PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The month of July, for the Battalion, was split between Operation ALLEN BROOK (23 June to 16 July) and the Battalion's combat base with its associated maintenance and area improvement and saturation patrolling requirements. Many of the most successful stages of ALLEN BROOK were during this month. The return to the combat base and transition back to normal activities was extremely smooth and combat patrolling began as the last units were returning to the base. Throughout the duration of the operation those personnel that remained at the combat base continued the maintenance and area improvement effort. Upon the return of the Battalion, improvement of the Ha Dong Bridge area and other outposts commenced immediately. The training schedule was somewhat limited because of the operation, but was as extensive as possible in spite of refitting and re-equiping necessary in some cases.

The MED CAP program was continued at the combat base during the operation but the mobile MED CAP was suspended for lack of personnel. 1572 patients were treated at the combat base. Psychological operations were continued during the MED CAPS with the distribution of Chieu Hoi material and government oriented literature. A new program of self-help was started with the distribution of garden tools, sewing kits and carpenter tools to individual elders who needed them and could put them to productive use.

Major improvements continued in the combat base. On 15 July the two 36 KW generators were replaced by a 100 KW generator from the Naval Support Activity in DaNang. The base road network was heavily oiled and re-oiled to make it more permanent and provide increased all weather trafficability. The dump was relocated to an area where it could be kept under better observation. It is now burned off and filled periodically and is not only safer from booby traps and mines but also more sanitary. All of the Battalion and Company ammunition bunkers were inventoried, rebuilteand checked for safety. Lightning rods were also installed in each one.

Extensive preparations were also made for the expected return of the Battalion to CONUS. All ordnance, engineer, communication and motor transport equipment received LTI's. All possible equipment was packed and banded together with all mount out boxes checked for correct marking. Every subordinate element and staff section commenced work on up to date turnover files and recommendations for awards were initiated.

Operation DUCKBLIND, planned earlier, commenced on 20 July with the first installation of seismic intrusion devices. They were all installed by 27 July and the monitoring equipment set up in the combat base observation tower. Direct radio communications were maintained with the Regimental FSCC. The devices are implanted in 5 locations within the Battalion TAOR and detect movement through the area.



The primary effort of the entire Battalion was directed towards Operation ALLEN EROOK for the first half of the month. (For details of all spects of the operation see Supporting Documents - Combat After Action Report) The effectiveness of a tactical innovation of significant consequence was highlighted by the killing of 13 VC by Killer Teams in a single day, (1 July). A team consisted of an artillery forward observer, scout/snipers and fire team size security, and was sent to an area of likely enemy movement and left there for an entire day. It is felt the success of this technique far exceeded the kills made by keeping the enemy off balance and detecting his movement before he was able to position his forces for an attack.

Operation ALLEN BROOK itself was the first time that 2/27 executed a battalion sized operation. Valuable lessons were learned; but 2/27 was found to be combat ready and highly effective in Battalion combat operations.





Fig. 7	Total Carrier Carrier Carrier Carrier	***************************************	The second of the mention of the entertain of the second of the second resource representation of the second of th	Action


a. Artillery and Naval Gun Fire

- (1) Throughout the duration of the operation direct artillery support was provided for the 2nd Battalion, 27th Marines by E Btry, 2nd Battalion, 13th Marines. All fire support coordination was cenetered in an FSCC, run by the Artillery Maison Team from B Battery, 2nd Battalion, 13th Marines. Approximately 75 missions were fired on request at enemy sightings and contacts and approximately 400 MaI tragets. Throughout the operation all suspected enemy staging areas and areas of large-sightings were fired upon with TOT's. A total of approximately 45 such missions were fired by E Btry and supporting batteries from the 4th Battalion, 11th Marines. In almost all cases artiller, call for fire requests were completed rapidly with good coverage on target. Response time was minimal as the Battalion FS.C had the authority to grant final clearance on most fire requests. Missions on the perifery of the area of the operation were delayed somewhat due to the time required to gain clearance from adjacent units. The juve dominate solved by pre-clearing grid squares adjacent to operations to be conducted during a 24 hour period. It is significant that not one friendly casualty resulted from the extensive employment of written even though many danger close missions were fired.
- (2) General support was provided by the 4th B tvalion, 11th Marines. They fired a sufficient number of H&I fires each night to allow E Battery, 2nd Battalion, 15th Marines the capability of firing all fire missions requested. Approximately 100 H&I targets were fired by this unit. They also massed fires with E Battery when TOT's were used on enemy locations.
- (3) Six (6) Naval Gunfire missions were fired with good effect on target, by the USS PROVIDENCE.

b. Lir

- (1) During Operation ALEM BROCK careful attention was focused on making maximum use of the psychological impact and destructive firepower possible with the array of accurate close air-delivered ordnance available. Air strikes were used on confirmed enemy sightings, defensive positions, assembly areas and movement routes. This air support was instrumental in inflicting nu erous enemy casualties and completely disrupting his operations. Missions were executed and controlled with a high degree of accuracy and timeliness. Nedex: cs were completed rapidly and in emergency cases under hazzardous conditions. At no time did weather hinder air support.
- (2) During daylight hours helicopter support was abundant, flying both resupply missions and medical evacuations. Relicopter support at night was limited to energency medevace, which were executed rapidly. Approximately 437,000 pounds of supplies were desivered and 105 4TA sevacuated.






