

NARRATIVEPART II

The Task Force Delta air units operating from RTAFB, Nam Phong, Thailand, continued combat operations throughout Southeast Asia in the first six months of 1973.

On 28 January, the cease fire in Vietnam went into effect and with the cessation, Marine air support in North and South Vietnam came to an end.

With the cease fire in Vietnam, Task Force Delta air units turned their full efforts to combat operations in Laos. On 22 February, the Laotian cease fire brought an end to Task Force Delta's active combat role in Southeast Asia. The following day a full schedule of training sorties commenced. Emphasis in training was placed on the air to air intercept/ACM role of the F-4s and low level navigation for the A-6s.

The training environment was short lived, for on 25 February, the Seventh Air Force once again put Task Force Delta air units back into combat. The frag called for 12 F-4 combat sorties in support of the Khmer Republic. It resulted in being a one day "shot" for the F-4 Squadrons, but painted a picture of things to come.

Task Force Delta air units once again returned to the vigorous training schedule that had been initiated earlier so as to remain the force in readiness.

With the growing conflict in the Khmer Republic, the F-4 Squadrons were recommitted to an air to ground combat role on 30 March, and have been flying 12 to 20 combat sorties a day. The A-6s were returned to combat in the Khmer Republic on 12 May, and have been flying 5 night combat sorties daily. The F-4s have been utilized for direct air support, whereas, the A-6s have been used against night moving targets and for RADFAC beacon drops.

H&MS-36 Detachment Delta continued helicopter operations in support of Task Force Delta with extraordinary efficiency and professionalism. The diverse assignments include; (1) Primary mission of Search and Rescue (SAR) for the tactical aircraft based at Nam Phong, (2) Secondary mission of Administrative/Logistic flights, and (3) Medevacs. The Detachment has provided Escape and Evasion Training for all aircrews of MAG-15. The professionalism of the Detachment's aircrews has been displayed several times during May in the rescue of 3 pilots from downed T-28s from the 56th SOWg at RTAFB, Udorn. Thailand. The CH-46Ds have flown 1,162 sorties during this period for a total of 881.2 hours, transporting 4,395 passengers and 116,264 pounds of cargo. There have been 36 actual SAR launches resulting in 3 aircrewmembers rescued. A total of 11 medevac missions have been flown for 15 patients.

VMGR-152 continued their outstanding effort in aerial refueling support of the tactical aircraft of Task Force Delta. The Detachment has flown 708 combat support refueling sorties for 2,360 hours, delivering 12,320,080 pounds of JP-4 to 1,920 receiver aircraft. Administrative/Logistic flights accounted for a total of 200 sorties and 550 flight hours. The Detachment aircrews and maintenance personnel's professional "can do" attitude truly speaks for itself in that no tactical aircraft combat sorties have been lost due to tanker availability.

On 16 June, Task Force Delta air units completed the first year of combat operations from the "Rose Garden". At this time, Task Force Delta units are the only Marine Corps units currently committed to combat operations. The following operational statistics have been achieved since deployment to the "Rose Garden", Nam Phong, Thailand from 17 June, 1972 to 30 June, 1973.

PART III

1 January 1973 No combat sorties were scheduled due to the New Year's cease fire.

6 January 1973 VMFA-115 BLADE TWO DASH TWO received battle damage from AAA on a mission in Steel Tiger area of Laos.

8 January 1973 VMFA-232 MOTION ONE flight (2 F-4 s) mission number 8904, made a LORAN drop with an Air Force F-4 LORAN pathfinder aircraft, call sign JUNIOR. Two (2) Navy A-7 aircraft, call sign CHAMP, also joined with the LORAN aircraft. The ordnance mistakenly hit the Danang Air Base. Twenty-four (24) MK-82 bombs were dropped by MOTION flight. An investigation was conducted by 7th Air Force.

11 January 1973 A USO Show, The Sophisticates, was presented to a receptive audience.

13 January 1973 As a continuing part of the Civic Action/ People to People Program, Task Force Delta and MAG-15, in conjunction with the RTAFB Commander, conducted an Open House in celebration of "Children's Day", a Thai holiday, for approximately three thousand (3,000) Thai school children from the local villages. Static displays included KC-130, A-6, F-4, CH-46 aircraft and Crash Crew equipment. The children's response was enthusiastic, as was that of the teachers and village elders who escorted them. Cold drinks and cookies were served.

14 January 1973 VMA(AW)-533 night sorties were diverted to the Steel Tiger area of Laos as a result of the suspension of all bombing of North Vietnam

28 January 1973 At 0659G the South Vietnamese cease fire went into effect.

29 January 1973

The cessation of Marine Air support in South Vietnam resulted in a greatly reduced combat sortie rate being tasked to MAG-15. Training sorties commenced with aerial refueling for the A-6 s and night/instrument flights for the F-4 s being the first order of business.

The relocation of H&MS-15 Det "A" from Danang Air Base, South Vietnam to the RTAFB Nam Phong was accomplished this date. The move, involving one (1) officer and twenty two (22) enlisted men with all equipment and gear, was completed 1520G.

1 February 1973

VMA(AW)-533 commenced night all-weather full system sorties in Barrel Roll area of Laos.

The Enlisted Club commenced operations.

The Interagency Team (IAT) from the Department of Labor and Veterans Administration completed a scheduled 3 day visit.

2 February 1973

The Officer and SNCO Clubs opened at Nam Phong.

