

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

On 1 November, the BLT (-) was participating in Operation Garrard Bay under operational control of the 1st Marines. The area of operation was in the 2nd Bn, 1st Marines Area of Operation.

The BLT (-), on 1 November, was in the process of cordoning and searching the village complex of Nui Kim Son in the vicinity of BT 073707. On 4 November, F Company and G Company were helilifted into cordon positions around the Leprosarium at BT 096666; H Company and E Company were helilifted into position to cordon Viem Dong at BT 095657.

At 110730H, F Company, 2/1 Chopped OPCON to BLT 2/26. At 110730H, F and H Companies were helilifted into the "Horseshoe Lake" area at BT 104635; E Company was helilifted to the vicinity of BT 094643 while G Company moved over land to vicinity of BT 092633. While in "Horseshoe Lake" area, the BLT's mission was to search and clear the area.

At 120800H, F Company, 2/1 Chopped back to OPCON 2/1.

On 16 November, F and H Companies were helilifted to Cam Sa (1) in the vicinity of BT 079648 with the mission of cordoning and searching the village. Also on 16 November, E and G Companies were helilifted to the 3rd AmTrac position followed by F and H Companies after securing the cordon.

On 16 November Operation Garrard Bay was secured.

On 17 November F and H Companies were helilifted to vicinity of BT 093668 to search and clear the area. At approximately 181400H the BLT commenced helilift of all units to BLT Rear at Camp Books.

At 200800H the BLT commenced Operation Meade River. The BLT was moved into cordon position by motor vehicle convoy along Route 1 in the vicinity of BT 046613.

On 26 November, at 0930H B 1/13 and W 1/12 were Chopped OPCON to 1stBn, 1st Marines.

On 301600H E Company 2/26 Chopped OPCON to 3rdBn, 26th Marines.

Operation Meade River was still in progress on 30 November with BLT units still employed in cordon type mission.

b. Command Relations

- (1) During the period 1-16Nov BLT 2/26 was under the OPCON of 1st Marines. The Command Headquarters was located at 2/1 CP (BT 073655). At 110730H Company F, 2/1, Chopped OPCON to BLT 2/26 in the vicinity of BT 103650, and remained under OPCON until 120800H.
- (2) During the period 20-30Nov BLT 2/26 was under the OPCON of 1st Marines. The Command Headquarters remained with the BLT in the vicinity of BT 0360.

c. Combat Missions Assigned(1) Operation GARRARD BAY

(a) 1-16Nov

- (1) Find, fix and destroy enemy forces, caches and installations;
- (2) Interdict enemy LOC to Da Nang;
- (3) Conduct detailed Cordon and Search Operations in the A.O.A.

(2) Operation MEADE RIVER

(a) 20-30Nov

- (1) Establish cordon around the objective area.
- (2) Search and clear villages and adjacent area to destroy enemy forces, caches, material and installations;
- (3) Capture VC infrastructure within the objective area.

d. Command Control

(1) During the period 1-16Nov the BLT CP was located at 2ndBn, 1st Marines CP at BT 073655. The BLT Rear was located in the vicinity of BT 9380. The BLT subordinate and attached units were located, and operated, within the A.O.A. of 2/1 and the ROKMC. Radios and couriers were employed as the principal method of control, and no problems ensued. No BLT units were OPCON to other units.

(2) During the period 20-30Nov the BLT CP was afield and located in the vicinity of BT 0360. The BLT Rear was located in the vicinity of BT 9380. The BLT subordinate and attached units were located, and operated, in the 1st Marine A.O.A. Radio, couriers, and wire were employed as the principal method of control, and no problems ensued. At 260930H Btry B, 1stBn, 13thMar and Whiskey Btry, 1stBn, 12thMar were Chopped OPCON to 1stBn, 1stMar; at 301600H Company E, 2ndBn, 26thMar was Chopped OPCON to 3rdBn, 26thMar.

e. Organic Operations

(1) BLT units conducted three hundred-sixty (360), LPs; one hundred-twenty-two (122) ambushes; twenty-two (22) patrols; and five (5) OPs.

(2) During the period 1-30Nov there were no operations not shown under SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS conducted by the BLT.

f. NBC Warfare

(1) During the period 1-30Nov there were no NBC type devices used by or against the BLT.

2. INTELLIGENCE

a. Enemy Situation

(1) Situation at the beginning of the reporting period.

