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INTELLIGENCE

HUE-PHU BAI TAOR

1. Enemy Situation at Beginning of Period

a. The enemy continued close contact with friendly forces employing small arm harassing fire, mortar attacks, booby trap tactics and road interdictions by the use of mines.

2. Significant Activities

a. The enemy increased his mortar attacks (17), within the 2/26 area of responsibility with CAC H-6 being the prime target.

b. The enemy interdiction of Highway #1 did not increase during this reporting period from the last, however, it was more effective. Highway #1 was mined 7 times and there were 9 attempts at destroying bridges, (2 bridges were completely destroyed).

c. There was 28,900 pounds of rice requisitioned during the reporting period, 22,400 pounds of which was recovered by the National Police. The four primary areas from which this rice was captured are; Thon Nam Phu Can (2) (YD 959041), Thon Luong Van (4), Thon Luong Van (3) and Ap Phu Bai (1) (YD 905116).

d. There were five sightings of 50 or more enemy troops within the 2/26 area of responsibility. The majority of the movement was on the western side of Highway #1 and the direction of movement was in either a northwesterly or northeasterly direction. The location of these sightings were: (YD 905101), (YD 924081), (YD 955057), (YD 942032) and (ZD 065011).

e. Recent PW and Chieu Hoi's indicate the presence of 3 new units now located outside the general vicinity of the Phu Bai Vital Area. The 402d Bn (AK4; K.2, AKA; 1st Bn/9th Regt) is reportedly located in Nam Hoa mountains; C-19 Engineer Company and the C-34 Sabotage Company, both subordinate to the 9th Regt (located in Base 101), however, now reported to have been detached and sent to the southern Thua Thien mountain area to join a 4th Regiment. Rallier Trang of the C-19 Engr Co., stated that the latter two units were moving east from the Bach Ma Road in the vicinity of (ZD 0898) on 11 Oct 1967.

3. Summary of Enemy Activity

a. The first half of October was characterized by the extensive harassing attacks. Especially significant were the VC/NVA initiated activities of interdicting route 1 and mortaring of CAC compounds.

b. The bridges or culverts, at or near the following locations, were blown: (YD 926102), (ZD 137010), (ZD 167011), twice, (ZD 076010), (ZD 071011), (ZD 094006), (ZD 056025), and (AU 851001).

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c. The mining of Route 1 has decreased significantly in the month of October from the previous reporting period.

d. Incidents of harassing mortar attacks have been limited to the southern area of Phu Loc District; although the number of incidents was not significantly increased, the intensity of the attacks were. It is significant to note that the following mortar attacks took place primarily during the first ten days of the month: (ZG 139009), 30 rounds; (ZD 134000), 5 rounds; (ZG 108-994), 22 rounds; (ZG 100986), 2 rounds; (ZD 152001), 3 rounds; (ZD 139009), 7 rounds; and (ZG 159902), 7 rounds.

2. The above mentioned activities substantiated an agent report that the VC/NVA were going to launch a two phase attack during the month of October. The first phase, from 1-10 October, was to include the launching of harassing ground/mortar attacks against isolated US/ARVN outposts coupled with blowing bridges in an attempt to interdict Route #1. The second phase from 8-15 October, was to consist of the launching of an all out ground attack against a major US installation or against the City of Hue. Recent reports indicate that the second phase of the operation has been postponed as a result of the weather and the change in disposition of local Marine units, although reports indicate that attacking units are presently on a stand-by status.

e. Interrogation reports/or Chieu Hoi's and PWs continue to indicate that the morale of the local VC is extremely low due primarily to the severe shortage of food and the harsh conditions in which they have to operate. It is interesting to note, however, that reports indicate that the NVA units are adequately supplied in "hard" material, that their morale is comparatively high, and that they are anxious to engage in battle. A total of 2 PWs, 4 Chieu Hoi's were recorded during this reporting period; 14 weapons were also captured.

f. The NVA have not conducted any major or significant acts of terrorism or sabotage in the period immediately preceding the 22 Oct elections, however, the successful blowing of the bridges at CAC 4-3, CAC H-1 and the Phu Loc Dist HQ's will undoubtedly be used in their propaganda war against the Allied Forces.

5. Weather and Terrain

a. In general, the weather had no adverse affects on operations. However, a considerable increase in precipitation was recorded, 15.03 inches, (an increase of 5.31 inches), in the form of short rain showers. The rain showers occurred on 19 days during the reporting period, 4 days less than September.

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TRAINING

1. Training in the battalion during the month of October emphasized those particular subjects designated as priority and the zeroing of new personnel joining the battalion.

NCO school commenced and companies designated as Sparrow Hawk conducted classes.

2. Classes Conducted

a. Priority subjects taught during the month:

- (1) M-16 Rifle
- (2) Ambush and Counter-Ambush.
- (3) Patrolling.
- (4) Principle of Leadership.
- (5) Vietnamese Religion and Customs.

b. Other training conducted included:

- (1) CIT class on handling POWs.
- (2) Lesson Plans were submitted prior to each class and reviewed by the S-3 section. Subsequently a member of the operations section monitored at least one class a day. A significant improvement in our training has been noted.
- (3) Zeroing of the M-16 Rifle for 205 new personnel was conducted at the Vietnamese Army Training Center at Dong Da (Phu Bai Area) during October. All zeroing was done on established ranges.

3. Formal Schools

a. Seven Marines attended Formal School training.

- (1) One CPL and one L/CPL attended NCO School.
- (2) One CPL attended Crypto School.
- (3) One 2nd Lt. attended Military Justice Course.
- (4) Two CPLs attended Embark School.
- (5) One L/CPL attended Infantry Weapons Repair School.