5 February 1973

Two (2) F-4 s from VMFA-232, MOTION FIVE Flight jettisoned twenty two (22) MK-82 bombs outside the Udorn jettison range resulting in the death of one (1) Thai. 7/13th Air Force conducted the investigation. Aircraft was under Udorn Approach Radar control at time of drop.

13 February 1973

The Civic Action Program provided 50 surplus 55 gallon drums to the Nam Phong District Office for the construction of a floating bridge over the Nam Phong River thereby linking several isolated villages to the main road.

17 February 1973

A Thai Liberty Bus with 40 Marines aboard was involved in a collision with a Thai

fuel tank truck on Highway 2 to Udorn, 6 miles North of Nam Phong RTAFB. As a result of one (1) Marine was killed and eighteen (18) Marines were injured.

22 February 1973

A Cease Fire in Laos went into effect at 1200G.

The Cease Fire in Laos resulted in no combat sorties scheduled for MAG-15. Training flights commenced this date with the F-4s flying air intercept, ACM and instrument training; the A-6s flying instrument and low level navigation training.

25 February 1973

7th Air Force scheduled MAG-15 for twelve (12) combat sorties in Khmer Republic.

26 February 1973

No combat sorties scheduled this date, training schedule resumed with emphasis on air intercept, ACM, instrument and low level navigation flights.

28 February 1973

BGen R. W. TAYLOR, CG Task Force Delta, and Col A. W. TALBERT, CO MAG-15, attended a luncheon at Khon Kaen hosted by Governor BURI.

14 March 1973

An additional 61 empty 55 gallon drums were given to the Nam Phong District Office for the completion of the floating bridge over the Nam Phong River.

Two (2) Code X gasoline engines were given to the Nam Phong District Technical School for the training of student mechanics.

28 March 1973

23th TAGS, 56th SOW briefed MAG-15 Operations Officer and Flight leaders on rules of engagement in Cambodia.

3 April 1973

Nam Phong high temperature was 104 degrees.

4 April 1973

The Civic Action Program delivered one (1) large stack of scrap lumber to the Nam Phong District Officer

7 April 1973 One year ago today elements of MAG-15 deployed to Danang Air Base RVN to commence combat operations. These units were the first Marine units to be reintroduced into the conflict. Today MAG-15 remains the only Marine combat unit conducting daily combat operations in Southeast Asia.

17 April 1973 Refurbishment was completed in MAG-15 Officer cantonment area and the MATCU-62 living area this date. All sea huts were covered with tin to provide adequate protection during the forth coming monsoon season. The tinning of the Communications section will commence this date and work will begin in the LSG area 20 April.

23 April 1973 MAG-15 has delivered over 20,000 tons of ordnance since the commencement of combat operations at RTAFB Nam Phong, Thailand.

2 May 1973 H&MS-36 Det D provided actual SAR pickup of two (2) T-28 pilots from the 56th SOW, Udorn RTAFB, whose aircraft experienced an engine failure requiring bailout. Aircraft crashed 007 degrees 8.5 miles from RTAFB Nam Phong. Aircrew uninjured and taken to RTAFB, Udorn.

12 May 1973 VMA(AW)-533 commenced combat operations in support of the Khmer Republic.

23 May 1973 BGen R. W. TAYLOR, CG Task Force Delta, visited COMUSSAG/7th AF CHFLTCOORDGRP, NKP. Met with Gen VOGT, RAdm OBERG, and BGen BELLAMY.

28 May 1973 A CH-46D from H&MS-36 Det D rescued one (1) pilot of a downed T-28 from the 56th SOW, RTAFB Udorn.

2 June 1973 This command notified of possible short round incident involving MOTION ONE flight. Details forwarded via MAG-15 msg 020732Z June 1973.

25 June 1973 MABS-15 Motor Transport has logged over 909,500 miles since deployment to RTAFB Nam Phong in June 1972.

27 June 1973 Task Force Medical Department rendered medical services to over 25,000 out patients since deployment to RTAFB Nam Phong in June 1973.

Narrative Summary

Logistic Support Group Delta continued to provide supplies and services to Task Force Delta. Details follow:

I. The LSG provided each Marine daily approximately three pounds of meat, fresh fruit and produce, and dry stores; two quarts of juice and dairy products, and 13 pounds of ice.

II,IV,VII,IX(W) - The fleet stock account's overall fill rate rose during this period from 15% to 26%. More importantly, the net fill rate rose from 30% for January to 60% for June. The net fill rate improved for five consecutive semi-monthly periods ending 30 June 1973. At the end of June the net fill rate stood at 66%; including partial issues it was 70%. Clothing sales totaled approximately \$3000.00 per month.

III. Average daily bulk fuel issues during this period were 82,894 gals of JP-4, 4982 gals of diesel, and 988 gals of mogas. For JP-4 the heaviest issue period was 1-15 May when the daily issue average 102,806 gals; low point was 1-15 Mar when 48,636 gals was the average daily issue.

V. During this period Class V issues included 23,610 MK82's, 2688 5" Zuni Rockets, and 2133 Rockeyes (CBU).

VI. The LSG had cognizance over the general operation of the PX. In June the LSG PX Officer, CW02 WILSON, received a letter of appreciation from the Thailand Regional Exchange headquarters. CW02 WILSON was cited for his outstanding support and for being instrumental in obtaining essential logistical support for the PX.