(a) Operation GARRARD BAY

(1) At the beginning of the reporting period known enemy units operating in the A.O. consisted of the Dien Ban Local Force Co, Hoi An Local Force Co, and elements of the T-89 Sapper Battalion.

(b) Operation MEADE RIVER

(1) Upon initiation of this operation the A.O. contained numerous staging area and infiltration routes for enemy operations in the Da Nang area. Elements of the 141st Regiment, 21st NVA Regiment, 31st NVA Regiment, Q-80 Local Force Battalion, and Q-83 Local Force Battalion were known to be operating in and around the A.O.

(2) Situation at the end of the reporting period.

(a) Operation GARRARD BAY

(1) Due to the large number of personnel detained, which were on the CIT Black List, it is believed that the VC infrastructure in the GARRARD BAY A.O. had been seriously damaged.

(b) Operation MEADE RIVER

(1) By the end of the reporting period the cordon phase of this operation had been completed, and the search phase initiated. Thus far the operation has yielded a large number of VC suspects and effectively denied the enemy use of major infiltration routes.

(1) During the reporting period there were nineteen (19) incidents.

Also captured were small quantities of mechanical equipment, medical supplies, clothing, 782 gear, and large quantities of documents.

d. Enemy Trends

(1) Operation GARRARD BAY

(a) At the conclusion of the BLT's participation in this operation a significant decrease in enemy activity was noted in the A.O.

(2) Operation MEADE RIVER

(a) At the conclusion of the reporting period the operation was still in progress, and it is too early to note definite significant enemy trends.

e. Weather Conditions

(1) During the period the weather was generally favorable, and had no adverse effects on friendly operation.

3. SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

01 Nov At 2145H, a squad leader from Company G located at BT 077707 heard a loud pop on top of a hooch in the ville at BT 075707. Minutes later the roof was on fire and people were screaming VC, VC. Squad sent to check area observed 3 individuals running from hooch to hooch. Squad was unable to shoot or apprehend suspects due to the crowd that had gathered. Fire was extinguished and people who were in the hooch were treated for minor burns by Corpsmen. The area was kept under close observation the rest of the night.

02 Nov At 1700H, a CIT and ITT team with BLT units for security finished screening 250 men and women in the ville located in the vicinity of BT 077707. The Village Chief had pointed out 2 young women as VC.

It was later determined that their names were on the Black List. A third woman whose name appeared on the Black List was detained along with a fourth woman whose husband's name was listed. The 4 detainees were transported to a collection point for further processing.

04 Nov At approximately 040730H, F Company and G Company were helilifted into cordon positions around the Leprosarium at BT 096666; H Company and E Company were helilifted into positions to cordon Viem Dong at BT 095657.

04 Nov At 1300H, PF's in conjunction with elements of Company G discovered 110 bags of rice weighting approximately 25 pounds each, and 75 earthenware vats containing about 25 gallons of rice and grain at BT 096606. The rice and grain was later evaced to 2/1 CP for further disposition.

04 Nov At 1100H, BLT units with teams from CIT and ITT screened 202 women and 59 males from the Leprosarium located in the vicinity of BT 097660. Detained were 20 females and 7 males who were missing I.D. cards and 5 females and 1 male whose names appeared on the Black List. All were transported to 2/1 CP.

04 Nov At 1400H, an element of Company H detained 16 children and 21 adults at BT 103656. The element also found 800 pounds of rice. Personnel were forwarded to the collection point and rice was destroyed.

05 Nov At 0300H, 1 Marine from Company F was wounded in the left leg by enemy who fired on their LP at BT 095663. LP returned fire with unknown results.

05 Nov At 0030H, E Company received 3 concussion grenades and 3 small arms rounds.

05 Nov H Company found 1500 pounds of rice in hooches at BT 095653. Also in same vicinity were found 1 Chi-Com grenade and 1 large bunker; bunker and grenade were destroyed.

05 Nov E Company found 3 bunkers and 1 Chi-Com grenade in vicinity of BT 095650. All were destroyed.

05 Nov At 1100H, G Company detained a woman for further interrogation who admitted being associated with a VC woman's organization.