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NUCLEAR, BIOLOGICAL, CHEMICAL and other SPECIAL TYPES of WARFARE

1. NBC and other Special Types of Warfare.

- a. During October all the NBC teams as required by Battalion Order 340C,1A were formed.
- b. A training schedule was drawn up by the Battalion NBC Officer and NCO containing Lesson Plans and schedules.
- c. The training schedule has been distributed to the companies who have begun classes on Chemical Warfare.
- d. Because of the tactical commitments of the Battalion it is anticipated that it will take a good deal of time until a satisfactory degree of training is achieved.

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COMMAND AND CONTROL

1. Command and Control

a. Mission. During the period 1 Oct to 31 Oct 1967 the Battalion was assigned the following mission.

(1) Support the defense of the Phu Bai Vital Area, Combined Action Platoons, National Route #1, and conduct offensive operations in the Phu Bai TAOR and adjacent areas.

(2) Maintain close operations coordination with CAG Phu Bai with emphasis on security and support of RD activities.

(3) Conduct rice denial operations in coordination with appropriate government officials.

(4) On order provide security forces for scheduled Rough Rider operations.

(5) Maintain close operation coordination with Base Defense Coordinator, Phu Bai.

(6) During daylight hours maintain Sparrow Hawk reaction force on fifteen minute alert.

(7) On order conduct planned program of County Fair operations.

(8) Maintain rapid reaction capability to counter enemy attacks against low-level government structures.

(9) Conduct security operations along Route #1 (Phu Bai to 1st MarDiv Boundary) in support of MCR upgrading project.

(10) On order provide security for hydrographic and/or topographic being conducted in areas contiguous to Phu Bai TAOR.

(11) Support as required combat operations being conducted in areas contiguous to Phu Bai TAOR.

(12) Maintain OPCON one attached rifle company (Rein) as security for Nam Hoa Rock Crusher and Bridge.

c. COMMAND POSTS

(1) The companies were deployed in three general areas during October.

- (a) The company working the southern sector of operation which extended to the 1st Marine Division boundary had its' CP at the Phu Loc District HQs.
- (b) The company assigned the northern sector of the Phu Bai TAOR usually located its' CP at the Combined Action Platoon 2, Hotel Company because it is centrally located for control purposes.
- (c) The company assigned road and bridge security throughout the Phu Bai TAOR located its' CP within the Phu Bai TAOR because of the necessity to coordinate with various supporting agencies.

d. Attachments and detachments: Lima Company, 3d Battalion, 26th Marines OPCON.

e. Control

(1) All companies are controlled by radio and/or land line from the Combat Operations Center located within the Phu Bai Vital area. Three companies which were deployed in the field and guarded the Battalion Tac net and could also communicate with Headquarters via the Combined Action Platoons located within their sector of operation. One company remained in the Phu Bai Vital Area during the day, providing Sparrowhawk (reaction/explositation force) and communicating by land line. At nightfall the company deployed around the Phu Bai Vital Area providing

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ambush sites between 500 and 1500 meters from the protective wire. Once deployed, the company guarded the Battalion Tac net.

(2) The primary difficulty of control is inherent in the mission assigned. In order to provide saturation patrolling throughout the Phu Bai TAOR, units must be spread over relatively large distances. Therefore, radios on occasion have difficulty reaching the COC, causing us to relay from OPs located on high ground in the TAOR.

f. Problem Areas

(1) There are two problem areas.

(a) The weather has caused us to rotate our companies more often than desired. This problem is encountered only with the advent of the monsoon season.

(b) Mobility is another problem area. Due to the size of the TAOR, limited helicopter support, availability of trucks and distances involved, it is extremely difficult to mass sufficient troops to meet threats or targets of opportunity. Added flexibility and mobility would greatly improve our ability to accomplish our mission more effectively.

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CLOSE COMBAT

1. Close Combata. Operations conducted(1) Patrols

(a) Saturation patrolling by platoon and squads was conducted throughout the Phu Bai TAOR pursuant to our mission. Platoon patrol bases are established during daylight with squad size patrols radiating from the base. At darkness each platoon breaks into units of 15 to 20 men for ambushing and moves clandestinely into pre-reconnoitered ambush sites. Squad ambushes are utilized in order to provide greater coverage within the TAOR. See enclosure (1).

(b) The employment of the claymore mine has improved as the Marines become more familiar with their use and capability. One ambush conducted by Co F on the night of 30 October achieved excellent results by initiating an ambush with claymores. The results were 3 KIA(c) and 3 KIA(p).

(2) Operations

(a) One platoon operation was conducted by Lima Co 3/26 which is under OPCON of 2/26. A blocking force and sweep force were inserted by rubber boats across the Song Huu Trach and Song Ta Trach River. The subsequent sweep of the peninsula brought negative results. See enclosure (2). Platoons often employed their three squads in ambushes which were in close proximity and mutually supporting. The Platoon Commander was centrally located in order to control all three squads. An example of such employment and resulting success was the night of 6 Oct. 12 VC hit the 2nd Squad, 1st Platoon, "F" Co and were taken under fire. As the VC broke from FA3 they hit the 3d Squad which also fired forcing the VC into the 1st squads position. After the fire fight a sweep of the killing zone revealed 4 KIA(c) and 2 KIA(p). Also many weapons were captured. Only one Marine was wounded. See enclosure (1).

(b) A company size rescue operation was conducted from 10 to 14 Oct. An Airforce C-130 crashed on a mountain about 15 miles south of Phu Bai. E Company was committed by helicopter and landed below the mountain. The company moved all afternoon and when darkness set in the company commander requested aerial illumination and moved to a crash site under the illumination. A company minus was also provided for Rough Rider (convoy) security to either Camp Evans or Lang Ha as the primary infantry security element. On 13 October, "F" Company was employed for road and bridge security along National Route #1 throughout the Phu Bai TAOR because four bridges were

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destroyed by the VC in a one week period. See enclosure (3) and (4). A brainstorming session was conducted by the S-3 with company commanders and other experienced officers in order to determine means to protect a bridge. The results provided guidelines for requesting additional support for F Company to be employed on the Bridges. See enclosure (4) to (5). The security provided by "F" Company with such additional support as sentry dogs, SID's, generators and lights, barbed wire and VN National Police proved very successful.

