B. SUMMARY OF EVENTS

:

- 1. This month was highlighted by three main events. The first event came in the second week of the month when the Midshipmen stormed ashore to taste the life (and chow) of a Marine grunt. They received crash courses in the siting and organization of a defensive position and in night patrols. It was a challenge to both the Marine instructors and the Midshipmen students.
