

PART II NARRACIVE SUMMARY

As Operations: Daring September 1968, the 3d Bettalion, 26th Marines cerried out the primary mission of providing security for the main supply route, Matienal Rests #1 from Mai Ven Pass, at the southern boundary of Thua Thien Province, north to Phu les Village. This mission was accomplished through the use of platoon strong points and aggressive small unit mannevers. The presence of Kilo Company, 3d Rn., 5th Marines in an OpCon status enabled the bettalion to keep a mobile force operating in the mountainous terrain south and north of the highest. This unit a use of Killer Ambush Teams and imaginative use of supporting arms enabled the battalion to approach a seemingly defensive mission with an effensive attitude.

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On O2 September, Line Company began a company operation in the mountain peaks west of Hai Van Pass. This operation was designed to clear out the enemy forces which had been harrassing the road north of the pass. Line operated for O7 days and made limited contest. One small contest led to the capture of a document which listed the Cable of organization and equipment for a NVA platoon operating in this area. Like was near the highest posk-hill 1192-when Typhoon Best of runks

On 04 September, Typhoon Becs streek the mainland with little prior warning. This storm greatly hampered testical operations and wrested haves with the physical facilities of the bestalion. The storm persisted through 05 September and caused the cancellations of conveys and the closing of Hai Van Pass due to mid slides. Concentrated, coordinated efforts by all concerned enabled the bestalion to return to full operational efficiency within 36 hours following the peak of the storm. Engineer effort cleared the pass, logistical support replanished the physical plant, and testical operations were resumed immediately. In addition, the refuses settlement near lang Co Village was declared a disaster area. Food and building materials were provided for the residents.

On 14 September, India Company began a company operation in the "buris" area north of Claymore Pass near Phn 180. The company was moved by helicopter and operated for seven days. Heavy contact was appradic and light. The purpose of this operation was to deny the area to the enemy and interdict the flow of rice through that which intelligence reports is a major rice route.

On 15 September, M Company cordened Thus Lum Hamlet and the national police held a census. The battalion commander addressed the people and explained the battalion's policy for the area.

On 17 September, Kilo Company began a one plateon operation near hill 945, west of Hai Van Pass. This operation lasted three days and was designed to keep pressure on enemy forces in the area. Enemy contact was light.

On 18 September, a truck convey was ambushed at ZD 107017. 3/26 units capable of supporting by fire were brought under merter fire. Demage to the convoy was light.

On 19 September, a plateon from Lima Company moved to the beach vicinity AU 824064 to provide accurity for a Navy barge grounded during the typhoca. During the next two days the Navy conducted an unassociated salvage operation on the barge.

On 22 September, & Megina Phantom jet crashed near the northern coast vicinity AU 8004. Elements of I Company, L Company, Mike Company, and Kilo Company, 3d Bn, 5th Marines, provided security for the investigation team, recovered the bedies and conducted a sweep of the surrounding areas. The area was heavily booby-trapped but the mission was accomplished.

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On 25 Septembor, a Killer Team from Line Company subsched a superior NVA force moving leveral Roll Eget bridge experiently with attack intentions. The Killer Team analysis several casualties, but succeeded in theorting any further energy intentions.

On 24 Septembers 3 pledon from Mass Company condense the village of Phu Gis vicinity AU 8207 and conducted a casean of the village. This estion was a reaction to soveral mining incidence near the village. The only find

was a large ansunt of race.

On 29 September, Kills Company began a company operation along the ridge line south of leng Co village. This spans ion extended into October.

B. Administration. During the period 1-18 September, administration was handled at the battalion rear at Quang Tri Combat Base. On 18 September the S-1 and company offices displaced to Phu Gia Pass and joined the remainder of the battalion. As a result of this move, coordination between the S-1 and other staff sections improved considerably as did company administration.

The S-1 and Division G-7 had to centend with a distance factor but daily courier runs alleviated this problem. The clarks and other administrative personnel quickly adapted themselves to the directive and orders changes involved in the switch from 3d Marine Division to 1st Marine Division.


C. Etelligence.

1. The enemy situation in the 1/26 AO centers around the 4th NVA Regt and the Goile Level Force Company. A Sapper/Engineer Company in the critical Hai Van Pass area rounds out the enemy ferces. The 4th NVA Regt is beed-quertered in the vicinity of 20 1092. The Regiment is composed of the KAB Bestalion (70 1496) and the KAC Bestalion (70 0896). Local ARW Intelligence sources coincide with these reports of enemy locations. The KAB Bestalion has recently been reported to be the most active with limited size operations into the rice lowlands. An NVA Plateon size element has been reported in the 20 1899 area. The K5 Bestalion, disbanded after the fut Offensive, is reportedly reorganizing in the mountainous area 20 1695. The Colle Local Force Company is centered around 20 1505 with elements in the vicinity of AU 2005. The Sapper/Engineer Company is operating in the Hai Van Pass with a CP in the vicinity of AF 8991.

