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## PART II

## NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of August, 2/26 continued operations in the Phu Bai TAOR. The major part of Battalion activities consisted of company and platoon size patrol and ambush operations and company and platoon size search and clear operations in both the Huong Thuy District and the Phu Loc District. Areas covered included Lang Co, Phu Loc, Troui River, Gia Le, Nong River, and Nuoc Ngot. 2/26 also provided squad and platoon size units to supplement CAC-A and CAC-H operations throughout the TAOR.

The Battalion participated in two operations during the month: Operation Rush in which two companies were OPCON to 4th Marines from 4 August to 9 August, and Operation Liberty which began on 30 August and included the entire Battalion.

Two special operations were held during the month: from 27-29 August, one company conducted a modified County Fair operation in CAC-H6, and on 29 August one company in conjunction with ARVN, PFS, and PRU personnel conducted a one day village sweep at Phu Tu. Scuba teams, dog teams, Kit Carson scouts, armed propaganda teams, and Provincial Reconnaissance units were used throughout the month with excellent results.

The Battalion provided units to meet several miscellaneous commitments. Forward Observers were provided for Roadrunners to Cumberland and Fremont for the entire month, one platoon provided security on Hill 840 ( YC 766963) from 1-17 August, one company maintained a continuous Sparrowhawk platoon and Sparrowhawk reserve for the entire month, one company provided Phu Bai perimeter security from 11-29 August, one platoon provided security on Hills 180 and 230 for the entire month, one platoon provided CB security at CAC-H headquarters from 15-31 August and one platoon provided security for the Fremont Roadrunner from 22-29 August.

The Battalion continued to coordinate the Phu Bai Vital Area Defense. Improvements in wire and bunkers were accomplished and a new alarm siren was installed. Reaction drills and counter mortars/rocket drills were held throughout the month.

Contact with the enemy was limited to small unit action.

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## INTELLIGENCE

HUE-PHU BAI TAOR

## 1. Enemy Situation at Beginning of Period

a. The enemy had previously avoided any major contact in this area, and appeared to be concentrating his activities on sniper fire, harassment of CAC and ARVN units, probing installations, interdiction of Hwy 1 with mines, and maintaining control over the local populace. Intelligence reports indicated that another main force battalion, the K-4B (formally the 802d from the "Street Without Joy" area) had been relocated in the Phu Loc District area. A significant contact which tends to substantiate this report is listed below.

SUBSTANTIATE

(1) On the 1st of August a contact was made with an enemy platoon sized unit approximately 5.2 miles (ZC 117985) east-southeast from Phu Loc District Headquarters. The significances of this contact were:

(a) It was the first daylight contact with a platoon size unit since the battalion arrived in the area.

(b) The enemy unit remained in the same area overnight, which is contrary to his "hit and run" tactics, then engaged a friendly patrol with mortar fire the next morning - the enemy in this area do not normally employ mortars during daylight hours.

(2) One sighting of enemy wearing NVA helmets was made, and NVA helmets were captured on two other separate occasions.

## 2. Significant Events During the Period

a. Based on intelligence information obtained by interrogation of a Chieu Hoi VC lieutenant, Operation Rush, conducted by 2/4 with two companies of this battalion OPCON, was commenced on the 4th of August.

(1) This operation succeeded in routing the K-4 Bn (AKA 804th) from their base camp, and uncovering a large amount of documents.

b. In conjunction with this operation, extensive daylight patrols and nighttime ambushes were conducted by this battalion in all known or suspected enemy areas of operation within the PHU BAI TAOR.

c. The combined results of these operations was that the enemy's procurement of rice for the coming monsoon, a task he was charged with accomplishing prior to 10 August, was severely impaired.

(1) A total of eight Chieu Hoi's that rallied during the period from 10-20 August all stated that enemy rations were low.

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(2) If another enemy unit has moved into this area, as intelligence indicates, this unit will have caused a drain on the enemy's present supply of rice.

(3) Subsequent search and destroy operations throughout the PHU BAI TAOR resulted in the capture of 10,882 pounds of rice.

### 3. Summary of Enemy Activity

a. The enemy steadily increased his activities throughout the month. This was due in part, to his need to step-up his rice acquisition however, the forth coming elections in September was the enemy's primary concern.

b. The interdiction of Hwy 1 was increased, to include more frequent sniper incidents, and the employment of a 57 RR on one occasion.

c. The enemy stepped-up terrorism against the local populace, killing 11, and kidnapping 39 Vietnamese. Many reports of the enemy taking ID cards from villagers were reported - they cannot vote without an ID card.

d. On the 29th of August, the enemy successfully mortared the MAG-16 area, the ARVN training center of DONG DA, CAC Alpha HQ, and a radio station.