- (3) A total of 60 flights of fixed wing were employed, primarily controlled by aerial observers. Ordnance delivered included approximately 230,000 pounds of bombs, 72,500 pounds of napalm, 12 CEU's and rocket pods and 19 MK 4 gun pods.
- (4) Aerial observers were operating over the AD during most of the dayight hours. They proved extremely valuable, controlling most of the airstrikes and approximately 30% of artillery missions. Reconnaissance missions were flown in front of advancing troops and armored/tracked vehicle columns. In this respect their support was vital to the successful execution of the vehicle movements. The detection of enemy troops by aerial surveillance was instrumental in bringing accurate small arms fire and supporting arms fire to bear on the enemy. No second sightings of enemy troops maneuvering or constructing prepared positions allowed fixed wing flights to destroy and decimate the enemy and their fortified positions and prevent major buildups.
- (5) Air support of all types throughout the operation was both timely and effective. On 29 July a recon team spotted approximately 100 VC in the open in the ALLEN EROCK AO. As approximately eith 12 fligts of fixed wing63 VC were killed. The total number of confirmed enemy killed by air was 66.

c. Armor

- (1) A heavy section of tanks from Company B 5th Tank Bertelion was in direct support of 2/27 for the duration of the operation. Tanks from both the 1st and the 3rd Platoons were employed.
- (2) The enemy never massed his forces in sufficient strength long shough to offer lucrative targets for the tanks destructive firepower. However the tanks were utilized to good advantage on numerous other missions. These uses included:
 - (a) Providing authoritative firepower at critical points on the Battalion's perimeter security.
 - (b) Escorting engineer vehicles on the hazardous trip to and from Liberty Brito. The fire power of the tanks provided an added degree of security for the otherwise vulnerable LVTE's, TD 18's and otters. The trips were necessary as Liberty Briton to the evacuation point for inoperative and damaged vehicles and the pickup point for repaired vehicles.





- (a) In one instance a tank infantry assault was launched by Company F. A deep envelopement was made against a fortified hamfet to drive the enemy into a friendly blocking firce. The momentum of the a tack was broken when the lead tank hit a Line destroying the track and shearing two road wheels and arms. Later in the evening the blocking force came under heavy enemy attack resulting in two confirmed enemy KTA's.

 (b) On another occassion a light section of tanks and a platoon of Company Enemy base. The enemy had made frequent forrays from this area to harrass clearing efforts. The Laneuver was successful until a tank threw a track while negotiating a berm wall.
- (4) The direct fire capability of the tanks was emploited in conjunction with killer teams consisting of artillery forward observers and scout sniper teams to interdict enemy movement across the river bordering the AO. There, areas could not be physically occupied but the pinpoint accuracy of the 90mm guns was used to destroy enemy forces and bunkers. One assemblian bunker was destroyed in this manner.
- (5) Enemy mining activities made the use of tanks hazardous; but the firepower and mobility of the tanks added vital and effective muscle to the success of the operation.


8. <u>Intelligence</u>

a. Enemy Situation. Upon arrival on Go Noi Island it was anticipated that 2/27 would be confronted with an estimated regimental sized unit or remnants of same; at the time of the arrival it was believed to have been the 30% NVA Regiment, supported by elements of the R-20 Battalion and the V-25 Battalian. No actual identification was made of the units encountered. Contacts that were made, primarily were small. The encountered attempted to maintain his posturerby emplacing numerous boobytraps and mines throughout the area of operation.

b. Omand mistics of the area of Operation

(1) Torgain. Throughout the Go Noi Island there is a heavy vegetation, that in all cases impaired movement and ground observation. Elegated that thick understuch was prevelent in the area and was excellent for concealment, boobytraps and mines. Avenues of approch were limited to existing trails in most instances, allowing excellent use of boobytraps by the enemy. Units were confronted with a succession of tree-lines which concealed snipers and small harassing elements.