05 Nov At 2116H, G Company observed movement about 50 meters within the cordon. Movement occurred only during darkness caused by clouds covering the full moon. When illumination grenade was thrown, individuals started to run. 6 rounds of M-16 were fired. In the

morning civilians brought 2 Vietnamese which they claimed had been killed as a result of G Company's actions. G Company searched the area and found no apparent cause for the individuals to have been digging and moving in the area after dark.

06 Nov At about 1030H a frag grenade was thrown at a tank resulting in 1 USMC KIA. The area was searched with negative results.

06 Nov At BT 096664 F Company screened 396 civilians from the Leprosarium resulting in 10 detainees being held for further interrogation.

06 Nov An E Company ambush engaged 8-10 enemy, at 2015H. with small arms. 3 enemy were seen to fall, the remainder returned fire and withdrew dragging 2 of their group; 81mm mortar mission was called in with unknown results.

06 Nov At 2030H a H Company LP spotted 2 individuals moving toward them; the LP opened fire causing the enemy to run into a tree line between 2 of H Company's positions making continuing pursuit by fire impossible.

06 Nov At 2145H 2 E Company positions received a total of 10 grenades, fire was returned with small arms and grenades; results unknown. There were 2 USMC WIA medevaced and 1 USMC WIA minor caused by the contact.

07 Nov A continued search of the Leprosarium revealed nothing significant.

08 Nov E Company found 3 SFD's in the vicinity of BT 091645, one of which was accidentally set off resulting in 1 USMC WIA (medevaced).

08 Nov At about 2120H H Company spotted 5 enemy at BT 096647. Lines opened fire with small arms; approximately 15 minutes later 3 more enemy were spotted and the line fired more small arms. 1 enemy was seen to be hit, and groaning sounds could be heard. At first light drag marks and blood were found.

08 Nov At 2145H, E Company received 8 suspected 60mm mortar rounds at BT 089652 resulting in 2 USMC WIA (minor). Huey Gunship mission was called on suspected enemy mortar position.

08 Nov At 2115H, a rifle exploded due to sand in the bore resulting in 1 USMC WIA.

09 Nov At BT 096659, E Company found 1 SFD which was blown in place.

11 Nov At 0730H, F Company, 2/1 Chopped OPCON to BLT 2/26. At approximately 0745H, F Company, 2/1, engaged 2 NVA at BT 103650 resulting in 1 NVA KIA (C), and the capture of 1 AK-47 and a NVA pack. At 0730H, F and

H Companies were helilifted into the "Horseshoe Lake" area at BT 104635; E Company was helilifted to the vicinity of BT 092635 while G Company moved overland to the vicinity of BT 092622. G Company set off a SFD resulting in 1 USMC WIA (medevaced). Also found in the operational area on 11 November were 42 bunkers, 2 tunnels, 1 105mm round and 2 60mm rounds; all of which were destroyed.

12 Nov At 0800H, F Company, 2/1, Chopped back OPCON of 2/1. In the vicinity of BT 075647 a tank detonated a mine resulting in 5 USMC WIA (medevaced). Also on 12 November, BLT 2/26 units in the "Horseshoe Lake" area found 1775 pounds of rice, 18 bunkers, 9 SFD's and 5 dud artillery rounds; the rice was shipped to 1stMar CP, and the ordnance was destroyed.

13 Nov BLT 2/26, while continuing to search in the "Horseshoe Lake" area on 13 November, found 250 pounds of rice, 6 bunkers, 1 bolt action rifle, 2 dud artillery rounds and 17 SFD's of which 3 were tripped resulting in 3 USMC WIA (medevaced). Also found were various documents which were forwarded to 1stMar S-2.

14 Nov BLT 2/26 found 1660 pounds of rice, 3 dud artillery rounds and 7 SFD's of which 1 was tripped resulting in 1 USMC KIA and 1 USMC WIA. At 142110H, an E Company ambush killed 1 VC/NVA and captured 1 WIA/POW; 1 AK-47 and grenades were captured. The initial interrogation revealed the POW to be a Lieutenant Company Commander of a Sapper Company.

15 Nov At 1130H, while E Company was searching the area of the previous nights ambush, they encountered 2 VC/NVA resulting in 2 VC/NVA KIA (c) and the capture of 1 M-16 rifle with 4 magazines, 1 AK-47 with 1 magazine and uniforms with 2 wallets containing documents.