(c) The sole Battalion operation was our participation in Operation Liberty II which lasted from 18 to 23 October. This operation was designed to prevent enemy interference with the National Vietnamese elections by interdiction and denying enemy access to populated areas on Route #1. G Co secured the LZ for the SLF the night before the actual landing. The SLF 2/3 landed on 17 Oct and conducted similar operations in adjacent TAOR. See enclosure (6).

(d) One joint operation was conducted between 23 to 29 Oct in conjunction with the Vietnamese National Police. On 19 October the S-3 and S-3A made liaison with Mr Jack SANDERS and Mr. RAYHARKINS, the American Advisor to the VN National Police in Huc. The following VN forces were promised for joint Cordon and sweep operation:

2 squads, National Police - 24
2 Platoon, MP Field Forces - 80
2 squads, Special Branch - 24
(used at Infra structure)
2 squads, Resources Control - 24

An area within the Phu Bai Vital Area was obtained and ten CP tents were erected in order to house the VN forces which arrived by VN vehicles at 231500H Oct. Other logistics support was provided as necessary. A briefing tent was also erected containing full map and aerial photo coverage of the areas of operations. A briefing was conducted for HCO's, SNCO's and officers of the Marine units participating. The VN National Police officers were briefed by their American Advisors. See enclosure (7). Two Marine companies were to provide the cordon on alternating days during a six day period. All cordons were established prior to the VN National Police moving in for the search. Six areas adjacent to the Phu Bai Vital Area were targeted for the cordon and search operations. See enclosure (8). The first operation commenced at 0500 24 October in the villages of Xom Con Tan and Then An Nongi. The first operation produced many problem areas but these problems were solved one by one as we progressed through the six objectives. Upon conclusion of the joint operation both sides were very proficient at their individual functions. ~~Japanese~~ rice caches were uncovered totalling many tons of rice. The

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village chiefs of the respective village where the caches were found were contacted by the S-5 and he requested that the rice be centrally stored for security reasons. We achieved success in this area also. Several draft dodgers and Vietnamese indicated on the Black list were also uncovered and sent to jail in Hue. With the success of this pilot program we hope to run additional operations with the VN National Police in the near future. A letter of appreciation was forwarded to the Chief of the National Police in Hue.

B. Significant Events

01 Oct 67 At 0430H, received info from Division COC that VC mines destroyed culverts at ZD 059021, 100% destroyed. (ARVN's repairing). At ZD 070012 80% destroyed (Marines repairing). At AU 846001 60% destroyed (ARVN's repairing). All are impassable.

At 0645H, Company G vic ZD 095007 received total of 30 82mm Mortar Rounds, 6-57mm RR Rds, 300 .50 Caliber, and 400 Rds SAF from vic ZD 095982-ZD 100983. CB's had two vehicles damaged and 1 CB WIA. 3 USMC WIA (minor). ARVN's reported 1 KIA and 12 WIA, 4 ARVN vehicles were damaged. Company G fired 56 Rds counter-mortar plan and ARVN's fired 30 RDS 105's. Company G patrol sent to area following air strikes and found 1 57mm RR position with 6 expended Rds and six fighting holes.

At 0807H, 2/26 Minesweep vic ZD 052026 made contact with 15 VC with 2 automatic weapons vic ZD 053024. Minesweep security returned fire, enemy fire ceased. Continued with minesweep, when point reached bridge at ZD 056025, VC blew bridge, at this time received 10-15 rds sniper fire from vic ZD 052012. Returned fire with .50 Cal. and M-60 MG's. VC broke contact. Results: 3 USMC WIA. At 1010H, CB's made road passable.

At 1100H, CAC-H7 checked bridge at ZD 108013, finding North side of bridge was blown. Middle and right pillars also were blown. Bridge Commander reported a large explosion and received 2 M-79 Rds, and much SAF and AWF from North. Fire was returned. VC broke contact. Searched area with negative results. Bridge impassable for large trucks.

At 1345H, CAC-H5 patrol made sweep checking homes and boats on river vic ZD 081014, finding 4 VN Males, which were checked by PF and village police and found to be a Draft-Dodger. Detainees taken to District HQ at Phu Loc.

At 2055H, CAC-H8 patrol ambushed 5 VC vic ZD 966013. Results: 1 VC KIA(c) and 1 automatic weapon captured.

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02 Oct 67 At 1145H, 2/26 Minesweep reported bridge at AU 851001 was blown. Bridge impassable.

At 2230H, CAC-H3 obtained 3 detainees at ZD 141009. Detainees turned over to ITT at CAC-H6 position.

03 Oct 67 At 0200H, CAC-H6 vic ZD 189009 received 6 60mm Mortar Rds at ZD 134000 and about 20 SAF, resulting in 1 PF WIA. MedEvac.

At 2300H, Company H patrol spotted 175 VC moving NE at YD 905101. Rear security of ambush spotted VC, but were unable to move ambush position in time to engage VC. VC were carrying rifles and rice baskets. Area swept at first light with negative results.

04 Oct 67 At 0315H, CAC-H1 reported bridge at YD 926103 was blown. Bridge impassable to vehicles. Area swept with negative results, 2 USMC WIA (minor).

At 0430H, Company F detained 1 VN male who walked into their ambush. Detainee turned over to CIT.

05 Oct 67 At 1145H, CAC-H2 PF on watch spotted 2 people on road vic YD 934085 without ID cards who had large amount of money. Detainees turned over to CIT.

At 1700H, CB Security (G/2/26) detained 2 persons at ZD 114013. Detainees turned over to CIT.

At 2220H, Company G ambushed 3 VC at YD 909110. VC returned fire and broke contact. 2 USMC WIA. MedEvac chopper returning to Phu Bai received 5 to 10 Rds SAF from YD 899126 at 052315H and crashed at YD 902120, 1 USMC WIA. Chopper evacuated all on board. 2/26 dispatched a Plt to provide security for downed chopper. Chopper pick-up completed by 061600H and security element returned. Company F swept area and found 1 NVA helmet, various items of 782 gear, and 1 bloody battle dressing. 1 VC KIA (p).

