INTELLIGENCE

1. General. The Intelligence Section, coordinated by the ACofS for Intelligence, provided overall intelligence support to the Commanding General and Staff. The Section assisted in the planning and operations of Operation Kent (10-15 Oct) and Operation Dover (19-30 Oct). Accomplishments of individual units and teams are as follows:

a. The Combat Intelligence Section collected intelligence from USMC, ARVN, and governmental sources, processed and disseminated this information by daily Intelligence Summaries. This section also prepared and presented the daily morning briefings and manned the COC Watch. Combat Intelligence personnel conducted liaison visits with TAM KY, TIEN PHUOC, and MINH LONG. Special briefings were prepared and presented for CG, FMFPao, retired General SHAW, the G-3 of III MAF, Colonel RUSSEL from Headquarters Marine Corps, and Army Major General ECKHART from 9th Infantry Division.

b. The Photo Imagery Interpretation Unit handled ten photo/red haze requests. They also produced enemy defense overlays for planning and conducting operations in the Task Force X-Ray area of responsibility. Only two photo missions requested were completed by III MAF during the month due to adverse weather conditions.

c. The Aerial Observer Unit flew 64 sorties for a total of 115.2 hours. The Air Observers assigned to the Artillery Unit flew 31 sorties for a total of 71.0 hours. In addition to normal visual reconnaissance missions, the following missions were performed:

e. The 7th Counterintelligence Team conducted close liaison with the National Police and Headquarters of Quang Tin and Quang Ngai Provinces and Tam Ky District. They conducted an inquiry into possible security violation of classified information concerning unit movement, and another concerning a Vietnamese worker employed at the Chu Lai USO supposedly interested in buying weapons and equipment from U. S. Forces.

SECRETPOPULAR FORCES COMBINED ACTION COMPANY PROGRAM

1. Within the Task Force X-Ray TAOR there are currently eleven Combined Action Platoons, seven in the Fifth Marines area, three in the Seventh Marines area and one in the CLDC area.
2. There are approximately 377 PF's, 94 Marines and 4 Navy in the program.
3. The program has improved slowly with the PF's showing increased discipline and self confidence.

TRAINING

Since its activation on 10 October 1966 TF X-RAY has coordinated the processing of schools quotas between Division Units in the Chu Lai TAOR and the 1st Marine Division C.P.

SECRETCOMMAND CHRONOLOGY
CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION1. Destruction at Go Roc Hamlet (BS 560603) Minh Dong Village, Minh Long District, Quang Ngai Province due to Pilot Error by MAG-12.

The first visit of the AC/S, G-5 found the people of Go Roc dazed and frightened but with an attitude of understanding. During the initial visits very few people were found in the hamlet, but after subsequent visits more of the villagers began to come out of hiding and within three visits the entire hamlet would meet the helicopters when they arrived. Reconstruction of the hamlet started slow primarily because of the lack of bamboo, but after the Civic Action Supplies began to be flown in, the local Vietnamese officials organized the Villagers and started rebuilding their homes. By 3 October all the villagers that had lost their homes as a result of the bombing had been furnished the necessary materials to build some kind of temporary shelter. On 7 October the last of the Civic Action Supplies were flown in and the local officials immediately began distributing the materials. Civic Action materials issued to Go Roc were as follows:

On 10 October a platoon from 1st Eng. Bn. commenced work on a 350' Foot Bridge spanning the river between Go Roc hamlet and the Village Market Place. This bridge also provided for the Villagers an easier access to the local R. F. outpost. The bridge was completed on 12 October. The last visit of the G-5 representative found the people of Go Roc Hamlet extremely appreciative of the assistance they had received and all the Civic Action materials were being put to their proper use.