(3) Sociology. Nost of the inhabitants encountered were children older woman and a few old men. They were not hostile as such, but were not friendly. They claimed no knowledge of the enemy in the area. A search of awellings usually revealed arminition, etc. It is felt that due to the long domination of the area by the enemy and his propagandar efforts, the people were sympathetic to the enemy's cause.

c. Enemy Military Situation

- (1) Composition. The composition of the enemy was not determined due to his withdrawl to the perifery of the operational area. (See encl. 8)
- d. Enemy capabilities at the end of this period. The enemy still has the capabilities of mining and booby trapping the operational area and harrassing by sniper fire.
- (1) It is felt that even while the enery is able to continue his harrassing, boobytrapping and mining, he has merely covered his retreat to the mountains where he could resupply and gain back his strength in numbers. It is further felt that as soon as our forces have left the area of Go Noi Island, he will return. He will try to use the destruction of the area of Go Noi as a propaganda move in order to gain support from the people.

9. Mission

a. Assigned

- (1) Continue offensive operations to find, fix and destroy enemy forces in the ALLEN BROOK AO.
- (2) Conduct a detailed search to locate enemy caches, weapons, supplies and equipment, evaluate the findings for intelligence and destroy them.
- (3) Provide support and protection for engineering effort to systematically eliminate all fortifications, dwellings, harbor sites and possible defensive sites such as hedge rows in AO from western to eastern limit.

b. Deduced

(1) Destroy by Naval Gun Fire, artillery, air, or by any other means available all enemy assembly areas too distant to be accomplished by friendly forces.







Intelligence Analysis

It was noted that large sums of money were on the person of VC KIA's. One such KIA contained \$50.00 MpC. This is a significant departure from past experience. It would seem the VC were being highly paid for their services indicating there must be an increasing difficulty in obtaining approximate to the VC cause.

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(2) Interact by fire and troop employment all enemy infiltration through, on or near the ALLEN EROCK AO, or deny enemy some by different methods.

10. Concept of Operation

- a. On 22 June 1968, the 2nd Battalion, 27th Harines, with four rifle companies supported by the first Provisional Engineering Team, the 3rd Platoon, Company B, 5th Tanks and E Battery, 2nd Bn, 13th Wfines assumed Operational responsibility for executing the mission stated in paragraph 9.
- b. Two rifle companies were deployed in close support of the engineering effort in the western sector of the AO.
- (1) One company conducted offensive operations including tank infantry attacks to clear and screen enemy activity in the area of the engineering operation.
- (2) One company provided close in security, with one platoon clearing the engineering destruction area in advance of the engineering equipment which was escorted by a platoon providing vehicle security.
- (3) A base of operation was selected in the middle of fortified areas which allowed clearing in four directions, minimizing travel time to reach areas requiring destruction.
 - (4) The concept of destruction included:
- (a) Elimination of all natural assembly areas, concealing foliage, treelines, bemboo groves, and hedge rows.
- (b) The thorough and systematic destruction of all trenchlines, fighting holes, caves, bunkers, tunnel complexes and building structures, and natural or man made features providing cover.
- (c) The destruction by crushing or burning all bunker material such as concrete blocks, beams, posts, pillars and tree trunks, this depriving the energy of their future use.
- (d) The action in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) were closely supervised to ensure complete denial of resources available to the enemy.
- c. Two companies were deployed in the eastern sector of the AO to screen the eastern flank, deny the enemy assembly areas and freedom of movement and to clear the area of enemy forces for future engineering operations.
- (1) The companies operated alternately from combined and separate Company Bases.



- (2) All activities were closely coordinated, with both companies providing blocking forces, sweeping forces, mutually supporting ambushes and patrols. The killer team concept consisting of sniper teams, fire team size security, Kit Carson scouts and artillery forward observers was devised to locate and bring immediate destructive fire to bear on the enemy.
- (3) Company bases were relocated frequently to cover now areas and keep the enemy off balance.
- d. Engineering elements were given an area to clear and a time table within which to complete the clearing. Flexibility was necessary depending on the situation and vehicle availability. Usually, time tables tended to be overly optimistic, primarily as a result of the inavailability of vehicles. A concentrated effort was made to meet the time schedules. Supporting units providing security also burned bunker material simultaneously with the engineering effort.
- (1) LVTM's were used to clear densely forested areas, heavily mined areas, and to carry fuels for burning.


e. Fire Support

- (1) Hall's were used extensively in conjunction with TOT's throughout the AO to disrupt the enemy's movement, assembly and staging areas.
- (2) Air strikes were used heavily on confirmed enemy targets and suspected or likely assembly areas.
- f. Air delivered herbicide operations were conducted on two occasions and found to be quite effective.