06 Oct 67 At 0200H, CAC-A3 patrol went to bridge on Highway #1 YD 913117, after hearing PF's firing. PF's had spotted bubbles in water. Area checked with negative results. As CAC-A3 patrol was returning to CP more firing was heard. Patrol returned to bridge and spotted bubbles. 7-M26 grenades were dropped and M-16 rounds were fired into water again with negative results. Patrol left the bridge at 0240H and at 0245H the bridge was blown. Bridge impassable.

At 0800H, 3d Recon Bn patrol came under SAF at YD 915058. Company F came to aid of Recon assisted in Recon MedEvac and reinserted Recon. Swept area with negative results. 1 USMC WIA.

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At 1030H L/3/26 reported that 2 USMC from 3d engineer Bn had drowned in the Ta Trach River at YD754142. One Marine apparently fell in and was swept away. A second Marine, trying to save the first was also swept away. A search for the bodies was conducted, but was not successful.

At 1530H Marine from Company H had an accidental discharge at YD836176. 1 USMC and 1 USN non-battle casualty (minor).

At 2200H Company F patrol in ambush spotted approx 12 VC moving towards FA2's position and were fired upon at 300 meters. VC moved on towards FA3's position and were taken under fire. VC moved toward FA1's position Vic YD 914106, ambush opened up with 300 S/A rds, 50 M-79 rds, 2 law's and 20 M-26 grenades. Enemy returned SAF and threw chicom grenades. Enemy was trapped in hedgerow 15 meters from FA1's position. Called for illumination and flare-ship, found 4 enemy KIA(c) and 2 KIA(p) seen being dragged. Captured 2 AK-47's, 1 SKS Soviet 7.62 semi-auto, 3 chicom grenades, 2 MVA belts, 2 VC cartridge belts, 4 AK-47 magazines, 1st aid kit and 3 ponchos. 1 USMC WIA.

07 Oct 67 At 0300H Company F patrol in ambush site Vic YD921011 spotted 100 VC moving north by northwest 150 meters west of ambush site. Called in flare-ship to check grid YD9308 and 9409, with negative results.

At 0945H Company E Vic ZC112993 received 22 rds 82mm mortar rds from Vic ZC099979. At 0950H commenced counter mortar fire w/ 30 82mm firing 49 rds of HE, 60mm fired 8 rds HE also fired 100 rds SAF. AO reported possible mortar site at ZC108954. Fired wing dropped 4 bombs and observed what appeared to be a body flying thru the air. 2 bombs were duds. Dispatched squad to check out area, and blow bombs. Results 1 USMC KIA, 4 USMC WIA, 5 USN WIA, 1 ARVN WIA and 4 PF WIA.

At 1100H Company E patrol detained 6 VN males and 1 VN female Vic AU210035. None had ID cards. CPT and Hamlet chief cleared all, but one, which hamlet chief believed to be VC. Detainee turned over to PMO.

At 1211H CAC-E Hdq reported civilian rice truck hit mine Vic ZD065044. 11 VN slightly wounded and Medevaced to C-4-Hai Dispensary.

At 2150H CAC-E bridge security at ZB137011 spotted 1 VC approaching bridge with mine fired 13 rds SAF at VC, heard scream and splash in water. Approx 20 other VC were spotted leaving the area. Engaged 500 rds SAF and 20 M-79 with unknown results. Swept area and found 1 automatic weapon with magazines (sub-machine) and 3 mines, 20 lb MFP pressure type, and 1-1 lb which had detonated. Results 1 VC KIA(p).

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08 Oct 67

At 1745H L/3/26 at XD745154 received report from A1 National that the body of one white male was seen 2000 meters downstream from their position. A check proved the body to be a VN with his throat slit and his arms dislocated out.

09 Oct 67

At 0115H a PF compound received fire from approx 10 VC Vic ZD041023. CAC-24 sent reaction force. Results 1 enemy KIA(p).

10 Oct 67

At 0250H bridge regular crew reported that bridge at ZD 137010 was blown, being 50% demolished. Patrol went to check area finding 1 charge with 1 lb explosive and a couple pieces of pull cord. Also found where VC cut in while setting off charge. Estimate 4 VC heading west.

At 0805H Company G patrol reported culvert at ZD157011 had been blown and passable to 6x6 type traffic. Patrol estimated 35% damage. Checked area for mines with neg results.

At 0945H Company G at XD097006 received approx 6 mortar rds from Vic ZD097000 and ZD098990. Fired counter mortar in grid ZD0901. Helicopter in area spotted mortar and hit ZD108008 with rockets and AG fire. Results: 1 USMC WIA and 1 CJ WIA.

At 1100H, Company G reported NUROC NGOT Bridge at ZD 169001 received 5-82mm Mortar Rds, at 1115H, received 2-82mm Mortar rds all from vic ZC 145006. AO checked area. At 1630H, received 16-82mm Mortar rds, ARVN ran Air Strike and counter mortar fire was shot.

At 1740H, Company E was inserted at ZD 148033 in search of downed aircraft. At 2230-110724H, Company E found parts of boxes and navigation books at ZD 155001, utilizing illumination throughout the night through use of Flare Strip. Found parts of bodies and MPC in area. At 0724H, found main part of plane at ZD 157055.

At 1900H, Company E patrol fired on 4 VC in treeline vic ZD 895100. VC yelled that they were from Gulf Company. At this time point element hesitated and this is when they took casualties. 2 USMC KIA and 3 USMC WIA. Patrol called in and found Company G had no units in area. Called for illumination, swept area with negative results.

At 2120H, CAC #51 patrol fired on 3 VC vic ZD 086014. Saw 1 VC fall to the ground. Searched area and found drag marks, resulting in 2 enemy KIA(p).