15 Nov At approximately 1930H, elements of G Company while moving to an ambush site came under MG, AK-47 and M-79 fire resulting in 1 USMC WIA (medevaced); G Company returned fire with small arms, artillery mission and directed 2 Huey Gunship attacks on suspected enemy positions with unknown results.

16 Nov On 16 November, F and H Companies were helilifted to the vicinity of Cam Sa (1) in the vicinity of BT 079648. The cordon and search resulted in the finding of 5 SFD's and 113 detainees out of 383 screened; the detainees were taken to 2/1 C.P. for further interrogation. Company F suffered 6 USMC WIA's (medevaced) from small arms fire while airborne at 1600H enroute from Cam Sa (1) to the 3rd AmTrac Bn position. Also on 16 November, E and G Companies were helilifted from their night ambush positions to 3rd AmTracs followed by F and G Companies after securing the cordon.

17 Nov F and H Companies were helilifted to the vicinity of BT 093688 to search and clear the area. At BT 097691 F Company observed 3 males

in black running away from them and took them under fire. During the encounter 6 civilians were injured (4 priority and 2 emergency medevacs).

18 Nov H Company found 8 55 gallon drums of rice, 6 60mm mortar rounds, 4800 rounds of AK-47 ammo, 19 82mm mortar rounds and a 250 pound dud bomb. The rice and rounds were blown in place.

18 Nov At approximately 1400H BLT 2/26 commenced helilift of all units to BLT Rear at Camp Books.

20 Nov At 0738H a truck containing elements of BLT CP hit a command detonated mine at BT 040628 resulting in 23 USMC WIA, 1 USMC DOW and 2 ARVN WIA. All were medevaced.

20 Nov BLT 2/26 commenced Operation MEADE RIVER at 200800H. At 1030H ARVN turned over 4 Chi-Com grenades and 2 RPG rounds which were destroyed. At 1200H F Company received sniper fire from a house, returned fire with 1 round 3.5 and sniper fire ceased. At 2030H G Company spotted 12 enemy moving at BT 046604; opened fire with small arms and called in 60mm and 82mm mission. Search of area revealed 1 enemy KIA with weapon, grenades and I.D. papers.

21 Nov G Company received 15 AK-47 rounds of sniper fire; fire was returned, and search of the area revealed nothing. At 0100H H Company received sniper fire. Fire was returned and search at first light revealed 1 enemy KIA (C) with cartridge belt, grenades and documents. At 0950H W 1/12 spotted 3 men, 2 with AK-47s. Enemy took W 1/12 under fire, and fire was returned with unknown results.

22 Nov At 1200H 1 USMC was wounded by accidental discharge at BLT Rear; investigation is being conducted.

22 Nov At 1915H B 1/13 had 1 man wounded not as a result of enemy action. Investigation is being conducted.

22 Nov F Company delivered 115 detainees to a collection point where they were transported to 1/1 CP.

22 Nov W 1/12 spotted 1 enemy at 2040H and fire M-79 at him with unknown results. At 2105H 82mm Mortar Platoon spotted 10-15 enemy moving at BT 041622. They were taken under fire with small arms; enemy returned fire with AK-47 and withdrew. Search of area revealed nothing significant.

23 Nov At approximately 0530H W 1/12 LP heard movement. LP threw 2 M-26s and searched area; results of search was 1 VC WIA and 1 AK-47 and 2 Chi-Com grenades captured.

23 Nov Company F, at BT 047599, found a Chi-Com grenade in a house. The grenade was blown in place.

23 Nov At BT 051598, W 1/12 spotted 1 VC/NVA approaching their position, and took him under fire; results unknown.

23 Nov An element of Company E observed 3 individuals carrying weapons moving in the vicinity of BT 049593. Enemy taken under fire with small arms, mortars and artillery; results unknown.

24 Nov W 1/12, at BT 053596, observed enemy movement at BT 050598, and took enemy under fire with M-79; results unknown.

24 Nov Company H, at BT 044614, observed 10 Vietnamese approaching their lines. Suspects taken into custody and transported to 2/26 CP.

24 Nov Company E, at BT 051592, found 1 cartridge belt containing 6 magazines of 20 rounds each.

24 Nov W 1/12, at BT 048598, noticing a man sneaking around their position apprehended and took him to a collection point.

24 Nov At BT 043606, while searching area, Company G found a horse-shoe shaped bunker approximately 40' long. Search of the bunker revealed 1 Chi-Com grenade, which along with the bunker, was blown. Company E observed a secondary explosion of unknown origin.