(1) It is believed that the MAG-16 area, and the ARVN training center was primarily mortared as part of his plan to influence or interfere with the forth coming National Elections on 3 Sept. Mortar attacks on CAC Alpha and the radio station were followed with ground attacks, with the CAC Alpha unit being hit as a diversionary attack to prevent their sending a reaction force to the radio station which was the enemy's primary target. The radio station was hit from all sides, the enemy employed mortars and 57RR fire and managed to penetrate the perimeter, resulting in at least 10 KIA, and 32 WIA, 2 buildings, 2 bunkers, and 1 vehicle destroyed.

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### 5. Weather and Terrain


a. No adverse weather conditions occurred.

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b. The area around HUE-PHU BAI is predominately flat coastal lowlands which are in turn bordered on the north and east by the Gulf of Tonkin, and to the south by the mountains which are an eastern extension of the Annamite Chain. The flat coastal lowlands is mostly under rice cultivation. Along the coast, many sand dunes are encountered.

In the areas not under cultivation, vegetation ranges from grasslands, brushwood thickets, and strands of bamboo. Hedgerows are often found around hamlets and rice fields. Many of the mountains are bare of vegetation but for the most part they are covered by a dense broadleaf evergreen forest. The taller trees reach heights of 75-90 feet, with some ranging to 150 feet. The canopy is generally continuous, and in areas where it is broken, a thicker undergrowth with spiny rattans, full bushes, vines, and briars will be encountered.

  
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## OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

1. Missions

- (1) Establish and maintain a reconnaissance screen throughout assigned TAOR and OA's when assigned.
- (2) Conduct unilateral offensive operations within assigned TAOR and OA's as directed.
- (3) Conduct unilateral and/or coordinated offensive operations in Division Area responsibility as directed.
- (4) Occupy and defend PHU BAI Vital Area and assigned TAOR.
- (5) Maintain combat outpost on Hills 180 and 230.
- (6) Provide security for Rough Riders to DONG HA, DANANG, etc. and for the minesweep teams.
- (7) Maintain not only Sparrow Hawk platoon on 5 minute alert, but also reaction company and Rough Rider Reserve.
- (8) Assume OPCON of CAC A and H, providing reinforcements as required.
- (9) Be prepared to counterattack against possible enemy penetration into TAOR.
- (10) Conduct coordinated US/GVN operations including a concentrated and sustained civic action program within TAOR in support of Revolutionary Development.
- (11) Control and maintain routes of communications within TAOR.

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## LOGISTICS

## 1. Logistics

During the month of August Battalion Supply continued to support the activities of this unit in the defense of Phu Bai. Every effort was made to obtain those critical items needed to take motor transport and communications equipment off deadline and some success was obtained, but by no means enough. A total of 40 ML89 handsets for PRC-25 radios and 500 magazine assemblies for M-16's were obtained. Antenna 271A and antenna bases AB-591 for PRC-25 radios are still in short supply and on priority 02 requisition. Cleaning material for the M-16 has become available in limited quantities. The blankets and field jackets turned into FLSG-A for cleaning were returned. Again this month the Battalion's requisition for 7 PRC-25 radios and one 60mm mortar base plate remain unfilled. One M274A2 was received on 24 August. 500 Lightweight utilities were received, but small sizes are difficult to obtain. Enough socks arrived in late August to meet the immediate needs of the Battalion. Fortification material in large quantities was obtained from FLSG-A for the defense of the Phu Bai Combat Base. The maintenance situation did improve somewhat during the month. The sole cause is the lack of repair parts support. The battalion is receiving electrical power from generators at FLSG-A and a 600 cubic foot reefer has been installed at the mess hall. Ice cream is now available every other day. The mess hall fed on a number of occasions a Battalion (-) of the Fourth Marines in addition to the 2/26 personnel and those rear areas personnel from other Battalions in this area. The mess hall is still in dire need of furniture. As far as transportation is concerned the Battalion is furnished three trucks for administrative purposes on a daily basis. This month more often than last they have not been available due to tactical situations. There have been no problems procuring transportation for tactical moves. Requests for helicopter support for recon, resupply, and 1 tactical move have been met completely.