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11 Oct 67 At 0830H, CAC-H1 patrols received info from Village Chief of 1 wounded VC in CAC-H1's TAOR. A civilian who said he knew where VC was hiding led HMA patrol to vic. Patrol captured VC, and turned over to CIT.

At 1200H, Company M reported Air Force investigating Officer and 3 Engineers arrived at ZD 155055 to investigate downed plane. At 1900H, reported having 7 bags partially filled with bodies, and 200 lbs of mail. Bodies will be taken to Phu Bai then Da Nang. There are 9 Air Force and 6 USAF Recovery and Investigating Teams.

At 1445H, CAC-H6 at ZD 139009/ZD 153010 received 6 to 8 82mm Mortar Rds from vic ZC 154991. NURUC NGOT Bridge also received 2 Rds. Fired 5 Rds counter-battery fire at ZC 157793. At 1500H AO adjusted fire at ZC 157990 to ZD 166900. Patrol found possible Mortar positions at ZD 155983, also found Base Camp large enough to accommodate 2 Plts at ZD 156991. Fire pits still warm.

At 2350H, Company H patrol received 12 Rds 81mm or 82mm Mortar Rds at ZD 949052. Direction which Mortars were fired unknown. Results 1 USMC KIA and 3 USMC WIA. MedEvac called.

12 Oct 67 At 0735H, 3D Shore Party reported Vn bus hit a mine at YD 814297. Mine approx 25-40 lb charge. MCB-3 took 13 VN civilians to HUE hospital.

At 1500H, Company F reported Marine Huey Helicopter VT-19 carrying 5 persons crashed and turned over on its side at ZD 141030. One person believed to have broken arm (USAF) Helo was a total loss.

At 1800H, CAC-H1 VN bus traveling SE on Highway #1, ZD 073010, hit a mine. A bus following brought in- jured to CAC H1 where they were treated and MedEvac'd. 2 civilians were killed.

At 2330H, CAC-H3 at YD 967063 reported ARVN on opposite side of Truoi Bridge received 1 incoming explosive device, believed to be a B-40 Rocket. Returned fire, 1 ARVN WIA and MedEvac'd.

13 Oct 67 At 0830H, CAC-H7 reported that a culvert was blown at ZD 167011. Culvert was blown during the night. Road is passable to one way traffic.

At 1400H, CAC-H3 reported A VNS picked up 4 detainees at YD 967063. These people had been captured by VC and taken in the hills for indoctrination. They either escaped or were released. Detainees interrogated by CIT.

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14 Oct 67 At 0800H, patrol detained 3 males with false ID cards; At ZD 078014. Detainees taken to CAC-H5 CP.

At 1820H, L/4/12 at ID 888127, during a fire mission an explosion from unknown cause occurred inside turret of Gun #5, M-409, 155mm Howitzer, resulting in 4 WIA's Evacuated to "A" Med. Investigation initiated.

15 Oct 67 At 1200H, CAC-H Hdq reported that a ARVN constructed concrete bridge at ZD 076010 was blown with 100% damage, however road remained passable to all traffic. Area checked with negative results.

At 1345H, Company G patrol found 20 fresh unfinished fighting holes at ID 919090. Villagers pointed out 1 VC. Found 3 bags of rice, 1 utility shirt, and 2 utility covers of unfriendly origin. Patrol continued sweep and detained 1 VN male. Two detainees turned over to MP detail.

At 1850H, Company E ambush made contact with unknown number of VC at ZD 091994. Swept area and found blood footprints resulting in 1 enemy KIA(p).

At 2030H, Company F patrol on bridge security at ID 933085, reported one man attempted to throw a M-26 grenade from bunker, at suspected VC activity in water. In doing so, he dropped grenade and as he picked it up again it detonated, wounding himself critically, one USMC and one PF. All 3 WIA's MedEvac to "A" Med.

At 2315H, Company F bridge security at ID 808190 reported a civilian convoy consisting of 30 buses, apparently was a funeral, heading for HUE. Checked buses for ID's and weapons. All had ID's and no weapons were found. After last vehicle was 150-200 meters away. Figures were seen disembarking and security received 30 Rds SAF. No fire returned.

16 Oct 67 At 0700H, CAC-A3 at ID 912118 reported that a VN male turned himself in saying he was a VC. He is 18 years old and came from Phu Bai II. Turned over to CIT.

At 1645H, CAC-A3 reported VN male turned himself in as a Chieu Hoi. Man is 25 years old and had a Chi-Com type Carbine. Chieu Hoi turned over to ITT.

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18 Oct 67 At 0001H Operation Liberty II commenced.

At 1055H, Company G found 2 VN males who appeared to be hiding behind pagoda at ZD 905116. Detainees taken to CAC-A3.

At 1200H, Company G patrol heavily damaged a Buddhist Temple at ZD 903106. Incident was discovered by S-5 on routine visit to village 20 Oct. G-5 and Division Legal Officer immediately notified. S-5/2/26 contacted the CAC-A3 NCOIC, Village Chief, Hamlet Chief, Buddhist Priest and 4/12 Civil Affairs Officer. Arrangements were made to pay solatium as soon as possible. Squad Leader personally apologized to Village Officials and Buddhist Family Representatives. Board of inquiry convened to establish financial responsibility and investigation Officer appointed to initiate Bn Commanders Judicial Action. *SS*

19 Oct 67 At 1415H, H&S Company security reported that a truck hit a mine at ZD 803116. Results: 5 USMC WIA.

At 2030H, CAC-H7 reported that villagers, reported to PF's that 2 groups of 100 or more VC came to vic AU 816047 to get food. VC came from and returned to mountains at ZD 194047.

At 2130H, CAC-H1 at ZD 088607 reported that approx 7 Mortar Rds & 2 M-79 Rds impacted about 100 meters East of CAC-H5 CP, landing among houses on North side of Highway #1 wounding 2 VN males and 1 Female. Swept area, unable to find enemy, but found Anti U.S. Leaflets at ZD 084003. Villagers did not know of VC presence. Emergency MedEvac called for one Vietnamese Female.