2. Dickey CHAPELLE Memorial Dispensary.

Planning for the construction of the Dickey CHAPELLE Memorial Dispensary at the Chu Lai New Life Hamlet commenced on 3 October. Construction plans were discussed with officer of the 9th Eng. Bn., who would supervise the actual construction. It was anticipated at this time that the dispensary would be completed in 90 days. On 5 October representatives of the AC/S, G-5, the 9th Eng Bn, FLSG Bravo and Chief of Ly Tin District made a visit to Chu Lai New Life Hamlet for the purpose of selecting the site for the

dispensary. Title for the land on which the Memorial is being build was obtained from Father Doan Vinh PHUC, the parish priest at Chu Lai Hamlet, whose church controls the property. Although III MAF requested highest priority given to the construction of the dispensary, work could not begin until material assistance was obtained from RMK and MCB-3 and 9th Eng Bn. An agreement was made to repay these materials in-kind. Survey and clearing of the site started on 10 October. By 20 October the ground plumbing for the middle section was completed and the engineers were ready to begin pouring concrete. By the end of the month great progress had been made. Wall sidings have been installed, roof for center section is completed, and concrete for center deck poured. It is estimated that the center section of the Memorial is now 80% complete.

3. New District Chief.

During this month Captain BE relieved Captain GIOI as Ly Tin District Chief. The AC/S, G-5 and the Commander U. S. Army Civil Affairs Platoon attended the change of command ceremony. The new District Chief and his Advisor were guests of the Commanding General for lunch and were personally welcomed to the Chu Lai Area.

4. MEDCAP

A serious shortage of MEDCAP supplies almost brought the Medical Civic Action program to a halt. As a result the number of medical treatments for October was 7,000 below the number of treatments for September.

5. Dental Program.

The sharp increase this month in the number of dental treatments is the result of the program initiated by the Dental Officer of Headquarters Battalion and supported by the Dental Officers of the 5th and 7th Marine Regiments. The goal of this program is to give dental assistance to all the school children within the Chu Lai Area. Initial efforts have proved very successful and well excepted.

6. Civic Action Seminar.

A Civic Action Seminar was conducted in Chu Lai emphasizing the need for coordination of all efforts and the importance of the Civic Action role in the Vietnamese conflict. Approximately 50 Civil Affairs Officers and NCO's attended the conference, which resulted in a most successful meeting.

7. Ass't C/S G-5 ^{briefed} briefing CG FMFPAC concerning Pacification matters in the Chu Lai Area. After conference the CG was accompanied to the site of the Dickey CHAPELLE Memorial Dispensary.

PSY OPS COMMAND CHRONOLOGY

1. Leaflet Drops. During the month of October 1966 three million nine hundred fifty nine thousand leaflets and three hundred eighty five thousand safe conduct passes were dropped by Task Force X-Ray. A total of twenty one hours and fifteen minutes of aerial broadcasting was completed.
2. Chieu Hoi Ralliers. During October 1966 a total of one hundred thirty nine ralliers came into the provinces of Quang Tin and Quang Ngai. Ly Tin District accounted for twenty five ralliers and Binh Son District seventy seven.
3. Operations. Psychological support was given all operations conducted by Task Force X-Ray. Leaflet drops and broadcasts were requested by units conducting operations. Audio-visual teams were used to support a county fair operation by 2nd Bn 7th Marines and a search and destroy operation by 1st Bn 7th Marines.
4. Assistance to District VIS. The districts of Ly Tin and Binh Son continue to be assisted by Task Force X-Ray. Posters, magazines, newspapers, and paper for printing weekly news sheets have been distributed. Transistor radios provided by JUSPAO were given to each district VIS Chief for distribution in the district.
5. Psychological Operations Exploitation Team. Psychological Operations Exploitation Teams from the 244th Psy Ops Company have assisted Task Force X-Ray during October 1966. Teams were used to record messages and obtain necessary information for preparation of leaflets.
6. Cultural Drama Team. A cultural drama team was formed by JUSPAO in Quang Ngai. The team will be used in both Quang Tin and Quang Ngai Provinces. On 7 October 1966 Unit Psy Ops Officers were given a demonstration of the capabilities of the team and an explanation of its mission.
7. New Material. During the month of October new material was produced for Task Force X-Ray by the 244th Psy Ops Company and the Task Force X-Ray Psy Ops section. Task Force X-Ray produced one Chieu Hoi leaflet with picture and text, a tape appealing to families of the VC, two Chieu Hoi appeals from ralliers, and a tape to assist in evacuation of a hamlet.