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- The mission of the 4th MVA Regiment seems to be of a passive nature; on a whole it has avoided content and prepares for a future offensive. But main objective seems to be training and stocking rice and supplies. The cap company foray reported by local intelligence seemed to be aimed at influencing local farmers and gathering a great deal of rice. For these reasons the 4th Regt is largely dependent on the local VC guarrillas for supplies; rice and intelligence on friendly forces. The local forces are undoubtedly experiencing a critical time in view of the rice harvest and friendly operations. Extensive ambushing along known rice routes has accounted for a large portion of the menths 18 VC KIA. Most of the enemy initiated contents in the last month occurred between 1500 and 2200.
- 4. At 100440H, September 1968, Co K/3/5 vic 2D 15402D observed 30 VC moving north, An ambush resulted in 7 VC KIA, 1 SKS, and 1000 pounds of rice. The recovered SKS was in very good condition and still had heavy grease protective coating. All major parts carried the original serial number and the sling was in excellent condition. At 111470H, September 1968, 2 Vietnamese riding a meterbike on Route 1 over the Hai Van Pass attempted to steal hand granades and G-Rations from USMC personnel. The two were apprehended and turned over to the National Police at District Headquarters. At 261045H, September 1968, a local village youth stated that 3 VC entered his village on 23 September. Two were wounded, one of whom subsequently died, while the other two left at daybreak. One headed east on Route 1 and the other went into the hills.
- 5. Weather: The mean temperature was 85 degrees while a high of 102 degrees and a low of 71 degrees was experienced. Tropical storm Bess caused extensive damage and affected the negring rice harvest.
- 6. Terrain: The 3/26 AC is composed of rice paddies with the exception of the south and southeastern highlands. The vegetation consists mostly of short grass, shrubs and treelines; whereas, in the western and southern portion double canopy is experienced.

7. Avenues of Approach: In the wastern portion of the AO, Route t forms the main avenue of approach. Other svenues of approach are formed by lowlands via AU 6005 stratching to Thus Lux Hanles and then into the mountains via 20 2097.

D. Civil Mfairs.

Throughout the menth the Best alion conducted extensive civil affairs and maintained close limits with Phu Ice District Headquarters and ARVS units. A barb wire fence was constructed around the handst of Thus Ism ZD 2001. A MedCap was conducted on 14 September in the wake of tropical storm Bess. On 20 September an extent ARVE fine mission destroyed part of an orphanage vic ZD 157002. The Battalion S-5 was dispatched and has coordinated with the US Army in Phu Bei for 20 bags of cement to be sent to the local CAP unit for repair of the explanage.

E. Perchological Verdage

Most of the PayOps efforts were simed at the return of emminities and explosives. Several 81mm morter rds, M-79 and 40mm rds were returned as a result of this effort. Company Commandars were given 4,000 Plasters for the immediate use in the reserved fund program. Company Commanders were given the list of recommanded rewards for lost explosives. Chiev Hoi balls and pens were distributed to the youngsters in the villages and hamlets throughout the AO.

F. Fire Support - The battalien used supporting arms offensively during the menth. Extensive nightime and daytime Hall fires were plotted daily. In addition, during September, 17 proparation fixes were fixed in support of ground operations; morter suppression missions were coordinated with the movement of convoys through the AD, and MGP was used to support and supplement all supporting arms roles. The battalion maintained fire plans and provided fire support for CAP units in the AD, and engineering teams outling LZ's.

The bestalion subsisted on "A" and "C" rations for the march of September. All retions were in good quantity.

2. Massage Center. On 9 September the bastalion lost teletype capabilities for the rest of September. A messenger service was established

with Regiment to pick up and deliver message treff it.

3. Redio Relev/Virg. On 9 September the AM/MEL-620 which provided radio relay apport was replaced by a portable radio relay, Tolegraph-Terminal AN/PCC-10 Although communication was re-established the quality and dependability was reduced.

I. Madical-Dental

1. Personnel. The Battelien Aid Station has a total of 50 mm; 48

Hospital Corponen, one Madisal Officer, and one Chaplain.

2. Canabilities. The aid station was canable of treating all minor medical and surgical problems. Patients requiring more extensive care were evacuated to 1st Hospital Company, NSA Da Hang, and the USS Repose. Facilities consist of a bunker, four tents for supply, administration, ward and quarters, which are adequate. The BAS is responsible for evenuating seriously injured or ill patients from the operation site.

3. Training. Hospital Corponen receive classroom training and on the job training under the supervision of the Estalion Surgeon. The Chief Hospital Corpusen teaches field medical techniques and diagnessic procedures.

4. Dental. Dental facilities are now available and provided by the its Dantal Company. A dental corps efficer and one dental corpsman are on board.

5. Malaria Prophylaria. Chloroquine-Primaquine tableta were taken once a week, preferably with Sunday meal. In addition, Departe tablets were taken daily.

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6. Saniferies. Seniferica repends were upon weakly to the Bettelien Commandano