20 Oct 67 At 1700H CAC-A3 reported that 2-15 year old children were killed by a possible claymore while tending their buffaloes at ZD 885104. CAC-A3 actual found out from people in area that there was a friendly unit 400 meters NE of area, also found handle from hand generator of Claymore and some Claymore pellets.

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20 Oct 67 At 0725H, Company F security on bridge at YD 836175 saw bubbles in water. One man threw a grenade which hit on opposite side of River by a tent wounding 2 USMC, NBC. MedEvac'd by vehicle to A Med.

At 0730H, CAC-H3 at YD 967064 reported village chief brought 100 propaganda leaflets, urging Yankees to go home, and also ARVNS not to fight the VC. Incident occurred at YD 969067, Hamlet of XUAN-LAI patrol dispersed to area and distributed own leaflets.

At 1500H, CAC-A6 patrol picked up 13 detainees with no ID at YD 816185. 1 Male and 1 Female believed to be VCs. 1 Female confirmed VC. Detainees taken to CAC-A HQ.

22 Oct 67 At 0415H, CAC-H1 fired on 2 possible VC at YD 924107. Started to sweep area and had to stop due to jamming of weapons. Results 1 KIA(p).

At 1030H CAC-A7 detained 2 Female VC suspects at YD 815167. Detainees taken to CAC-A HQ.

At 1300H, one marine from Company E was wounded in right arm YD 905001 while blowing dud 105mm Round. USMC Med Evac'd to A-Med.

At 2130H, Company E patrol made contact with approx 15 VC at YD 895095. 5 VC were seen hit by M-79 rounds. Swept area at first light finding 1 automatic Chi-Com rifle, 2 magazines, 1 M-26 grenade, 2 sandals covered with blood, 2 soft covers, 2 straw covers, 10 rice baskets, 2 used battle dressings, 1 not book, and numerous pools of blood. Results: 5 VC KIA(p).

23 Oct 67 At 0930H, L/3/26 reported dud illum round misfired and drifted into NAM HOA village at YD 758140 and started fire which destroyed 3 houses at approx 0500H. Initial investigation underway.

At 1020H, 3d MT Bn wrecker attempting to pass another vehicle at ZD 115014 went over embankment falling 50 meters to bottom of Ravine. 2 USMC received minor injuries and treated by Corpsman.

At 1125H, MCB-121 lead jeep of a 3 jeep convoy hit anti-tank mine at YD 856095 resulting in 3 USMC KIA.

At 1200H, CAC-A3 at YD 944128 reported 1 VN male kidnapped by VC at Phu Bai 5. Believed reason for kidnapping was because he wouldn't relay false information to Marines & PF's. He was believed taken to KIN TAG.

At 1320H, CAC-H2 reported helicopter downed at YD 925050. G/2/3 has Plt guarding helicopter.

At 2400H Operation Liberty II terminated.

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24 Oct At 1200H Company H patrol spotted 1 VN male at XD 914104 standing behind hedgerow, flashing signals with a small mirror back towards the village in a NE direction. Detained same.

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At 1900H Company G patrol point made contact with 4 VC males and 1 VC female at XD 963043 swept area finding 1 VC KIA(c), 1 AL-47 Rifle, 5 cons secura, 1 gal. Soybean oil, 2 Black P.J. tops, 1 poncho and assortment of papers with VN writing. 1 civilian wounded in fire fight, and taken to CAC-H3. 1 USMC WIA (minor).

At 1905H CAC-A6 reported one VN military vehicle hit a mine and was demolished by unknown number of VC or XD 824180. CAC-A6 checked area finding vehicle completely destroyed, 1 ANVII KIA and 6 ANVII WIA.

At 2200H CAC-H5 at XD 087007 received approx 9 60mm mortar rounds, landing in CP minor damage to CP. Believed that VC used same mortar site used in mortar attack on CP on night of 19 Oct 67, at XD 086004. Results 2 USMC KIA.

25 Oct At 0400H CAC-A1 patrol was walking down trail at XD 683163 in a Southerly direction. When patrol came within 10 meters E2/2/26 opened fire on CAC-A1. Since fire was called when E2 actually heard CAC-A1 calling for Medic. Green pop-up was fired. CAC-A1 deviated from previously coordinated patrol route which caused them to walk into E2 patrol. 2/26 was not notified of deviation. Results: 1 USMC KIA.

At 0720H Phu Loc District HQ began receiving incoming 82mm mortar rounds. 25 rounds hit at XD 097007. Gunship

At 1700H Company G Kit Carson scouts with patrol interrogated a woman at XD 959041. She admitted that VC came to her house for rice every night. House contained 3500 lbs of rice. Detainee turned over to CID.

At 2230H Company reported seriously ill Marine at XD 985043. Corpsmen determined that man was suffering from appendicitis. Marine Medevaced.

26 Oct At 1400H two detainees were picked up via XD 908112 who were on the National Police Black List. Detainees taken to HQ.

27 Oct At 0215H 1st Kit of Company F and CAC-H1 at XD 91731033 received 6 rounds 60mm mortars landing 15-100 meters away. Returned SIF towards trailhead at XD 925097. Checked area and found tips for 100mm mortars and propaganda papers.

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27 Oct At 0900H 2/26 Minesweep reported VC attempting to destroy bridge at ZD 071011. Western portion was 30% destroyed. Civilians informed bridge blown between 0600-0700H. Bridge is passable.

At 1100H A member of a VC transportation Flt turned himself into District Huong Thus HQ. The Chieu Hoi had a AK-47, 3 magazines, 2 Chi Com grenades and 50 rounds.

At 1600H CAC-A1 detained 1 man at XD 84175 because of suspicious activities on 26 Oct. Man taken to CAC-A HQ, for interrogation.

28 Oct At 0615H Minesweep from Phu Bai reported finding a mine of approx 12-15 lbs. of TNT at ZD 050021. Mine was blown in place.