24 Nov Company H, receiving sniper fire from 3 VC/NVA at BT 031615, sent a squad out. The squad was withdrawn, and artillery mission was called; results unknown.

24 Nov While conducting a search, Company F at BT 045603, found an I.D. card for a Vietnamese female and WESFAC orders for an American male hidden in a hooch. In another hooch Company F found an I.D. card lying out in the open. All documents were delivered to 2/26 S-2. Further search revealed 2 ignition coils and a carburetor believed to fit a jeep.

24 Nov A SFD, accidentally detonated by Company H at BT 031614, resulted in 1 USMC WIA.

24 Nov Company G, at 2200H, received fire from 4 AK-47s spaced about 50 meters apart. Company G returned fire with small arms, 82mm and 105mm mission; results unknown.

25 Nov BLT 106mmRR personnel, observing rockets taking off from vicinity of BT 075625, called artillery mission on site; secondary explosions were heard.

25 Nov A weapons list, legal papers and 30 pictures of Vietnamese people were found by Company F and forwarded to S-2

25 Nov During a search of the area at BT 058603, Company F found papers and an I.D. card inside a 200 pound vat of rice. Continuing the search they observed a body floating down a stream. Impossible to recover the body, but it was believed he was killed as a result of last night's actions.

25 Nov Helicopter, lifting from LZ located at BT 049594, received rounds from an AK-47.

25 Nov At BT 042594, W 1/12 observed 6 Vietnamese in a tree line. 2 appeared to be armed and 4 carried heavy loads. 81mm mission called; results unknown.

25 Nov A Company E LP spotted 2 people, at BT 050591, and took them under fire with 60mm and M-79; results unknown.

26 Nov At 260930H B 1/13 and W 1/12 were Chopped to 1stBn, 1stMar.

26 Nov Company F, by probing at BT 049602, found a SFD which they blew in place. A reinforced 10x15x4 foot bunker was discovered and destroyed. The entrance was marked by 2 6" sticks placed as a "X".

26 Nov In a hooch, at BT 045603, Company F found 2 I.D. cards; 1 female, 1 male.

26 Nov Company F found 6 women without I.D. cards whom they detained and took to the collection point.

26 Nov At BT 044598, Company F found a pack in the open beside of which they found 2 hypodermic needles and a silver container in a plastic bag.

26 Nov Company F found 10 cardboard tubes measuring 3" x 4^{1/2}. They were covered by illumination parachute and believed to be rocket holders from a Huey Gunship; destroyed in place.

27 Nov In the vicinity of BT 034605, Company F found 2 1 man bunkers built into foundations of hooches; bunkers and hooches were destroyed.

27 Nov At BT 036604, Company F found and destroyed recently used sleeping quarters, fighting holes and bunkers.

27 Nov Company F, at BT 034601, found 56 fighting holes, mortar positions, 2 French 4 cylinder engines, a "Hell-box" and a water heater. The positions were destroyed and the gear evaced. Discovered later were 1 male approximately 30 and 1 approximately 15. Nearby was a spider hole and tunnel which were destroyed. During interrogation the man admitted being a leader in a VC Farmer's Association. The

boy, believed to be VC, stated that there are 6 VC located at BT 026597. Both suspects were sent to 1st Marines.

27 Nov Company G found and destroyed 400 pounds of rice beside a hooch at BT 034605. A chest was found in the loft.

27 Nov Company G received 2 rounds of sniper fire from BT 025605. G3 spotted sniper and returned fire with M-16 resulting in 1 VC/NVA KIA (C); 1 7.62mm pistol, 1 Chi-Com grenade and documents were captured and turned over to S-2.

27 Nov At BT 028605, Company H found a SFD which accidentally detonated resulting in 1 USMC WIA (medevaced).

27 Nov PFF's working with H Company detained 18 women and 12 children, at BT 032611, and delivered them to the collection point.

28 Nov At BT 029606, Company H found 3 bunkers, approximately 4'x6', and a tunnel, approximately 12'x2'. The tunnel contained about 300 pounds of rice. All were destroyed.

28 Nov In the vicinity of BT 031603, Company F found and destroyed 3 SFD's spaced about 5 meters apart. Also found and destroyed were 2 81mm duds found lying out on the ground; continued search revealed 100 pounds of American produced rice in American made bags. The rice was retained.