11. Execution

a. In accordance with operation order 6-68, Companies E and H displaced by helicopter to Go Noi Island on 22 June 1968. They relieved two companies of the First Battalion, 27th L rines in place (vic BTOC7540) and came under OPCON of the First Battalion. An advance party of the command group also deployed and conducted liaison with the First Battalion in order to maintain the momentum of the operation on the island. On 23 June the relief was completed with Companies F and G and the Battalion Command Group being helilifted into the operation area. At 1530H on 23 June the second Battalion assumed operational control of Operation ALAM BROOK, with the Battalion CP located vic coord AT979535. From here normal night time security and defensive measures were established.






- (2) About 2245 on 23 June the F Company CF (vic AT979535) received 9 rounds of 60nm morturs from the vic of AT973536. At artillery counter mortur mission was fired by E Brty, 2/13 with good coverage on target. There was no evidence of enemy casualties. Harine losses were 8 minor VIA's.
- b. On 24 June 1968, Companies E and E conducted recon patrols and displaced to vic DT007532 where they established a joint combat base and conducted normal night time security and combat/ambush patrolling. The Command Group and Companies F and G along with the First Engineer Clearing Team, displaced to vic AT974528 to conduct clearing operations. While at this site the concept and techniques of total destruction of all enemy installations and favorable terrain was perfected. A detailed outline of these techniques is contained in subparagraph 10b (4), concept of operation.
- c. On 25 June Companies F and G along with the engineers conducted a sweep from the CP to vic AT970540. One platoon of F Co conducted a long range combat patrol from the CP to vic AT995530 and back. Companies B and H conducted extensive day and night combat/ambush patrolling.
- (1) About 1330 on 25 June a squad combat patrol from Company E vic of BT000528 spotted two VC. The patrol fired small arms and the VC ran into a hamlet. Upon checking out the hamlet a wounded child approximately 1 year old was found. The child later died. A serious incident report was submitted.
- (2) About 2045 on 25 June 1968, a 3 man listening post from G Co moved out towards their assigned positions. Hand illumination was popped from the Company perimeter and the last two members hit the deck. The 3rd Marine went into position. When the remaining two Marines moved up to join he fired on them. Marine losses were 2 WIA's (evaluated)
- d. On 26 Jane Companies E and F (-) conducted extensive day and night combat/ambush patrolling. One platoon from Company F conducted a recon patrol to vic AP984535. Company G (-) provided local security for the return of 3 tanks to Liberty Bridge. Company H conducted a company combat sweep throughout the AO.
- (1) Approximately 1530 on 26 J me, a platoon from Echo Company was deployed in the vic of BT004535. They spotted movement in the tree-line totheir front approximately 100 meters. A figure ran away and Echo opened fire. Upon searching the tree-line they found 3 wounded civilians. They were evacuated on the evening resupply chopper.



- (2) Approximately 1830 on 26 June a killer team from Company F vic AT978534 spotted 2 VC walking along a treeline. The team opened fire and called 60mm and 81mm mortar fire. It weep of the treeline revealed one wounded VC. He was returned to the CP but died before he could be evacuated.
 - e. On 27 June Companies E, F, and G, the engineers and the command group displaced to vic AT993532 and commenced the destruction of the largest forrested area on the island. 18 days were required to completely level the aread Company H conducted a combat sweep to vic ET006540 and established a combat base.
 - (1) Approximately 0800 on 27 June 1968, E Company, on a combat sweep in the vic AT994531 found 30 Chinese Communist anti-personnel mines and 10 Chi-Com claymore mines. All were destroyed.
 - f. 0. 28 June Company E provided local security for the clearing effort by the engineers. Company F conducted a combat sweep to vic AT99754 and established a combat base. Company G conducted extensive day and night patrolling included a platoon combat patrol to vic BT005534. Company H conducted a search and destroy operation vic AT 94531.
 - g. On 29 June Company E provided security for the Engineer Clearing Team Operation. Coverny F conducted a combat sweep to seize the ville vic BT007541 and establish a combat base. Company G conducted a combat sweep to seize the ville vic BT047541 and establish a combat base. Company H provided security for the Battalion CP and conducted extensive day and night patrolling.
 - (1) Approximately 0715 on 29 June, 1 mule moving with Company G hit a mine. The operator was instantly killed and 5 other Marines were evacuated. The mule was destroyed but was recovered and returned to Regimental CP
 - (2) Approximately 0910 on 29 June 1968 the Engineer Clearing Team uncovered a bunker. It contains a large amount of documents in a water-proof bag, sketches of defensive positions, unit organizations and ID cards. All were returned to the S-2.
 - h: On 30 June Company E conducted a combat sweep to vic AT975530 and back to the CP. Company F swept to vic BT018536 from where a blocking forcewas set in from ET019533 to BT020530 to BT017528. Company G then swept to this blocking force. Companies F and G then linked up and swept to vic BT007533 where a combat base was established. Company H provided security for the engineering clearing efforts.
 - (1) On June 30 Company E conducted a combat sweep to vic AT975530 and back to the CF. Company F swept to vic BT040536 from where a blocking force was set in from BT019535 to BT020530 to BT017528. Company G then swept to this blocking force. Companies F and G then linked up and swept to vic BT007533 where a combat base was established. Company G is gravided security for the engineering clearing efforts.