At 1955H CAC-A2 observed 6 lights moving towards the compound from other side of river at XD 924159. Arty mission called with excellent target coverage. At 0600H patrol checked area and were told 6 VC were killed. Swept area with Negative Results.

At 2000H 1 VC (13 years old) with shrapnel wounds on right leg, turned himself into Company F at XD 959068. VC had 1 semi-automatic weapon with him. VC was taken to aid for medical attention and then turned over to District Chief, Thu Loc District.

29 Oct At 1130H National Police detained 5 persons, 1 female was on black list of Hue National Police, other 4 had false or no ID cards. All detainees taken at Gia Lo. 4 detainees were released.

At 2230H CAC-HM at ZD 039024 spotted 7 to 9 VC a prox 40 meters from bridge. CAC-HM OP later spotted 4 VC on road at XD 035026 heading west. Opened fire on VC. VC returned SIF. Revolutionary force was called and they pursued enemy with negative results. 1 VC KIA(p).

30 Oct At 2000H Company F patrol sprung ambush on 6 VC at XD 951074. Called for illum and swept area finding 3 KIA(c) and 3 KIA (p). Captured 1 AK-47, 1 Chinese carbine, 1 bolt action carbine, 1 helmet, 2 cartridge belts, and 1 poncho.

At 2100H CAC-HG patrol sprung ambush on 10 VC at XD 951074. Swept area resulting in 3 VC KIA(c) and 2 VC KIA(p). Captured 1 AK-47, 1 type 50 Machine gun, 1 M-1 carbine, 1 Chi Com grenade, 1 cartridge belt, and small amount of medical gear.

At 2305H Company G reported that bridge at ZD 098006 was blown. Bridge was split in middle and impassable. 1 USM HI(minor).

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At 0945H, CAC-H Headquarters at ZD 097006 received 5 incoming 82mm Mortar Rds. All rds landed in CP. 20 Rds 105 Arty and 40 Rds 81mm Mortars were fired in counter mortar fire. Machine guns fired at suspected positions at ZG 097986. Company unit 300 meters from mortar position swept area and found medical supplies, French currency, 13 ID cards, uniforms (possible NVA), maps designating fields of fire and large Cache of rice in containers; 1-55 Gal drum, 2 100 lb bags, 2 large baskets and large vase of rice all at XD 964035. 1 Detainee being held. 4 Vietnamese troops WIA (minor).

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LOGISTICS

1. Logistics

The attachment of "L" Company, 3/26 to the Battalion and the need to support them with various classes of supply, placed an additional demand on Battalion Supply during the month of October. A continued effort to obtain critical items for deadlined equipment was also sustained during the month. The monsoon gear has started coming in. To date, we have received the rain-suits, space heaters, and shower shoes. Four-hundred and forty-seven new buffers for the M-16 were received and installed. One hundred more are needed and have been requested. Cleaning material, most notably, bore brushes, remain in demand. In the way of repair parts for the M-16, extractors are presenting a problem lately. Magazine assemblies for the .45 cal pistol were obtained in the quantity of 100, but outstanding requisitions for 100 more, as well as those for M-16 magazines continue to be un-filled. A total of 32 compasses were received, thus taking this item off a critical listing, but not lessening the importance of eliminating the existing deficiency. Requisitions for seven PRC-25's and one 60mm mortar base plate continue to be outstanding. Light weight jungle utilities were obtained this month in sufficient quantities to equip nearly every man with two pair. We are now attempting to make this three pair. Socks were also obtained but in limited quantity. Maintenance situation for the month of October remains in poor shape. There are 15 vehicles on 3rd echelon deadline and 9 on 2nd echelon deadline. The primary cause of continuing deadlines is still the lack of repair parts support. Many man hours have been put into the contonement area in an attempt to ready it for the monsoon season. The availability of trucks for household and resupply purposes has been a problem at times. There have been very few problems in procuring transportation for tactical movements. Requests for helicopter support for resupply missions have been met but for reconnaissance missions some difficulty has been encountered.

1. Mission: To conduct a civic action program that will enhance the prestige of the civil government and to conduct psychological operations to further the efforts of the Government of Viet Nam in re-establishing its effective control over the people.

2. Civic Action Projects and Operations.

a. 1 Oct-31 Oct 1967 the 2nd Bn, 26th Marines was responsible for Civil Affairs in the Village of Loc Tri. During that period the following Civil Action was conducted.

(1) The shower at Cau Hai Hamlet was completed.

(2) Two wells were completed.

(3) Work began on the Convent School.

(4) A Health and Sanitation Program was begun in Cau Hai. The Market Place was sprayed with insecticide.

(5) An English Class was begun with Cpl Hamilton, Civil Affairs NCO in residence at Loc Tri, aiding the teacher at Cau Hai High School.

(6) MEDCAP by the Battalion Surgeon and his staff of Corpsmen treated 218 patients.

b. 13 serious incidents were investigated involving damage to property and injuries sustained by the local population while Marines were conducting operations within this TAOR. Settlements were paid in varying amounts to all justified claims. In cases where hospitalization was required, gifts were presented by the S-5 staff.

c. A special rice project was initiated involving the centralization of all rice in the various villages in order to maintain security over it from VC/NVA theft.

(1) The Civil Affairs Officer, NCOIC of the various CAP units and local Village/Hamlet officials met to discuss the collection and storage of rice.

(2) Steps were taken to insure that the rice was brought in and properly stored and that security would be maintained over it.

(3) Further liaison with the local population will determine further action to be taken on this project.

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d. A project to protect temples and pagodas from damage was initiated.

(1) A survey was conducted to find the location of all temples and pagodas in this TACR.

(2) The coordinates of these temples and pagodas were plotted on a map. Lists of these coordinates are to be turned in to S-3, 81mm Mortars and other interested parties to avoid unnecessary damage as a result of H&I fire missions or other operations.