COMMUNICATION-ELECTRONICS OFFICE CHRONOLOGY

1. Task Force XRAY/Chu Lai Installation Facilities.
 - a. Tropospheric-scatter Communications. Throughout this reporting period, construction continued on the site selected for the Chu Lai Terminal of the Southeast Asia Wideband Communication System (SEAWCS). Final grading of the terrain has been completed and construction commenced for installation of the base foundation.
 - b. Additional Tropospheric-scatter Equipment. On 17 October 1966, an additional tropospheric-scatter system was installed at Chu Lai. Installation and operation of an AN/TRC-129 will provide an additional 24 channels for telephone and teletype communication on the Southeast Asia Wideband Communications System (SEAWCS).
2. Communication-Electronics Support.
 - a. Relocation of 1st Marine Division Headquarters. On 10 October 1966, coordination of all communication facilities was effected to support the relocation of the 1st Marine Division Headquarters to Danang.
 - b. Support of VIP's Visiting Chu Lai.
 - (1) Visit of Chief of Naval Operations. On 29 October 1966, coordination of communications for all units was effected to ensure positive communications for the Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) during his visit to Chu Lai.
 - (2) Visit of CG, FMFPac. On 30 October 1966, coordination of communications for all units was effected to ensure positive communications for CG, FMFPac during his visit to Chu Lai.
3. Communication-Electronics Training and Inspections.
 - a. Communication-Electronics Training Inspection. During this reporting period, a Communication-Electronics Inspection Team, composed of operational and technical personnel conducted the first of a three phase quarterly inspection. Phase one consisted of inspecting the shop procedures and records, requisitioning procedures and records, maintenance and modification records and message center procedures. All 1st Marine Division and Task Force XRAY units in the Chu Lai and DaNang Combat Bases were inspected.
 - b. Communication-Electronics Training. Coordination was effected for all Task Force XRAY subordinate units in providing schooling on maintenance of the new Frequency Modulated (FM) family of equipment.

SECRETINFORMATIONAL SERVICES

1. The Informational Services Section of Task Force X-Ray produced 40 news releases and 1537 Fleet Home Town releases for the month of October, since the formation of Task Force X-Ray on 10 October 66.
2. Writer-photo teams covered Operations Dover and Golden Fleece 3/5; the visit of the Chief of Naval Operations and Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific and the usual round of promotion and award ceremonies, USO shows and civic action programs.
3. Initial contact was made by the ISO with GySgt Clevis C. Coffman and his Recon patrol who fought their way out of an ambush 9-10 Oct. The ISO provided the original story and covered the Purple Heart Medal awards for patrol members. The TFX ISO accompanied GySgt Coffman to Da Nang where interviews with civilian news media had been arranged. Sergeant Coffman was subsequently awarded the Navy Cross Medal by the President of the United States.
4. ISO provided assistance to the 2nd ROK Marine Brigade by rewriting stories for submission to CIB, III MAF.
5. Three newsmen visited Chu Lai during October. Two of them, Ray R. Coffey of the Chicago Daily News and Ralph Kennan of the Baltimore Sun were in the area to cover Navy stories. The third man, William E. Mahoney, of the Columbia (S.C.) Record came to do hometown stories on South Carolina men. Mr Mahoney departed after a one day visit 31 October.
6. Mr Ed Hymoff, visiting 1st Marine Division units to write the history of the division, completed his project 23 Oct 31 Oct.
7. Mr Gene Jones and his three-man motion picture camera crew, departed 28 Oct., after completing a film entitled "The Face of War." Since his arrival 10 Aug., Mr Jones photographed a squad from "M" Co., 3/7 for his film and has been augmented with Marine Corps photographs, transportation, tents, lighting systems, helicopter support, ect.

1. DURING THE PAST 14 DAYS THERE HAS BEEN A SIGNIFICANT INCREASE IN VC MOVEMENTS AND INCIDENTS IN THE VICINITY OF THE CHU LAI COMBAT BASE, WITHIN THE TAOR AND EVEN THE TAOR. EXAMPLES ARE:





