./GVN operations including a concentrated and sustained civic action program within TAOR in support of Revolutionary Development.
- (11) Control and maintain routes of communications within TAOR.

b. Major operations conducted: 1 June to 5 June 1967 Operation Cimarron.

30 June 1967 At 1710H Sparrowhawk plt. deployed to YC 905959 by helo. Upon landing helo received 8 rounds of SAF. Squad swept area and one man detonated AP mine resulting in one USMC WIA.

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At 2100H CAC-A6 squad patrol observed 4 VC at YD 830176. Fired on VC with SAF. VC fled to NE. Searched area with negative results.

At 2245H CAC-H7 security squad saw movement to their front at ZD 194009. Point opened up with a burst of SAF. When fire stopped one round was heard from an unknown source and a scream was heard from a house 40 meters from where movement was seen. While searching house squad found a wounded Vietnamese woman who died before medevac could be accomplished.

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DECLASSIFIED**LOGISTICS****1. Logistics**

a. Supply activity during the month of June centered around resupply of units in the field and replenishment of damaged or lost equipment subsequent to the field operations. From the 1st of June to the 5th of June this battalion was on Operation Cimarron. During this operation we had our organic supply located in PHU BAI. We were given satisfactory logistical support by FLSU-1 located in DONG HA. On 6 June this battalion moved by convoy from Camp Carroll to the PHU BAI Vital Defense Area. At 1200 on 8 June 1967 this battalion assumed responsibility for defense of the PHU BAI Area. This is the first time in two months that our whole battalion has been together and this has alleviated some of our logistical problems. Our principal agent for resupply is now FLSG-A. This month has seen only two of our "priority #2" requisitions filled. We hope upon complete introduction of the "MUMMS" system, that our resupply will become more rapid and constant.

b. Maintenance within the battalion on 1st and 2nd echelon is going along as well as can be expected without receiving any spare parts. Receipt of spare parts has gone from spasmodic to nil. During this month an FMFPac LTI Team visited this battalion and consulted our Motor Transport on proper preventative maintenance on the 1st echelon level. Most weapons and communications equipment were returned to FLSG-A for repair. Support of critical items that should have been returned to this battalion is being done slowly.

c. Food Service: A battalion mess has been established here in the PHU BAI Area. This battalion is presently feeding three (3) hot meals a day and on any given day at least half of the battalion is here to take advantage. Our mess has to have one (1) household truck each day in order to draw "A" and "B" rations, haul trash and refill water trailers. Our mess fed half of 1st Battalion, 3d Marines the evening on 23 June. The drainage system was cleaned out this month and also the Division LTI Team checked our reefers for proper maintenance. Screens are in the process of being replaced. A medical team from our BAS makes a weekly sanitary inspection of the mess hall and surrounding area.

d. Transportation and roads: Now that the battalion is located in the PHU BAI Area we are able to completely resupply ourselves by use of our household trucks. The only problem area in transportation is when we are only given one (1) household truck; this only happens about 25% of the time. The tactical commitments are met with enthusiasm and even on short notice Division Transportation has not failed to come to our service. Most of our resupply to units in the field is done by helicopter and there are no problem areas here. When we resupply by vehicles, in most cases, we accomplish this with two mites and trailers.

e. Water resupply in the PHU BAI Area is very satisfactory with respect to potable and non-potable water. On resupply of units in the field there has not been one case in which we had to supply water.

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f. Motor Transport within the battalion was improved by the establishment of all vehicles into a central battalion motor pool. Weekly preventative maintenance is being done on each vehicle, but due to lack of spare parts our vehicles are rapidly deteriorating.

g. Embarkation: This was mainly concerned with the movement of this battalion from Camp Carroll to PHU BAI. This was done by convoy of thirty-five trucks. During the month of June our battalion Embarkation NCO brought all of our embarkation data up to date.

h. Hospitalization and Evacuation: Casualties from field operations are medevaced to "A" Med or to our BAS, located in our battalion area. Upon moving into the PHU BAI Area our BAS has set up a small ward to handle patients that do not need further evacuation. Evacuation from the field is being done by helicopters with a very rapid response when called.

1. Mission. To conduct a civic action program that will enhance the prestige of the civil government and to conduct psychological operations to further the efforts of the Government of Vietnam in re-establishing its effective control over the people.
2. Civic Action Projects and Operations. There were no civic action activities for the first seven days of the month due to tactical operations and the movement of the battalion to Phu Bai. On 8 June this unit assumed civic action responsibility for the village of Loc Bon from the 3d Battalion, 26th Marines. The following civic action was conducted from 8 June to 30 June.
 - a. Provided cement for four wells in the village. All work was performed by the villagers. Three of the wells were in use on 30 June.
 - b. Work was completed on the four hog pens in An Nong #3. Cement was provided by the Marines. The villagers did the work and provided the rest of the material with the understanding that the Marines would provide the hogs when the pens were complete. Delivery of the hogs is expected in the near future.
 - c. Arrangements were made with the Village Chief for the completion of the school project in An Nong #1. The Marines will provide 150 bags of cement to the Chief. This cement will be used to pay for the labor and material for the doors, windows, flagpole and archway at the school.
 - d. Work continued on the project to build six heads in the village.
 - e. The projects for the new market place and dispensary are still in the planning stages.
 - f. MEDCAP by the Battalion Medical Officer and his team of corpsman treated 306 patients in Loc Bon.

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4. Remarks. It is too early to tell what effect the civic action efforts have had on the people of Loc Bon. The Village Chief seems interested in providing a better life for his people. The village is not secure from the VC and the Infrastructure has not been eliminated. The civic action efforts to date have all been close to Route #1 and the Combined Action Platoon. In the future it will be necessary to move the projects further into the hamlets where all of the people will benefit from them.

2. Mission. Conduct search and clear operation in AO vic CAC A-3.

3. Execution.

- a. One rifle company will be inserted to operate in AO vic CAC A-3 (see Operations Overlay).
- b. Co H, 2d Bn, 26th Marines.
 - (1) Commencing at 291600H June 1967, move by foot march to vic CAC A-3.
 - (2) Conduct search and clear operation in OA until ordered to return.
- c. Coordinating Instructions.
 - (1) H-hour is 291600H June 1967.
 - (2) Submit daytime activities not later than 1600H the day prior and night activities not later 1400H daily.
 - (3) No estimation on length of operation.
 - (4) Do not destroy captured food and medicines; report their locations and await instructions.
 - (5) Curfew hours for HOUNG THOY and PHU LOC Districts are 2000H to 0600H.