(3) A meeting involving individual village chiefs, CAP NCOICs and the S-5 was held to discuss what further measures could be taken to prevent damage and injury to temples and pagodas and the priests tending them.

b. SITUATION

a. Enemy Forces. VC and NVA are structured within populated areas vic Camp Phu Bai to a degree which warrants professional search techniques. Maintenance of their infrastructure to date has been assured by weather and terrain favorable to their activities, searches by Marines armed with inadequate intelligence, an insufficient working knowledge of the Vietnamese language, and a lack of knowledge of the techniques of the professional search. This situation has given the enemy the necessary flexibility to disguise as villagers, to hide their arms, and to plan and execute tactics of lightning attacks, kidnapping, harrassing, and ambushing. Armed with weapons including automatic rifles and the 82mm mortar. It has been clearly indicated that the current situation also allows the enemy to gain the necessary logistic support and recruiting ability to sustain their ranks in a mass attack upon any portion of the perimeter surrounding the vital area. For additional intelligence information see Bn S-2.

b. Friendly Forces.

- (1) National Police - Provide searching and clearing capability within assigned sector of zone of action.
- (2) Popular Forces - Continue to provide bridge and strong point security as designated by District Chief.
- (3) Combined Action Platoons - Continue to patrol and ambush within TAOR and provide tactical support when called upon.
- (4) PNU unit will be operating in Ha Vinh and Then Bang Min I & II.
- (5) Artillery - B-Stry, 1st Bn, 13th Marines continues to support activities in TAOR.
- (6) Air - 1st Marine Air Wing continues to provide close in air and helicopter capability to TAOR.

c. Attachments and Detachments -

- (1) National Police attached effective 231500H.
- (2) Combined Action Platoons attached effective X-hour in each objective.
- (3) Counter Intelligence Team - attached effective 231600H.

2. MISSION Defend the Phu Bai Vital Area, Combined Action Platoons, National route #1 and conduct offensive operations in the Phu Bai TAOR and Adjacent areas.

3. MISSION.

a. Object of Operation. One company will provide security for National Police with emphasis on bridge security. One company operate between SAP-43 and the Trout river; on order be prepared to act as a cordon force for a curfew and search operation of Sparrow Hawk when not operating. One company operate from the Trout river to the 1st Mar Div boundary. One company will provide Sparrow Hawk on alternating days in the Phu Bai Highland Area. On order be prepared to act as a cordon force for a curfew and search operation. Extensive patrols and ambushes will be used to deny the enemy freedom of movement and access to LOC's. See Annex A (Operation overlay).

b. Co 2 (main)

- (1) At 1200H 23 Oct the company will be positioned in the Phu Bai Vital area.
- (2) Provide the Sparrow Hawk company, on an alternating basis with Co 1.

- (6) The 2d, Captain SWAN, will return to Phu Bai Base by 1600 hours awaiting briefing, on call.
- (7) Will report their area at 0000 24 Oct, at which time 2d, 2d, will occupy the area.
- (8) Road/bridge security will be commanded by Captain SWAN.

- (9) Activities in the Phu Loc area up to the Trout River will be coordinated by Captain SMITH at Phu Loc District HQ.
- (10) A briefing tent will be available near the MP Bivouac area N 073136 for Co Cmdrs, Plt Cmdrs and squad leaders to brief their subordinates.
- (11) Movement of the MP to Phu Loc will be coordinated by the S-4.
- (12) Briefings will be conducted at approximately 1500H each day in order to critique the cordon and search activities and plan for next day's objectives.
- (13) Submit night and day activities NLT 1200H the day before.
- (14) Do not destroy captured food, supplies or medicine. Report their location and submit instructions.
- (15) Curfew hours for Hoang Thuy and Phu Loc Districts are 2200H to 0600H.

During the search 1 false haystack was found and 1 cave type hiding place; however, neither of the places contained anything. 6 Persons were detained and turned over to the National Police as these were Civil Defendants and CIU didn't feel they were of value, and they were later released. One cache of 400 lb of rice was found in jars buried in the earth. The village chief was informed and the decision for the rice disposition left to him. AT 0815H received leaflets from plane. After deploying on line below the village, the search began. During the course of the search four large sacks of rice, totaling 12,000 lbs were discovered at the following coord: YD886169, YD889169 and YD885174. The village chief and asst. village chief were contacted personally by the S-3. The village chief stated that the rice belonged to villagers and the VC did not know where it was nor did they ever get any of it. The families living at each site explained they were either storing it for several persons to be consumed over a long period of time, or they intended to feed ducks and chickens. The S-3 and S-5 suggested that all the rice be moved to a secure area near the CAP-A1 compound. However the chief did not agree, saying that he had PF security near most of the storage areas. A squad of Marines were subsequently placed around each

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of the four case ~~notes~~ notes for security. At 251650H 15-5 returned from another meeting with the village chief who now agreed to move the rice from the present storage area to a centralised storage area within the CAP-AL compound. The move will commence the morning of 26 Oct 1967.

12. At 204500H P/2/26 actual was informed by Village Chief that water buffalo was hit at 10050195 during AB firing. P/2/26 investigated finding water buffalo still standing. Started to approach but village chief said buffalo in charge. Village chief to make report to CAC Company.

- B. At 302100H CAC-H8 patrol in ambush at YD975047 had 10 VC walk in ambush site. Sprang ambush and had 3 VC KIA(c) and 2 KIA(p), 1 VC hit with M-79 rd. Swept area for 2 wounded VC with neg results. Found 1 Chinese grenade, 1 cartridge belt, and small amount of medical gear on body; 1 AK-47, 1 type 50 Machine Gun and 1 - M-1 Carbine.

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C. At 310945H CAC-H1 Hdq's at ZD 097006 received 5 incoming 82mm mortar Rds. All Rds landed in CP. 20 Rds 105 Arty and 40 Rds 82mm mortar were fired in counter mortar fire. Machine guns fired at suspected positions at Approx ZC 097986.