28 Nov Company F, at BT 030604, found and destroyed a series of bunkers.

28 Nov Company G discovered 2 men, 60 and 71 years old, hiding at BT 028625. Suspects sent to Company F CP for interrogation by PRU.

28 Nov Company F, at BT 027604, found a 75 year old male suspect who stated he had 2 son in the ARVN and PFF's. He revealed that air strikes had taken their toll in VC casualties. PRU advised he be sent to the rear for further interrogation.

28 Nov Company F, at BT 026604, apprehended 2 VC suspects, aged 61 and 70, who were taken to F Company CP. Both suspects revealed that air strikes had killed 12 VC/NVA, and that a squad had worked this area at time BLT was on the Red Line. They were taken to 1/1 for further interrogation.

28 Nov In the vicinity of BT 032598, Company F found a man tunnel and an unserviceable 6 cylinder engine with holes in the block. Attached to the engine was a serviceable mud pump and 5 gallon can of oil. All were destroyed.

28 Nov Company H, at BT 024508, found 3 tunnels and 12 bunkers. Tunnels

were under and just inside hooches, while bunkers were mostly above ground.

28 Nov Company G, at BT 032606, found a bunker which contained a decomposed body approximately 3 months old, and 1 pair of black pajamas.

28 Nov A Company E patrol spotted 5 Vietnamese, at BT 044604, who broke and ran as the patrol approached. One female was captured and taken to collection point.

28 Nov A Company E search of two graves, hit by artillery at BT 027612, revealed several documents and medical gear which were turned over to 1st Marines S-2.

28 Nov At BT 025608, Company H found various VC documents and 7 SFD's in an ammo can; documents were turned over to S-2.

28 Nov While moving to an ambush site, Company H heard movement to their rear. An immediate ambush was set up and sprung, resulting in 1 VC/NVA KIA (c).

28 Nov At BT 023604, Company G found a tunnel, 25' long, with a spider hole at the bottom. Also found was a cartridge belt and canister containing personal gear. All were destroyed.

29 Nov Company E, at BT 049553, spotted a figure crawling through a rice paddy, he was captured resulting in 1 VC/POW, 1 7.62mm pistol, pack, medical supplies and 1 Chi-Com grenade which was blown in place.

29 Nov At BT 023604, Company G had 1 VC/WIA come out of the tree line and surrender. He was evacuated to 1st Marines and a further search of the area resulted in 1 pack, 1 pair black pajamas and 1 helmet found. Later Company G found a small bamboo bridge which they used, then destroyed.

29 Nov A fresh grave, found and dug up by Company F at BT 026598, revealed a recently buried body who had died of shrapnel wounds.

29 Nov Company H, at BT 024608, found 30 AK-47 rounds, 5 bloody bandages and 20 pounds of rice in a house. Also found, in a bomb crater, was a tool chest containing American tools.

29 Nov Company G found a bunker at BT 027605. Engineers tried to throw a grenade through the aperture, but missed resulting in 1 USMC WIA. The bunker was destroyed with demo.

29 Nov Company F dug up a fresh grave, at BT 029599, and found 1 female, 18 years old, dressed in black pajamas. Reburied body.

29 Nov Two VC approached Company H lines, at BT 022605. Company H opened fire with small arms, and search of the area had negative results.

29 Nov A Company H ambush heard movement to their rear, and opened fire with small arms resulting in screams and other noise. They again opened fire with small arms and M-79; results unknown.

30 Nov At BT 027598, Company F dug up a fresh grave and found 1 male, age about 26, dressed in black pajamas. Cause of death was shrapnel wounds in neck; reburied body.

30 Nov Company G found a bunker at BT 027602. Next to the bunker was a hooch with 2 water buffaloes in it; the animals would not be moved and when the bunker was blown they became vicious and a danger to human life so they were shot.

30 Nov Company H found 2 females, ages 17 and 50, hiding in a bunker at BT 024607. The younger woman had a bad shrapnel wound in the leg. Interrogation revealed that 17 year old is VC, and had been left with the older woman when wounded. The older woman had been instructed to care for her, and admitted in supplying VC with food. WIA/POW was sent to 1st Marines C.P. under armed guard, and the other woman was detained.