- i. On 1 July Company E conducted a tank infantry patrol to vic AT993532. Companies F and G conducted extensive day and night time combat/ambush patrolling. Company H provided security for the engineers and the Bn CP.
- (1) Approximately 0645 on 1 July a killer team from Company E victa AT989526 spotted 4 VC heading east. The sniper team killed two and an artillery mission killed two more VC. About 45 minutes later 4 nore VC were spotted moving south with two killed by snipers and two killed by artillery.
- (2) Approximately 0800 on 1 July 1968, a patrol from E Company vic AT997529 found a cache of enemy ammunition. It included 25 white star clusters, 1 green star cluster, 81mm illumination rounds, 3 60mm WP rounds, 6 US made Claymore mines, 11 bandoleers of M-79 HE rounds, 290 rounds M-60 machine gun ammunition, one case of green smoke, 1 bandoleer of M-16 ammunitic 7 M-16 magazines and 1 hand illumination grenade. All items were returned to the Battalion CP.
- (3) Approximately 1100 on 1 July a killer team from Company H vic AT995525 spotted 5 VG moving along the tracks from east to west. The sniper team pinned down the VC and an artillery mission was fired. There were 4 VC KIA. About 1 hour later 3 more VC ere sited approaching the bodies. The sniper team killed one.
- (4) Approximately 1710 on 1 July a killer team from Company H vic AT987533 was set up as a security force outside the Company CP. One HVA was spotted observing the CP and taken under fire. Taken completely by surprise, he fled leaving an M-16 rifle. The weapon as returned to the Battalion S-2.
- j. On 2 July Company E conducted extensive day and night combat/ambush patrolling and perimeter security for the Bo Cr. Company G conditate a blocking position from BT010530 to BT010527. Company F conducted a combat sweep to the blocking position, linked up with G Company and established a combat base vic BT010530. Company H provided security for the Engineering clearing operations and the Battalion CP.
- k. On 3 July Company E conducted a road sweep to Liberty Bridge where they picked up two LVTE's and returned to the Bottalion CP. Company F provided security for the engineer operations and Battalion CP. Company G swept to vic BT008542 and established a combat base. Company H conducted extensive combat/ambush day time and night time patrols.
- 1. On July Company E conducted a sweep to vic BT006546 and established a combat base. Company G also swept along a different route to vic BT006546 and established a joint combat base. Companies F and H conducted extensive combat/ambush patrolling and security for the engineers and the Bn CP.



- (1) Approximately 1230 on 5 July a killer team from Company H spotted 5 VC receive across an open field vic AT985514. An atillery mission was called resulting in 5 VC killed,
- n. Un 6 J.A. Co. any E poyen into blocking position on the south and east of the hamlet vic BT024554. Company G moved into and seized this hamlet. From here G and E Companies swept to vic BT014537 and established a combat base. Companies F and H provided security for the engineer clearing effort and Battalion CP and conducted day and night combat/ambush patrolling.
- (1) A proximately 1000 on 6 July 1968, G Company flushed 3-4 VC during a contact developed on a company sweep. The proximal physically and by fire with the VC heading directly into the blocking position established by E Company. Upon receiving fire from E Company the VC turned and attempted to flee across the river. After a brief pursuit by fire a squad of E Company immediately crossed the river and recovered 1 M-1 rifle, 1 SKS mixlo, and assorted uniforms and equipment from the 3 bodies. All gear was returned to the Bn CP.
- o. On 7 July Company E compt to vie BT005549 and established a combat base. Company F moved the Bn CP to Liberty Buidge to escort five tractors back to the Bn CP. G Company moved into the Battalian CP to take over Company F positions during their absence and conducted night time combat/ambush patrols. Company E provided security for the Englanders Charles Operation.
- (1) Approximately 1020 on 7 July Company F was moving to the Liberty Bridge on security for an amored column. In route they discovered four 40 to 50 pound box mines. Later a 250 to 300 pound mine exploded under a tank. The tank immediately caught fire. Nembers of Company F attempted to bring the fire under control but were driven back by exploding small arms and 90mm ammunition. Quick action by several marines prevented several casualties as they pulled stunned men away from the burning tank. Live Markage case expect ted
- p. On 8 July Company H moved into a blocking position vic BT009530 to BT012530. Get any Entropy into this blocking force. E and H Companies linked up and established a combat base vic BT007555. Company F conducted extensive day and night combat/ambush patrolling. Company G provided security for the Endagens and En CP.
- (1) Approximately 1835 on 8 July, a killer team from Company G vic AT982537 spotted 7 NVA 300 mattrices, according north. 60mm and 81mm mortar fires were called. The team swept the area finding 1 NVA KIA and 1 .AK-47 rifle.
- q. 0. 9 July Company E established a blocking force vic BT019534 to BT017534 for a sweep by Conjuny H. 12

tompanies E and H established a new combat base vic BT019530 and conducted extensive recon patrolling. Company F conducted extensive daytime patrolling and Company G provided security for the engineers and Bn CP.

