



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#### SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

- 1 Oct TG 45.5 Activated for planning. CTG 45.5 reported to COMPHIBRON-12 for planning.

  CO, HMM-162 (Rein) reported to CO, PROVMAG-60 for contingency planning.

  CO, BLT 3/8 reported to CTG 45.5 for planning and to CO, Eight Marine for contingencyplanning.

  Initial planning conference with COMPHI BRON-12 held at Naval Amphibious Base, Little Creek, resulting in a tentative schedule of events and proposed itinerary.
- 7 Oct Received COMPHIBRON-12 (CTG 44.5) Flanning Directive.
- 22 Oct CTG 45.5 Landing Plans for CARIB 5-65 submitted to COMPHIBRON-12.
- 1 Nov CTG 45.5 and key personnel &partedfor liaison visit to Caribbean.
- 5 Nov CTG 45.5 OPLAN 1-65 promulgated. The OPLAN was designed as a standard plan, applicable to a wide scope of contingency responses and exercises with only minor modification.
- 77Nov CTG 45.5 and party returned to CONUS.
- 15 Nov TG 45.5 activated for operations.
- 22 Nov Commenced loading initial elements of TG 45.5 at Norfolk.

  CARTB 5-65 pre-sail conference conducted at Little Creek to resolve final detailed planning.
- 24 Nov CO, HMM-162 and CO, BLT 3/8 attended pre-sail conference at Little Creek for PHIBASWEX/MEBLEX 2-65.
- 30 Nov Embarkation of TG 45.5 commenced at Morehead City, N. C., and Onslow Beach. 24 UH-34D's and two UH-1E's of HMM-162 flew a total of 102 hours, lifting 843 personnel and 83,200 pounds of cargo and equipment. Six CH-46A helicopters provided by MAG-26 augmented the squadron embarkation effort. BLT 3/8 chopped OPCON to the 4th MEB.
- 1 Dec The FMTMAGWEX 1-65/MEBLEM 2-65 Task Force with elements of TG 45.5 embarked departed CONUS.
- 4 Dec HMM-162 chopped OPCON to PROVMAG-80.
- 5 Dec HMM-162 transferred 18,200 pounds of equipment and 516 troops of a rifle company and Hedaquarters Company element of BLT 1/2 from U. S. S. Guadancanal to U. S. S. Francis Marion.

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- 7 Dec A rehearsal landing for MERIEX 2-65 was conducted at Orange Beach on the western end of Vieques.
- 8 Dec D-Day for MEBIEX 2-65, an assault landing conducted on Vieques by the Fourth MEB. BLT 3/8 was exercised as a completely helo borne assault force, and HMM-162 as a subordinate unit of PROVMAG-80 in a support role.
- 9 Dec BLT 3/8 and BLT 1/2 (The surface landed BLT) effected link up.
- MO Dec Following re-tasking of BLT forces, attack continued with BLT's abreast.
- MEBLEX 2-65 concluded with an abbreviated FIREX viewed by all hands of TG 45.5. Admin offload completed to Camp Garcia, Vieques, The squadron provided 234 hours of flight time for MEBLEX 2-65, transporting 1,051 troops and 324,915 pounds of cargo and equipment in support of the Landing Force. BLT 3/8 and HMM-162 chopped OPCON to CTG 45.5 who relieved CARIB 4-65 and the CARIB Ready Landing Force, assuming the designator 45.9. Upon completion of the debarkation and movement to Carip Garcia, TG 45.9 chopped OPCON to CG, 2dMAW, for a period of training ashore. Company L of BLT 3/8, which had participated in MEBLEX 2-65, embarked aboard USS Francis Marion for transit to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.
- Company L of BLT 3/8 chopped CCCN to CO, Marine Barracks, Guantanamo Bay, and assumed its duties as part of the Guantanamo Bay Defense Force. CTG 45.9 and CO, BLT 3/8, in company with CTG 44.9, called on COMCARIBSEAFRON and COMTEN at the Naval Station, San J.an, Puerto Rico.
- 17 Dec Liberty parties embarked aboard USS GUAM and USS SUFFOLK COUNTY for St Thomas and St. Croix to return to 20 December 1965,
- 20 Dec CLF 45.9 and CO, BLT 3/8 made official call on local Vieques officials.



- 30 Dec CO, BLT 3/8 conducted inspection of all major items of equipment. CLF and CO, BLT 3/8 attended conference with CTG 44.9 concerning changes to Guantanamo Bay visit schedule.
  - 3 Jan Preparation and Staging for reembarkation.
  - 4 Jan Landing Force reembarkation GG 44.9 shipping under simulated emergency recall conditions, and proceeded to San Juan. Squardon flew 81 hours, lifted 613 troops and 270,750 pounds of cargo and equipment.

- 21 Jan Commencement of "Gaucho" operations. Evacuation of U. S. and friendly foreign nationals from three widely separated areas. Commenced MCIFDC test of "M" Packet Rations by Companies I, K, and M. Each received one, two and three rations per day respectively. Each ration contains 1,200 calories. Test was conducted for seven day period with supplements prohibited.
- Overnight deterioration of exercise situation required reduced' visibility landings followed by successive helicopter landings, culminating in a coordinated BLT attack. Communications were effected over a 27,000 meter distance using AN/FRC 10 relay emplaced atop a mountain by helicopter. Landing force helicopters flew a total of 153 flight hours, lifting a total of 913 troops and 310,750 pounds of cargo and equipment.

- 14 Feb TG 45.9 reembarked to TG 44.9 shipping and chopped CTG 44.9. Visit by CO, Eight Marines. HMM-162 flow 80 hours, lifted 899 troops and 306,900 pounds of cargo in accomplishing the backload.
- 16 Feb Caribbean Ready Force placed on 24 hour reaction time for the Dominican Republic and directed to proceed at best speed to the vicinity of Santo Domingo. Scheduled Panama jungle training was cancelled.