30 Nov Company E went OPCON to 3rdBn, 26thMar as of 301800H.

30 Nov At BT 025608, Company H found approximately 1000 pounds of rice buried in concrete vats underground. Also found were small amounts of black tea, approximately 3 pounds, and several empty medical containers. The items were found in 3 bunkers which were destroyed; rice evacuated to 1/1 C.P.

30 Nov An ambush from Company H spotted 3-4 VC at BT 026605, and took them under fire with small arms and grenades. The VC returned fire with the same weapons. Fire fight resulted in 2 USMC WIA and 1 VC/WIA POW. Interrogation revealed that WIA/POW is NVA PFC communicator, and was traveling with 2 VC when ambushed. His unit, 1st Company, 2nd Battalion, unknown Regiment, has been operating in this area since August, and came to this location with 30 NVA/VC 9 days ago to gather food. POW died during night of 30 November.

30 Nov Company G spotted 3-5 VC entering the tree line at BT 021598, and took them under fire results unknown.

8. LOGISTICS

a. Supply/Resupply

(1) From 1 November to 20 November, supplies were drawn from FLC, Da Nang, and trucked from the BLT Rear to the companies on a daily basis. Prior to the commencement of Operation MEADE RIVER, the Rifle Companies moved back to the Rear. A resupply of all classes of supply was made available to them. During the operation a Logistic Support Area, located at Hill 55 was utilized. Supply requirements were passed from the BLT S-4A, at the forward Command Post, to the BLT representative at the LSA. Delivery was then effected directly to the company by either helicopter or truck. For units operating in particularly marshy areas, Otters were available, and utilized.

b. Food/Water

(1) Units in the field were resupplied by truck convoy from the BLT Rear. "C" Rations were used exclusively. Natural sources were available to augment water supply. Subsequent to 20 November, the LSA at Hill 55 provided resupply of food and water. Again, helicopters, trucks and Otters were used for delivery. On Thanksgiving Day a hot

turkey meal was prepared at the 1stBn, 1stMar, messhall, and sent to the field. BLT 2/26 supplied cooks to assist in the preparation of this meal.

(2) During this entire period personnel at BLT Rear utilized the mess facilities provided by FLC. Hot meals were served throughout.

c. Maintenance

(1) During the reporting period the BLT had the facilities of FLC available. Normal maintenance was accomplished.

d. Camp Facilities Development

(1) Sandbag bunkers were built to accomodate BLT Rear personnel.

9. NEW TECHNIQUES

a. During the reporting period there were no new combat techniques or trends developed by the BLT.

10. TRAINING

a. During the reporting period the emphasis was placed on On the Job Training due to the tactical deployment of the BLT.

11. CIVIC ACTION/PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE

a. Prior to the period 1-16 November, the BLT moved to the populated area south of Da Nang. For the first time since early 1968 the Battalion worked in heavily populated areas. The emphasis was based on professional conduct at all levels. The BLT would neither fraternize, nor maltreat, civilians. The program has been highly successful. Several MEDCAPS were held under the control of the BLT Surgeons, particularly in the Leprosarium area south of Da Nang. There was one (1) major, serious incident. On 17 November, Company F, 2/26, killed two (2) civilians and wounded seven (7) when several rounds of 60mm overshot three (3) fleeing VC, and fell among a group of women and children. The incident occurred in the vicinity of Tam An Hamlet, Hoa Hai Village. A total of 15,000\$ VN was paid in solatium.

12. COMMUNICATIONS

a. Radio

(1) During the reporting period constant radio communications were maintained between the BLT and higher Headquarters, Rifle Companies and Supporting Arms. The Tactical Air Control Party continued using UHF and VHF radio equipment in support of the BLT.

(2) A covered radio circuit, employing a KY-8 and KY-38, was used

for ciphered traffic to higher Headquarters.

b. Radio Relay

(1) The two (2) AN/TRC-27 terminals were not employed due to the deadline of one (1) RT-252. However, during Operation MEADE RIVER, two (2) AN/PCC-1 terminals, belonging to 1stMar, were established between the BLT CP and the 1stMar CP providing four (4) clear voice channels of communications with two (2) common users, and two (2) hot lines. This was the first occasion the Radio Relay attachment has had to use and employ the AN/PCC-1.

c. Wire

(1) During the reporting period a switching central with trunk lines and dial phones to FLC and units within the BLT were established and maintained. Wire lines within the BLT Rear CP were established for perimeter defense.