- r. On 10 July Company E displaced to vic BT009541 and established a combat base. From this base they conducted extensive combat/recon patrolling. Company F established blocking position from AT977547 to AT998545 in accordance with 27th Marines Frag Order 1-68. Company G provided security for the Engineering efforts and the Bn CP. Company H deployed to vic BT011548, established a combat base and conducted extensive patrolling.
- s. On 11 July Company E displaced to vic BT010534 and established a combat base from which extensive patrolling was conducted. Company F provided security for the Engineer Clearing operation and the Bn CP. Company G established two platoon blocking positions vic AT975543 and AT984538 and Company H established two platoon blocking positions vic BT002545 and AT992540. These blocking positions were in support of a sweep by the 26th Harines north of the ALLEM BROOK AC.
- (1) Approximately 1715 on 11 July, a platoon combat patrol from F Company spotted 15 VC vic BT998519 carrying a mortar tube and satchel charge. They were moving east to west along the river. E Btry, 2/13 fired for F Company with good coverage on target. Seven bodies were observed for 35 minutes. Enemy losses were 7 KIA's.
- (2) Approximately 2230 on 11 July the second platoon of G Company was set up in a defensive perimeter vic AT974549. Without prior warning an estimated reinforced enemy platoon took them under intense small arms fire and automatic weapons fire from their north, west and south, in some instances from a distance of only 50 meters. The second platoon, Company G returned small arms fire and received incoming grenades and machine gun fire. Preplanned artillery and 81mm mortar targets were called for approximately 30 minutes. The energy appeared to withdraw to the southwest: A TOT was fired vic AT965544 to interdict this movement. There were no USMC losses and no evidence of enemy losses.
- t. On 12 July Company E moved to vic AT993531 and established a combat base. Company F conducted security for Engineers and Bn CP. Company G established one platoon blocking position and Company H established two platoon blocking position vic AT999544 and BT005552 in support of the sweep by 26th Harines.
- u. On 15 July Company E and H displaced to vic BT018533 and established a joint combat base. One squad of H Company moved to vic BT025532 as a security position and then returned to the combat base. Company F provided security for Engineer and En CP. Company G escorted the tanks to Liberty Bridge to recover the hulk of a tank. All elforts to retrieve it with other tanks were unsuccessful due to tow cables snaping and vehicles becoming bogged down in the sand. They returned to the Bn CP.

- (1) Approximately 0600 on 13 July a killer team from Company F vic AT997522 observed 3 VC on a raft in the river. The sniper team took the raft under fire, killin all three. About 15 minutes later 2 more VC were observed across the river and killed by sniper fire.
 - (2) Approximately 1000 on 13 July 1968, while providing security for an armored column returning to Liberty Bridge, G Company tripped a booby trap resulting in 7 Marine, WIA's (evacuated)
 - (3) Approximately 1630 on 13 July the E Grapany CF vic 020535 received six enemy 60mm mortar rounds. Returned fire and checked area with no evidence of enemy casualties. Marine losses were 6 WIA's two of whom were evacuated.
 - v. On 14 July Company E and H displaced to vic BT011531 and established a combat base in preparation for the displacement to their position of the En CP. Company F provided security for the Engineers and the Battalion CP. Company G was helolifted to hiberty Bridge where they linked up with a tank retriever and a platoon of tanks. From here they retrieved the tank hull though with some difficulty due to deep sand and parted cables. They returned to the En CP.
 - (1) Approximately 0830 on 14 July 1968, the H Company CP vic 021535 received 10 rounds of 82mm mortar fire. They fired counter-mortar fire and swept area of previous fighting. One 82mm mortar fuse container with Russian markings was found. Marine losses were 3 WIA (evacuated).
 - (2) Approximately 1545 on 14 July a squad from the 1st Flatoon of Company G while conducting a combat sweep through an area of reported heavy enemy activity routed 5 VC who attempted to withdraw through a treeline vic AT957535. Four VC were killed and one wounded by intense fire. The wounded VC died before he could be evacuated. There were no Marine losses. Captured weapons included 2 M-16 rifles, 1 AK-47 rifle and 1 SKS carbine.
 - w. On 15 July Company E provided security outposts along the route to the new Bn CP vic BT011531. Company E provided security at the new CP site till arrival of new CP group. Company G established a secure crossing point on the tracks vic BT003531. Company F provided march security. All units establish new combat base/CP.
 - (1) Approximately 0925 on 15 July Company H was establishing a new combat base vic BT025533. The CP received 10 rounds of 82mm mortar fire. One squad had been set out in an outpost as security for the CP. Upon hearing the firing of the mortars they swiftly assualted the mortar position killing one VC and wounding 1 NVA. One AK-47 rifle and one AK-44 rifle were captured along with numerous items of equipment and charts containing mortar data. There was one minor USMC WIA. The NVA died before he could be evacuated.
 - (2) A proximately 1125 on 15 July vic of AT993528 a platoon of F Company on a combat sweep discovered a cache of weapons including 1 sub-machine jun, three sniper rifles (1 with scope), medical supplies, poncho with liner, and assorted clothing.

(3) Approximately 1600 on 15 July, & Company on a combat sweep vic BT010582 found a tunnel complex with 11 box mines, 17 60mm mortar rounds, 13 82mm mortar rounds, 4 BAR magazines with rounds, 6 clips N-1 ammunition, one 1903 5 ringfield rifle, 800 rounds AK_47 ammunition, training manuals and some documents.

x. On 16 July all units were helolifted to the Bn rear area as the 3rd Bn, 27th Marines effected a relief in place. OPCON Operation ALLEN BROOK passed to the 3rd Bn at 1200 and all units were in the rear by 1600.





13. Administration

a. Resupply

- (1) All resupply was carried out from an LSA located at LZA10 at the Regimental CP. The LDA was manned by a 20-24 man crew. This crew consisted of approximately 12 Helicopter Support Team (MST) members from Shore Party Battalion, and 10-12 men from the 2nd Battalion, 27th Marines.
- (2) The mission of this organization was to provide all classes of supplies on short notice and in easily usable forms.
- (3) Five storage areas were maintained: Class I, rations and water; Class II, types I and II; Class III, POL products; Class IV, barbed wire and sandbags; and Class Y ammunition. Requirements for supplies were assembled by HST personnel operating with the companies in the field and returned to HST teams at the HSA. Fork sheets were made up in duplicate and all items staged for the next rune. The location of the LSA was particularly advantageous since supplies could be gottem from 2/27, 1/27 at Headquarters Company, 27th Marines. In addition procurement runs to DrNapg were effected to acquire some items.
- (4) All items stocked at the LSA were force fed from FLC and were delivered daily. Items in a not in supply status were usually acquired on a one day notice.
- (5) Approximately 17,000 to 21,000 pounds per day were lifted into the 40 for an approximate total of 437,000 pounds of resupply items.
- (6) Resupply included about 700 to 800 gallons of water daily for a total of approximately 20,000 gallons. Thenever possible this was supplied in disposable 5 gallon milk containers.
- (7) of packets were lifted in every other day, ice cream 16 times, sandwiches 13 times, and fruit and juice two out of every three days.
 - b. Maintainance. T ere were no major maintainance problems encountered.





- (1) All treatment was carried out very capably by the Battalion Surgeon and his Corysman in the field.
- (a) all evacuations were effected expeditiously. Resupply helicopters were also used for medical evacuations and frequently reduced the
 time seriously-injured personnel had to wait for evacuation.
- (3) The only major medical problemswas an unnecessary amount of gastroenteritis caused by drinking local water that was untreated or improperly treated.
- (4) The wore uncounted hordes of mosquitos and they were a constant pest. However no cases of malaria were contracted due to rigid enforcement of weekly malaria pill intake by all personnel.
- (5) In spite of high temperatures and humidity there were very few heat casualties. Several long marches were conducted to Liberty Bridge and about 40:00 pany sized sweeps conducted. In all cases salt tablets and water intake was well supervised, resulting in the reduction of heat casualties.
- d. Transportation. Males used during the operation were quite useful. Due to terrain encountered they were often slowed and had to be dug out but the difficulty in traversing the terrain was offset by their load carrying capability. A stock reserve of anno and water was carried by the mules.
- e. Communication. There were no communications problems other than interference by adjacentumits' nets which were quiet effective in solving the problem.
- 14. Standal Equipment. There was no use of special equipment during the Estandism's phase of Operation ALEXA. BROOK.

15. Commanders Analysis

a. The inc. Advance notification of the pending operation was more than adequate for planning purposes. A the operations a special mission or missions would have been benificial. Variable instructions of the Regimental Commander and liaison trips to the operating area and operational rear were effective in determining the mission and priority of tasks.

b. Scatte of a incering Operations

(1) Li ison trips to the ALEN ROCK operating area to study the engineering clearing operations being conducted indicated the use of selective (Partial) Bestructions, by the unit conducting the operation. This concept consisted of selecting those installations and vegetated areas offering the enemy the greatest benefits and destroying them.