(2) During the cordon phase of Operation MEADE RIVER the platoon Wire Section established and maintained a complete wire system between the Forward CP, the two (2) Provisional Companies, and the Rifle Companies.

d. Maintenance/Supply

(1) Forward and Rear maintenance facilities were established for repair and maintenance of communications equipment within the BLT.

(2) Communication supply and maintenance policies and procedures were updated within the BLT.

e. Significant Events

(1) All communications underwent an extensive rehab, and received a limited technical inspection by the BLT Logistic Support Unit and Maintenance Battalion, FLC.

13. MEDICAL/DENTAL SUPPORT

a. Medical

(1) BAS administration was handled by the section at BLT Rear. All Sick Call was handled by BLT Medical Officers, and four (4) to six (6) Corpsmen utilizing the BAS facilities of FLC.

(2) During the reporting period there were two (2) Medical Officers with the BLT. They were rotated so one (1) was with FLC, while the other was with BLT CP Forward. The Corpsmen were assigned as follows:

1. Name of Operation and/or Types of Operation. Operation GARRARD BAY, an Amphibious Operation in the southeast sector of the 2d Bn, 1st Marines A.O.

2. Inclusive Dates and Location of the Operation. The operation was conducted in the 2d Bn, 1st Marines and ROKMC areas of operation during the period 25 October to 16 November, 1968.

3. Location. Quang Nam Province.

4. Command Headquarters. The Command Headquarters for BLT 2/26 was located at 2d Bn, 1st Marines CP (BT 073655).

5. Reporting Officer: BLT 2/26 LtCol SPARKS.

6. Task Organization. Selected elements of BLT 2/26 were employed during Operation GARRARD BAY. The Operational Task Organization was as follows:

At 290730H, BLT 2/26 was helilifted to cordon Tra [REDACTED] (BT 086682) and Tra Khe II (BT 073680). Twenty-five (25) civilians were detained for further interrogation, 7 of whom were on the Black List. 7 SFD's were found; 3 were accidentally exploded resulting in 2 USMC WIA from H Company, 1 USMC WIA and 1 USMC KIA from G Company, all of which were medevaced.

On 30 October, G Company suffered 1 USMC WIA due to an SFD.

At approximately 310800H, BLT 2/26 was helilifted to the vicinity of Nui Kim Son (BT 073707) to conduct Cordon and Search of that village which resulted in the screening of 516 VN civilians, 5 of whom were detained for further CIT interrogation.

On 1 November, E Company found 1 SFD at BT 070674 and 5 detainees were turned over to CIT.

On 2 November, 250 civilians were screened and 4 people were found to be on the Black List. They were then turned over to CIT. Two detainees were picked up at 022010H for attempting to travel at night.

On 3 November, 193 people were screened with negative results.

At approximately 040730H, F Company and G Company were helilifted into cordon positions around the Leprosarium at BT 096666; H Company and E Company were helilifted into positions to cordon Viem Dong at BT 095657. Also on 4 November, 261 VN civilians were screened, 6 of whom were found to be on the Black List.

On 5 November, G Company detained 2 civilians for interrogation by CIT and 2 SFD's were destroyed.

At approximately 060130H, a frag grenade was thrown at a tank resulting in a fatal injury to one USMC sleeping on the tank. Also on 6 November, F Company screened 396 civilians from the Leprosarium detaining 10 personnel for further interrogation at 1st Marines CP. At 062145H, E Company received a total of 10 grenades thrown at 2 positions resulting in 2 USMC WIA (medevaced) and 1 USMC WIA (minor); E Company returned fire with small arms with unknown results.

On 7 November, a continued search of the Leprosarium revealed nothing significant. E Company found 3 SFD's in the vicinity of BT 094651.

On 8 November, E Company found 3 SFD's in the vicinity of BT 091645, one of which was accidentally tripped resulting in 1 USMC WIA (medevaced). At 082145H, E Company received 8 suspected 60mm rounds at BT 089652 resulting in 2 USMC WIA (medevaced). Huey Gunship mission was called on suspected enemy mortar position. At 082115H, a rifle exploded due to sand in the bore resulting in 1 USMC WIA (medevaced).

On 9 November, E Company found 1 SFD which was blown in place at BT 096659.