- UNCL COFIED (2) Analysis of the "Selective Clearing" concept quickly revealed that even though the most advantageous installations and natural terrain features were being denied the enemy, many areas of almost equal tactical advantage were left untouched. In some cases it appeared that the process of selective destruction had the effect of clearing fields of fire for the remaining positions. Also it is believed many cookes of the cook ammunition, supplies and food were being passed over by partial clearing techniques.
 - (3) To eliminate the inherent disadvantages of "Selective Clearing" a concept of "Total Clearing" was executed. It is felt that this was the approach that would most effectively alter the terrain and eliminate Go Noi Island as a suitable base of operations for the enemy. This reasoning was borne out by subsequent experience as the enemy immediately reoccupied areas in which partial clearing had been conducted. But where total clearing had been accomplished the area was entirely unsuitable for enemy occupation. Also a preponderance of enemy weapons, caches and aparunition stocks were uncovered in final stages of clearing. The innovation of burning bunker material was added.
 - c. Counter Sniper/Harassing Fires. Enemy contacts were harassing in nature and established a pattern. The Battalion Command Post and base The Battalion Command Post and base of operations was fired upon with regularity, usually in the evening. Small squad sized units were employed in concealed positions about 500 meters out from the perimeter. When the enemy moved into fire on the Battalion position the concealed (Killer) teams would attack from the rear while the perimeter held fire. This Killer Team technique inflicted numerous casualties on the enemy and almost completely eliminated harassing attacks on the Battalion Base of Operations.
 - d. Scout Ocserver/Arty FO/sniper Teams. Small teams consisting of an Arty FO and/or Scout observer, a sniper team and a fire team for security were use extensively to bring long range small arms and artillery fire to bear on enemy units moving out of range of infantry units. These teams were especially effective in engaging enemy units outside the AO or across natural barriers. These teams accounted for 23 kills.
 - e. Mutually Supporting Ambushes/Fatrols. Patrols and ambushes were planned so as to be mutually supporting. When a patrol came into contact with the enemy fixed his position; adjacent patrols could be maneuvered to attack the enemy from the flank or rear or cut off his withdrawl routers.

f. Employment of Supporting Arms

(1) In spite of extensive training relating to the proper employment of the full spectrum of supporting arms, additional improvement in their emloyment was necessary. There was a tendency to over rely on 60mm mortars and 81mm mortars, artillery often being used as an after thought.





(2) Counter mortar fires were planned in detail utilizing 60mm mortars, 81mm mortars, and artillery. Counter mortar fires were preplotted prior to occupying a new position. This effort was very effective in reducing the frequency and effectiveness of energy mortaring activities.

g. Civil flairs/Psychological War activities

- (1) A concentrated effort to relocate the few villagers left in the area may have proved somewhat effective. However, the 2nd Bn, 27th Har had neither the personnel nor the means to conduct extensive CA/Psy Jar activities. Host of the inhabitants evacuated the area in face of the clearing operation being conducted.
- (2) If a civil affairs effort were made it should have been an effort involving primarily a Battalion (-) of IRVN's gathering the villagers together and evacuating them from the operation area. As it was the, were forced out by the engineering clearing operation. Little could be done to help them.

b. Motel Aerial Observers

- (1) It is felt that the extensive use of aerial observers and observation teams to discover the enery's movement into and in the area of operation and their subsequent distruction by all the supporting arms available enabled the 2nd Battalion, 27th Marines to execute its primary destruction mission with little or no interference from the enemy. The routing by artillery of a 150 man enemy force and the destruction of 66 of the enemy by air is a good example of the effectiveness of this technique. (See page 76 for details)
- 16. Recommendations. The relocation of the local population from the Go Noi Island area was handled in direct contrast to our civic affairs/ps; chological warfare ideals. In most cases the first notice the people mad to move out of the area was the approach of the clearing team and security elements. Efforts to notif; the people in advance were not generally successful due to their suspicious natures. The use of an ARVN unit to assist in the evacuation of the people would solve the problem in most cases. They could move out to the area of operation and warn the people to evacuate their homes. In addition, on the day of actual clearing the; could be of great assistance in explaining the necessity for the move. If used in conjunction with Ca/Fsyder team and Revolutionary Development teams the ARVN could get the people out with less lon-lasting anti-c.S.





AREA CLEARED OF FORTIFICATIONS AND NATURAL COVER

In this area all bunkers, trenchlines, fighting holes and any other type of fortifications have been destroyed. In addition all bunker building or cameuflaged material has been destroyed. All natural terrain features that could provide the enemy with building supplies, cover or concealment have been destroyed.

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
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


